- 4) With a population of 1,252,964, Mauritius is the most populous island in the Mascarene Islands.
- 5) Saint Helena is an island in the South Atlantic Ocean on the Mid-Atlantic Ridge, discovered by the Portuguese. It is currently under the authority of Britain. It is a volcanic island, where Napoleon was imprisoned from 1815-1821 AD.
- 6) Nigeria is called the country of oil palm and Zaire is called the country of forests.
- 7) The country of Malawi is called Switzerland of the continent of Africa.
- 8) The **Tsetse fly** is found in the continent of Africa, which is very deadly.
