

Poverty in India and Bihar


Context

According to a report released by the NITI Aayog, 24.82 crore people in India have been lifted out of multidimensional poverty during the past nine years, with the largest decreases observed in Uttar Pradesh, Bihar, and Madhya Pradesh.



Objective


According to the Sustainable Development Goals, India's goal of reducing multidimensional poverty to half by **2030**.



Key Findings

- In the last 9 years, 24.82 crore Indians have been estimated to have escaped out of multidimensional poverty.
- A steep decline in Poverty Headcount Ratio from 29.17% in 2013-14 to 11.28% in 2022-23 is seen.
- All 12 indicators of MPI showed significant signs of improvement.

- Uttar Pradesh, Bihar, and Madhya Pradesh had the largest decline in multidimensional poverty between 2013-14 and 2022-23.
- India will achieve SDG 1.2 (reduce multidimensional poverty by at least half) well before 2030.



Recent Initiatives by the Government of India to Reduce Poverty

- · Poshan Abhiyan and Anaemia Mukt Bharat.
- The Targeted Public Distribution System under the National Food Security Act.
- Recent decisions like the continuation of Free Food Grain distribution under Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalyan Anna Yojana.
- PMKVY- Through this scheme, Lakhs of Youths are being Skilled and got jobs at different organizations.

Recent Initiatives of the Government of Bihar to Reduce Poverty

- 1. **Jeevika Mission**: This is a flagship programme, which promotes social and economic empowerment of the rural poor, particularly women.
- Bihar Skill Development Mission: This programme focuses on imparting job-oriented skills to youth through training programmes in various sectors like IT, construction, hospitality, etc.
- 3. Arakshit Rozgar Mahila ka Adhikar: This scheme supports women from socially disadvantaged groups through skill development training and livelihood programmes to improve their employment opportunities and economic independence.



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Poverty Estimation In India

- In India poverty estimation is done by NITI Aayog through the calculation of the poverty line, based on data captured by NSSO.
- Poverty line estimation in India is based on consumption expenditure.
- Important committees on Poverty Estimation:
- i. Alagh Committee (1979): It suggested that the Poverty line should be based on a minimum daily requirement of 2400 calories for adult persons in rural areas and 2100 calories in urban areas.
- ii. Tendulkar Committee (2009): It suggested a unified all-India urban poverty line basket (PLB) for both rural and urban India, as opposed to two different PLBs for each. In contrast to the Uniform Reference Period (URP) based estimates used in previous techniques for determining poverty, it proposed utilizing estimates based on the Mixed Reference Period (MRP).
- iii. Rangarajan Committee(2012): It went back to using different poverty line baskets for rural and urban areas of India and estimating rural and urban areas at the state level based on these. This committee increased the daily per capita expenditure from Rs 32 and Rs 26 at 2011–12 prices to Rs 47 for urban areas and Rs 32 for rural areas respectively.

Patna Metro

Context

The state cabinet has approved the transfer of 0.498 acres of land to the Urban Development and Housing Department for the construction of an underground metro station.

About

The Patna Metro Rail Corporation Ltd (PMRCL) is building the urban Mass Rapid Transit System (MRTS) with two lines and twenty-four stations in Patna.

Key Points

 The Patna Metro Rail Corporation (PMRC), a public company established in February 2019, is in

- charge of developing the project. The final detailed project report (DPR) for the first phase of the metro rail project was created by PMRC and Rail India Technical and Economic Service (RITES).
- The project was approved in February 2016 by the state government and in February 2019 by the Central government.
- The Patna metro rail project's general consultant is Delhi Metro Rail Corporation (DMRC).
- The European Union, the Asian Development Bank, and the Japanese government agency "JICA" had decided to provide a loan of up to eight thousand crore rupees for the building of Patna Metro in 2021.
- The **first U-Girder** was installed near the proposed **Bhoothnath station.**



Corridors of Patna Metro

- Corridor-1: Bailey Road serves as the East-West corridor-1 from Danapur in the west to Khemnichak in the East. Corridor 1, spanning 17.78 km between Danapur and Khemni Chak, has more than 7 km of elevated section and 10.17 km of underground section planned.
- Corridor-2: The North-South corridor-2 connects



Patna Junction with Rajendra Nagar Terminal, Ashok Rajpath, Gandhi Maidan, and Karmalichak in southeast Patna, where the new inter-state bus terminal (ISBT) would be built. Corridor-2 stretches over **14.5 km** and includes a 6.6 km elevated section and a 7.9 km long underground section.

U-Girder

• A precast and pre-tensioned structure on which rail tracks can be placed as per the timeline.

Bihar Startup Policy

Context

State Industry Minister Samir Kumar Mahaseth said that the government is working on a Mission to make Bihar a leader in the field of startups.

Key Points

- As per the Bihar Startup Policy, aspiring entrepreneurs can receive interest-free seed funding up to Rs 10 lakh for a period of ten years.
- Startups led by women receive 5% while the companies led by members of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes and people with disabilities receive 15% more seed funding.



- Individuals taking part in acceleration programmes are eligible for a grant of up to Rs 3 lakh.
- If investments are made by Registered entities and Angel investors, combining loans of up to Rs 50 lakh will be provided.

Kushal Yuva Programme

Context

The Labour Resources Department has decided to conduct door-to-door skill surveys. For this, the department will take the help of a private agency.

Kushal Yuva Programme

 The "Kushal Yuva Programme," a unique skilltraining initiative, was introduced by the Bihar Skill Development Mission (BSDM) to improve Soft Skills(Life skills, basic computer literacy, and communication skills in Hindi and English).

Key elements of the KYP include

- The Programme would enhance employability and would act as a value addition to the various domains, specifically training of youth aged 15 to 28, who have completed their 10th or 12th grade, dropped out of college, and are seeking employment.
- Four Block Skill Development Centers (BSDC)
 have been granted to AFC (Agricultural Finance
 Corporation) India Ltd for a period of five years
 (two in the district of Sitamarhi and one each in the
 districts of West Champaran and Muzaffarpur).
- Currently, approved centers cover 494 blocks out of 534 blocks across all the 38 districts of Bihar. Its target is to cover each and every block of Bihar.
- Three skills would be covered in the Kushal Yuva Programme course curriculum: basic computer literacy, life skills, and communication skills in Hindi and English. All three skills would be covered in 240 hours of instruction.
- Kushal Yuva Program (KYP) is a part of one of the "Saat Nischay" namely "Aarthik Hal, Yuvaon ko Bal".

Status of Electoral Roll in Bihar

Context

According to the state election body, Bihar has added 1.2 million voters to its electoral roll.

Key Points

- The age group of 19 to 29 years old was the primary source of the voter list increase, with all other age groups experiencing a decrease.
- This brings the total number of eligible voters to



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7,64,33,329, an increase of 12,09,347 over the list that was released the previous year.

- The age group of 70–79 years old has seen the largest decrease in voters, down 2,25,554 from the previous year.
- There are now 2,290 third-gender voters, 16 fewer than the previous year.
- The service voters' segment has slightly increased to 1,67,469, a gain of 472 from the strength of the previous year.
- There are 909 female voters for every 1000 male voters, a slight improvement over the 907 listed voters from the previous year.
- Out of all the voters, 4,00,29,136 are men (compared to 3,94,50,370 in 2023) and 3,64,01,903 are women (compared to 3,57,71,306 in 2023).
- There have been an addition of 6,30,597 female voters and 5,78,766 male voters.
- 16,85,844 people's names have been removed from the voter list for a variety of reasons, such as fraud and deaths.

Bihar Logistics Policy 2023

Context

The Government of Bihar has recently published the "Bihar Logistic Policy 2023".

Key Points

- The Policy aims towards promoting Private investment by upgrading and improving the existing warehouse and logistic infrastructure and enhancing the warehousing capacity.
- The Policy will come into force from the date of issue of the notification and will continue till the completion of Five years.

Features of the Policy

- 1. Multimodal Logistic Park
- 2. Logistic Park
- 3. Grade A WareHouse
- 4. Inland Container Depot
- 5. Cold storage Facility
- 6. Container Freight Station

Incentives

- Capital Investment Subsidy: 20% of Fixed Capital Investment, Maximum Rs.25 Crores.
- Interest Subvention: 10% or actual rate of interest on Term loan, Maximum Rs.60 Crores.
- All Incentives would be facilitated Under Bihar Industrial Investment Promotion Policy, 2016.

Mukhyamantri Vridhjan Pension Yojana (MVPY)

Context

Recently, more than **75,000** beneficiaries got the benefit of Mukhyamantri Vridhjan Pension Yojana.

Benefits of the scheme

- Any senior citizen who is 60 years of age or above are eligible for the scheme and they will get financial assistance of Rs 400 every month from the state government.
- If the person is 80 years of age or above they will receive a pension of Rs 500

Eligibility for the scheme

- A person should be a permanent resident of the state.
- The candidate needed to be at least sixty years old.
- The applicant cannot be a retired government employee.
- The applicant should belong to the Below Poverty Line (BPL) category.

NITISH LOCKET

Context

Recently, CM Nitish Kumar launched a pendant named "Nitish locket", an alert device during natural disasters like lightning, floods, heat wave, cold wave, etc.

Nitish Locket

- Novel Initiative Technological Intervention for Safety of Human Lives [NITISH] Locket is like a pendant-shaped device that will sound alert to its user through voice messages on lightning, floods, heat waves, and cold waves.
- The Locket is made by Bihar State Disaster
 Management Authority in collaboration with



IIT Patna. The device is synced with the **Bihar Meteorological Service Center**.

- It will issue an alert to its user 30 minutes before disaster occurs.
- The device will sound an alert in three ways; it will send a voice message; the color will change from green to red; and the device will keep warming till its user switches it off.
- The pendant will get charged from body heat.
- The device is waterproof and is designed keeping in mind the farmers.



Other initiative

Indra Vajra App: Alerts **45 minutes** before a thunderstorm to its user.

Bihar Laghu Udyami Yojana

Context

On 5th February 2024 CM Nitish Kumar launched "Bihar Laghu Udyami Yojana".

More About News

Bihar caste survey 2023, Report showed that about 94 lakh families (34.13%) out of 2.76 crore, earn less than Rs 6000 per month. To empower these socio-economic poor families, the Government launched this scheme.

Mission Theme:

• Har Ghar Udyami, Har Ghar Rozgar; Uchi Uddan ke Liye, Bihar hai Tayaar.

Objective:

• To provide economic assistance to economically poor families for self employment and to reduce unemployment rate.

Nodal Ministry:

. Department of Industries, Bihar

Duration of scheme:

- for 5 years
- Registration for scheme: online registration started from 5 february to 20 February 2024.

Eligibility criteria of Beneficiary:

- Age group:between 18-50 years.
- Income criteria: Family income less than Rs 6000 monthly.
- · Resident of Bihar.

Benefit of scheme:

- Beneficiary will get maximum 2 lakh per family (only one person from every family).
- · Amount will be received in three installments.
- 1st installment -25%; 2nd installment 50%; 3rd installment 25% of total money.

coverage

Total 61 small and medium project covered under this scheme.

Health Facility for Domestic Animals at Doorstep

Context

In February 2024 Govt. of Bihar approved Rs **355.17 crore** for availing health facilities for domesticated animals at the doorstep.

Key points

- The allocated fund will be spent under Bihar's "Saat Nischay-2" scheme and Centre's "National Livestock Health and Disease Control Programme".
- The allocated fund is approved for FY 2023-24 to FY 2025-26.
- The motive behind this program is to provide animal health care facilities at the doorstep in all districts of Bihar.
- 207 animal ambulatory vans and 8 animal lifting and caring vehicles would be bought.
- Arrangements for doorstep service will be made through a Call center and Mobile app.
- Animal hospitals will be established at every 8 to 10 villages.
- A solid system will be placed for door-todoor delivery of medical facilities like medical treatment, vaccination, artificial insemination, deworming, etc.



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- All types of medical facilities for animals will be free of cost.
- Through Telemedicine, all animal hospitals will be connected.
- Under the Animal Science University, an institute for the development and conservation of indigenous cattle will be established.

MAUSAM BIHAR APP

Context

Bihar's weather forecast model "MAUSAM BIHAR App" will be adopted in the entire country.

More about news

- Bihar is the first state in the country to develop a Mobile application for weather forecasting.
- In "Satellite Vision" of the Country, Bihar is the only state that uses these types of advanced technology in weather forecasting.
- Scientists of **NASA** and **ISRO** also visited Bihar to learn about this weather forecasting model.
- The Government of Bihar signed two MOUs with the **USA** and **Netherlands** on weather forecasting.



About App

- On 27 May 2023 CM Nitish Kumar launched this app in Patna.
- This App gives weather information like Temperature, Humidity, Wind speed, etc, **5** days prior.
- This app works 24X7 days.
- Weather data is collected from every Panchayat, in every 15 minutes. From one Panchayat 96 times data is being collected in a day. 80 thousand data collected from all panchayats every day.

- The App is beneficial in the agriculture sector like in sowing seeds, and harvesting crops and mitigating the impacts of natural disasters like floods, cold waves, drought, etc.
- Bihar is the **2nd state** after Karnataka that collects weather information at the Panchayat level.

Stunting problem in BIHAR

Context

According to the NFHS-5 report, **42.9%** of children in Bihar are suffering from growth failure or stunting problems.

More about news

- Malnutrition is the most common cause of growth failure in India. As per the NFHS-5 report 35.5% of children (0 to 5 years) in India are suffering from stunting.
- According to UNICEF, WHO, and the World Bank every 4th child in the world that suffers from stunting problems belongs to India.
- In Bihar percentage of stunting was reduced by 5.4% from the NFHS-4 to the NFHS-5 survey.

Causes of stunting

- 1. Lack of nutritious food and intake of junk food by children.
- 2. Lack of playgrounds.
- 3. Environmental pollution.
- 4. Lack of nutritious food available to the mother during pregnancy.

Government initiative to reduce Stunting problem

- Integrated Child Development Scheme: Launched in 1975, it provides nutritious food, health care facility, immunization facility etc to children (0 to 6 year) and pregnant and lactating women.
- 2. **Mission Indradhanush**: Immunization scheme for 12 vaccine-preventable diseases.
- 3. **POSHAN Abhiyaan:** To Provide nutritious food to children.
- 4. National Food Security Act, 2013: To provide subsidized food grain to poor families (under Targeted Public Distribution System).
- 5. **Food Fortification:** Addition of vitamins and minerals like Iron, Vitamin A, Folic Acid, zinclodine etc to make food more nutritious.

Empowering Rural Startups In Bihar

Context

Bihar Entrepreneurship Association (BEA) will empower Rural Startups in Bihar.

More about news

 BEA under the 'HDFC Parivartan Grant Scheme' will add the startups that are involved in Agriculture and Rural Development in Bihar through its Incubation programme to empower them.

- Selection criteria: BEA will select startups based on use of Agriculture methodology, Biodiversity conservation, climate-smart agriculture in startup components.
- **Grant:** Selected startups will get up to 50 Lakhs grants.
- Application: Applications are invited till 10th February 2024.
- AIM: Through this programme "Skill India program" would be brought to the surface.

About BEA

- BEA was founded in 2011 as a Non-profit, voluntary organization by the youths of Bihar.
- BEA works for the Economic Empowerment of women and youth through entrepreneurship in the state. BEA focused more on grassroots entrepreneurship and startups through inspiration, preparation, and execution.
- In the last 10 years, BEA has conducted over 1.5 lakh direct interactions with youth, women, and farmers through 100 plus "start-ups yatra" and "Krishi Samvad".

Apple Farming Promotion Scheme

Context

The Department of Agriculture of Bihar discontinued the 'Apple Farming Promotion Scheme' in the state.

More about news

- Based on a report of Bihar Agriculture University (BAU), the Department of Agriculture discontinued this scheme.
- According to the BAU report, for Apple Farming, the temperature of the environment should be less than 7 degrees Celsius at least for 100 hours. But in Bihar, there is no such environmental condition.
- However, Central Agriculture University in its report said that Apple farming is possible in Bihar.
- Apple Farming Promotion Scheme:
 - The scheme was launched in 2021-22 by the Department of Agriculture, Bihar under "Bihar Vishesh Udyanik Fasal Yojana".
 - This scheme was launched as a pilot project in 7 districts of Bihar.



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- In Vaishali, Begusarai, Bhagalpur, Muzaffarpur, Aurangabad, Katihar, and Samastipur districts, the scheme was implemented in the initial phase.
- Under this scheme a subsidy of up to Rs 1.23 lakh per hectare for the apple plantation was given to farmers, nearly 50% of the estimated cost Rs 2.46 lakh.
- Apple Varieties like Hariman-99, Dorsett Golden, Anna, Michael, Tropical sweets, etc. can be grown in high-temperature areas also.



Patna Planetarium

Context

Recently, the Planetarium in Patna has been modernized making it world-class.

More about the news

- The renovation work started in 2021 and project was supposed to be completed by May 2023, but due to COVID-19 it got delayed by 1 year.
- Firms involved: USA-based Astro Tech and Germany-based Carl Zeiss.
- Project cost: Approximately 36 crores.
- Infrastructural changes:
- **1. Sound system:** 5.1 surround system with wall-mounted speakers have been installed.
- Projector: State-of-the-art Mirage RGB (red, green, blue) pure Laser projection system which includes an 8K 3D Digistar projection system.
- 3. **LED-based projector** with multiple lenses can beam a million stars on the 16-meter diameter

- projection dome which will be hanging on existing aluminum screen at a certain angle.
- 4. Seats: The number of seats was reduced to 225 seats from the existing 261 seats to make seats more comfortable. These are pushback seats for an enriching cosmic show experience.
- 5. A high-capacity **Optical Telescope** will also be installed in the planetarium.

Patna Planetarium

- It was set up after the idea presented by the former Bihar Chief Minister Shri Satyendra Narain Sinha in the year 1989.
- Its construction began in 1989 and was completed in 1993. It opened for the public on 1 April 1993.
- It is also known as Indira Gandhi Planetarium.

Bihar Horticulture Festival 2024

Context

Recently, "Bihar Horticulture Festival" was organized at Gandhi Maidan, Patna.

More about the news

- The festival was organized to increase competition among the farmers and will give them recognition at the state level.
- Farmers from across the state participated in this event with13 categories of horticulture products like Honey, Fruit, vegetable, Mushroom, etc.
- The winner of this event will get an amount of Rs.5000 and the winner of Special Award for Best Gardening will be given Rs.10000.
- Bihar ranks **1st** in Makhana production, **4th** in Honey production, and **1st** in Mushroom production.

Bihar government's initiatives for Horticulture:

- 1. Chief Minister Horticulture mission.
- 2. Makhana Vikas Yojana.
- 3. Integrated Horticulture Development Scheme.
- 4. Bihar Madhumakhi Palan Yojana.

Sinha Library Patna

Context

On 9th February 2024 Patna's famed Sinha Library completed its 100th year of establishment.



More about news

- A commemorative special cover was made for this library to celebrate the centenary of the landmark institution by the Bihar Circle of Indian Post Office department.
- The Chief guest of this programme was Post Master General of Bihar Circle, Mr. Anil Kumar.

About Sinha Library

- The library was founded by Sachchidananda Sinha and was inaugurated by the then Governor of Bihar and Orissa, Sir Henry Wheeler on February 9, 1924.
- It was established officially as the "Srimati Radha Sinha Institute and Sachchidananda Sinha Library", popularly known as 'Sinha Library'.
- The Library has a rich collection of 1.8 lakh books and copies of some of the oldest Newspapers from 1901 onwards.
- Sachchidananda Sinha donated his collection of around 50000 rare books, which includes copies of Manu Simiriti, original copy of the Indian Constitution, Sacred Books of the East edited by Max Muller, Buddhist suttas, etc.
- Some old newspapers like Indian People, Bihari Times, Leader, Harijan, Criterion, Searchlight are also preserved here.
- Other: Most of the Relief Committee (during the 1934 Earthquake) meetings were also held here under the chairmanship of Rajendra Prasad.

Growth rate of Bihar

Context

Recently, the growth rate of Bihar has remained constant at **10** percent during **2023–2024**.

Key Points

- In 2022–2023 the "Real GSDP" is expected to grow by 10.6% to Rs. 4.4 lakh crore, while the GSDP of Bihar is expected to grow by 15.5% to Rs. 7.5 lakh crore.
- As per Economy survey 2023-24, the Gross fixed capital formation(GFCF) in the state at the current price, as a percentage of GSDP(at current price) is estimated to be 4.7% in 2022-23.
- As per Bihar Economy Survey 2023-24, the nominal per capita income in the state is estimated to be

- **Rs. 59,637**, with an increase of **13.9%** over the previous year.
- After adjusting Inflation, the real per capita income of the state is expected to grow by 9% in 2022-23 to reach Rs. 35,119.
- The capital expenditure increased by 41.4% whereas revenue expenditure increased by 15.5% over the previous year.
- As per the quick estimate for 2022-23, the share of the tertiary sector in the gross value added in the state's economy is estimated to be 60%, share of the primary and secondary sectors is estimated to be 20% each in 2022-23.
- The value added by the primary, secondary, and tertiary sectors is estimated to increase by 6.7%, 6.8%, and 13% respectively in 2022-23.
- Primary sector has a significant share in employment, and lowest in the gross value added in both Bihar and India. With the primary sector, agriculture is the biggest employer in the state.
- Example: The share in the gross value added by the primary sector in 2021-22 was 20.7% in Bihar and the sector employed 47.8% of the total workforce in the state.
- Secondary sector has a 20.7% share in the gross value added in Bihar in 2021-22 and a 25.9% share in the state's employment.
- Tertiary sector has a 58.6% share in the Gross Value Added in Bihar in 2021-22 and a 26.3% share in the state's employment.

Usha Kiran Khan

Context

Recently, litterateur and Padma Shri awardee Ushakiran Khan passed away.

Ushakiran Khan

- She was born at Laheriasarai in **Darbhanga district** in October **1945**.
- · Notable works:
- 1. Maithili novel 'Bhamati: Ek Avismaraniya Prem Katha', for which she received the Sahitya Akademi Award.
- Hindi novel 'Sirjanhaar', which earned her the Kusumanjali Sahitya Samman from the Indian Council for Cultural Relations in 2012.



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Padma Awards

Padma Awards, which were instituted in the year 1954, are announced every year on the occasion of Republic Day except for the years 1978 and 1979 and 1993 to 1997.

The award is given in three categories, namely,

- Padma Vibhushan for exceptional and distinguished service.
- · Padma Bhushan for distinguished service of a high order.
- · Padma Shri for distinguished service.

Exceptions

 All persons without distinction of race, occupation, position or sex are eligible for these awards.
 However, Government servants including those working with PSUs, except doctors and scientists, are not eligible for these Awards.

Who provides the awards

• All nominations received for the Padma Awards are placed before the Padma Awards Committee, which is constituted by the Prime Minister every year.

Urban Haat

Context

The Ministry of Textile will open Urban Haat in 6 districts of Bihar.

More about news

- Haats will be opened at Patna, Gaya, Darbhanga, Siwan, Nalanda, and Bhagalpur.
- According to the Ministry's directions, construction
 of Haat must be within 8 km from the center of the
 main city and spread over an area of 8000 sq km.
- National Handloom Development Corporation will construct these haats.
- Through these Haats, weavers will get an Infrabased

- Market for their products and recognition of their special skill and technique, removal of middlemen, and an increment in their income.
- It will provide permanent marketing infrastructure and direct marketing facilities to weavers and other craftsmen in the region.

Urban Haat in Bihar

- Mithila Urban Haat is the 1st Urban Haat in Bihar.
- It was inaugurated by CM Nitish Kumar in January 2023.
- World-famous Mithilanchal paintings, Craft Court, Boating (in the pond), Food Court, Multipurpose Hall, Open Theater for folk songs (of Mithilanchal), and dance performances and other cultural festivals are organized in this haat.
- This haat is serving as a harbinger of development in the region.

Indian Stamp Bill 2023

Context

The government prepared a draft of "Indian Stamp Bill 2023" to replace the Indian Stamp Act 1899 and put it up for public suggestion within 30 days.

The Indian Stamp Act

 Came into force in 1899, it lays down the legal provisions for the tax levied in the form of stamps on instruments recording transactions.

Stamp Duty

- Stamp Duty is a tax imposed on the sale of property or property ownership by the state government.
- Stamp duties are levied by the Central Government and collected by the State government.
- Stamp duties are mentioned in entry 91 of the Seventh schedule.
- It also includes bills of exchange, cheques, and promissory notes..

EVMs and VVPATs

Context

Before the 2024 Lok Sabha Elections, the Election Commission of India started a nationwide awareness Programme on EVMs (Electronic Voting Machines) and VVPATs (Voter Verifiable Paper Audit Trials) by setting up over **3500 democenters** and **4250 mobile vans**.


EVM (Electronic Voting Machines)

- It is a device used by electronic means to record and count votes cast in elections.
- The Indian EVM system is also known as ECI-EVM, which comprises a Ballot Unit (BU), a Control Unit (CU), and a Voter Verifiable Paper Audit Trail (VVPAT).
- EVMs were used for the first time in the byelections of the Parur Assembly Constituency of Kerala in 1982.
- In 2004, in the General Elections of the Lok Sabha,

the EVMs were used in all 543 Parliamentary Constituencies of the Country.

VVPAT (Voter Verifiable Paper Audit Trails)

- It is a self-governing system committed to the Electronic Voting Machines that allows the voters to validate that their votes are cast as projected.
- When a vote is cast, a slip is printed on the VVPAT printer comprising the serial number, name, and symbol of the candidate and remains visible through a see-through window for 7 seconds, after which the printed slip automatically gets cut and falls into the sealed drop box of the VVPAT.
- VVPAT consists of a Printer and a VVPAT Status Display Unit (VSDU).
- VVPAT was used for the first time in the Noksen Assembly Constituency of Nagaland in 2013.



Pradhan Mantri Suryodaya Yojana (PMSY)

Context

The "Pradhan Mantri Suryodaya Yojana" has been announced by Prime Minister Narendra Modi as a major step towards increasing the use of Renewable energy.

Objectives of PMSY

 Under the Pradhan Mantri Suryodaya Yojana, solar panels will be installed in 1 Crore homes.



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 The Pradhanmantri Suryodaya Yojana seeks to generate extra revenue for excess electricity generation while simultaneously supplying lowand middle-income individuals with electricity through solar rooftop installations.

Eligibility

- This scheme is open only to Indian citizens who are permanent residents.
- Homeowners can only take advantage of this programme.

Key Points

- According to a recent CEEW (Council on Energy, Environment and Water) study, Indian households have the potential to install more than 640 GW of rooftop solar power.
- There are currently about 7-8 lakh rooftop solar system installations and 4 GW of solar capacity created by the government capital subsidy programme.
- India is the 3rd largest energy-consuming country in the world after China and USA.
- India secured 4th rank globally for renewable energy and wind energy installed capacity.
- India ranks 5th in Solar Power Capacity globally.
- India has set a target at the COP26 of 500GW of non-fossil fuel-based energy by 2030.
- The installed solar energy capacity has increased by 30 times in the last 9 years and stands at 72.31 GW as per the latest Report.
- The installed Renewable energy capacity (including large Hydro) has increased by around 128% since 2014.

Custodial Death

Context

Recently, a man from Gujarat died in police custody after an alleged torture.

Custodial Death

- It covers deaths that take place in jail, on a police or other official vehicle, in a public area, on a private or medical property, or in a police station.
- Numerous factors, including the use of excessive force, neglect, or abuse by the authorities, can result in custodial death.

 As per the Law Commission of India, the offense committed by a public servant against an arrested or detained individual while they are under custody is considered to be custodial violence.

Constitutional Provisions for Custodial Death

- Article 21: Accused individuals, those awaiting trial, and other detainees could not be denied access to Article 21 of the Constitution unless it was done so in accordance with procedure established by law.
- Article 22: Article 22 specifies that no one who
 is arrested may be held in custody without being
 made aware of the reason for the arrest, as well as
 providing protection against arrest and detention
 in specific circumstances.
- CrPC,1973: Section 49 provides that the police are not permitted to use more restraint than is necessary to prevent the accused's escape.
- **IPC, 1860:** If a police officer kills an accused while they are in custody, they will be held accountable for murder under Section 302.

Implementation of Uniform Civil Code (UCC)

Context

Recently, the Uttarakhand Cabinet has approved the final draft of the Uniform Civil Code.



About UCC

UCC aims to replace the unique personal rules of each faith with a unified body of laws covering topics including adoption, divorce, marriage, and inheritance.



The Constitutional Provisions of UCC

- Article 44 of the Constitution which mandates that the state "shall endeavor to secure for the citizens a Uniform Civil Code throughout the territory of India".
- Articles 14, 15, and 21 which acts as a watchdog against any inequality irrespective of religion, Race, Cast, or Sex.
- These Articles also deal with discrimination, cruel treatment, and infringements on fundamental rights due to gender prejudice.
- On the other hand Articles 25 to 28 deal with the freedom of religion and religious practice.

The Delimitation Exercise

Context

The delimitation of constituencies for the Lok Sabha and State Legislative Assemblies which was postponed due to the COVID-19 pandemic and subsequently due to delays on the part of the Central government will be carried out based on the first Census after 2026.

What is delimitation?

- Delimitation is the process of fixing the number of seats and boundaries of territorial constituencies in each State for the Lok Sabha and Legislative assemblies to reflect the change in population.
- Delimitation exercise also determines the seats to be reserved for Scheduled Castes (SC) and Scheduled Tribes (ST) in the Lok Sabha and Legislative assemblies.
- Delimitation Exercise is conducted by the Delimitation Commission that is set up under an act of Parliament.

Delimitation Commission

- The President of India appoints the Delimitation Commission under Article 82 of the Indian Constitution.
- Article 170 mentions division of states into territorial constituencies as per Delimitation Act after every Census.
- The Delimitation Commission works in collaboration with the Election Commission of India.
- Members Retired Supreme Court judge (Chairperson)
- Chief Election Commissioner
- · Respective State Election Commissioners
- The Commission's orders are final and cannot be questioned before any court.
- The Delimitation Commission works without any executive influence.
- The Lok Sabha or State Legislative Assembly cannot modify the orders of the commission.

Present status of Delimitation exercise

- The 42nd Constitutional Amendment Act freezed the number of seats of the Lok Sabha and the state legislative assemblies based on the census 1971 figures until after the 2001 census.
- The 84th Constitutional Amendment Act freezed the number of seats based on the 1971 census till 2026.


Regional Connectivity Scheme

Context

Budget allocation in the Regional Air Connectivity Scheme (UDAN) has been reduced by around 60%.

More about the news

- The scheme UDAN will receive ₹502 crore in FY25 which is around 60% lower than last year i.e. 850 crore.
- The amount will be spent to renovate 22 airports, start 124 air routes, and finance viability gap funding for north-east connectivity.



About UDAN Scheme

- It is a government-sponsored program under the Ministry of Civil Aviation (MoCA) to enhance India's air connectivity and infrastructure, especially in remote areas.
- The first UDAN flight was inaugurated by PM Narendra Modi in 2017 connecting Shimla to Delhi.

Objectives

- Refueling Growth in the Aviation Industry.
- Promoting the Tourism sector in India.
- Boosting Air connectivity- from Mundra in Gujrat to Tezu in Arunachal Pradesh.

Particularly Vulnerable Tribal Groups (PVTGs)

Context

Recently, the Rajya Sabha passed the Constitution (Scheduled Tribes) Order Amendment Bill, 2024 and Constitution (Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes) Order Amendment Bill, 2024.

About the Bill

- The passage of the Bill cleared the way for the addition of many new communities to the ST list of Odisha and the inclusion of synonyms and phonetic variations of existing tribes in the ST lists of both Andhra Pradesh and Odisha.
- 7 PVTGs were added of which 4 are from Odisha and 3 from Andhra Pradesh. They are:

From Odisha

- 1. Bondo as a sub-tribe of the Bondo Poraja Tribe;
- 2. Mankidia as a synonym of Mankiridia tribe;
- Pauri Bhuyan and Paudi Bhuyan as a synonym of Bhuyan Tribe;
- 4. Chuktia Bhunjia as a synonym of Bhunjia Tribe.

From Andhra Pradesh

- Bondo Porja and Khond Porja as a synonym of Porja Tribe
- 2. Konda Savaras as a synonym of the Savaras Tribe

Background

 Dhebar commission (1960-1961) was constituted to address the issues of Tribal people.



 The Government of India declared 52 tribal groups as PVTGs on the recommendation of this commission in 1975.

About PVTG

- They are more vulnerable among the tribal groups.
- · Population- Small and stagnant/declining
- Technology- simple technology with slow rate of change in adoption of technology.
- · Location- Physically isolated
- Literacy level- Extremely low
- Economy- Subsistence agriculture and collection of forest's resources.

Present status

- Presently there are 75 PVTGs.
- They are spread over 18 states and one Union Territory (Census 2011).
- Odisha has the highest number (more than 2.5 lakh) of PVTGs.

Government Schemes for PVTGs

The Pradhan Mantri Janjati Adivasi Nyaya Maha Abhiyan (PM JANMAN)

- It is part of the Pradhan Mantri Particularly Vulnerable Tribal Groups Development Mission.
- This scheme was launched on 15th November 2023 in Jharkhand, on the occasion of Janjatiya Gaurav Diwas.
- Budget- Approximately Rs 24,000 crore.
- Objective of the Scheme- To improve socioeconomic conditions of the PVTGs by providing PVTG households and habitations with basic facilities such as safe housing, clean drinking water and sanitation, electricity, road and telecom connectivity etc.
- Coordinating role-The scheme will be implemented by 9 ministries with Ministry of Tribal Affairs playing the key role.
- Focus- 11 critical interventions for Particularly Vulnerable Tribal Groups (PVTG).

Development of Particularly Vulnerable Tribal Groups (PVTGs)

• This scheme is implemented by the **Ministry of Tribal Affairs**.

• This scheme is a centrally Sponsored scheme having a provision of 100% Central assistance.



 This scheme aims at socio-economic development of PVTGs in a comprehensive manner, while retaining their culture and heritage.

Home Ministry meets with the 'Zo United' delegation

Context

Delegation of various Tribal organizations from Manipur under the banner of 'ZO United' met Ministry of Home Affairs Officials.

Key Points

- The delegation consisted of 9 members.
- The meeting was arranged to discuss the current situation in the north-eastern states.
- The Tribal leaders' delegation comprises of leaders of
- 1. Indigenous Tribal Leader's Forum (ITLF).
- 2. Committee on Tribal Unity.
- 3. Kuki Inpi Manipur.
- 4. Zomi Council.
- 5. Hill tribal council and all tribal Council.

Kuki Tribe

- The Kuki people are an ethnic group in the Northeastern Indian states (except-Arunachal pradesh) as well as the neighboring countries of Bangladesh and Myanmar.
- According to the 2011 Census, Tripura has 10,965 total Kuki residents.
- They manage their livelihood through Jhum cultivation and by producing fruits.



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- They speak a language which is close to the Kuki-Chin linguistic family of the Sino-Tibetan race.
- Majority of the Kuki tribes are Christians.

Manipur's ethnic faultlines: Kuki-Meitei divide & recent unrest There are 16 districts in Manipur, but the state is commonly thought of as divided into 'valley' and 'hill' districts. In these hill areas, which comprise the bulk of Manipur's geographical area, live 15 Naga tribes and the Chin-Kuki-Mizo-Zomi group. **Imphal** (East and West) Kukis and Nagas point out that tribal areas are 90% of state's geographical area, but the bulk of its budget and development work is focused on Valley areas Bishnupur the Meitei-dominated Kakching Imphal valley. The Manipur valley is encircled by skirts of low hills that spread into Nagaland and Mizoram

Subcategorization within SC quota

Context

While tribals can buy land in the valley, Meiteis are prohibited from buying

land in the hills

A Seven Judge Constitution Bench headed by Chief Justice of India D Y Chandrachud is examining the issue of the Sub Categorisation of the Schedule Castes, dismissed the argument that preferential allotment to the certain subcastes within schedule caste would lead to 'Balkanisation of the list'.

Observation of the Supreme court

- Subcategorization could be a measure to ensure that the benefits of reservation reach the more backward categories within the reserved classes.
- If only certain castes are cornering the reservation benefits, it can lead to inequality.

Inclusion/Exclusion in Schedule Castes List

- Articles 341 empowers the President to notify a list of Scheduled Castes.
- The inclusion or exclusion of any caste from the Presidential list is done by **Parliament through legislation.**

Previous Judgements of the Supreme Court:

- E V Chinnaiah Vs State of Andhra Pradesh (2004): The Supreme court held that Under Article 341, only the President can notify which communities will get reservation.
- Jarnail Singh Vs Lachhmi Narain Gupta case (2018): The Supreme court held the concept of "Creamy Layer" within SCs too.

Constitutional Provisions For the Schedule Castes

Clause 4 and 5 of article 15 of the

constitution states that, nothing in

Article 15	Article 15 (discrimination on the basis of caste) prevents the government from making special legal provisions to improve the lives of socially and educationally backward citizens as well as those from schedule castes.
Article 16	Clause 4 and 4(A) of article 16 of the constitution provides for reservation in appointments to post and services in favour of the backward class of citizens which, in the opinion of the state, is not adequately represented in the service under the state.
Article 46	The State shall promote the educational and economic interests of Scheduled Castes.
Article 243D and 243T	Reservation of seats for Schedule castes in Panchayats and Municipalities.
Article 330	Reservation for Scheduled Castes in the Lok Sabha.
Article 335	Reservation for schedule castes in public service
Article 338	Establishment of National Commission for Schedule Caste.

Statutory Provisions

 The Scheduled Castes and the Scheduled Tribes (Prevention of Atrocities) Act, 1989: The Parliament of India enacted this law to prevent atrocities and hate crimes against the scheduled castes and scheduled tribes.

Namo Drone Didi (NDD)

Context

The Finance Minister in the interim budget allocated 500 crore rupees for the Namo Drone Didi scheme to provide drones to **15000 Women SHGs.**



Namo Drone didi

- Namo Drone Didi is a scheme launched by the Ministry of Agriculture and Farmers Welfare to empower rural women by training them to operate drones for agricultural purposes.
- The scheme aims to train 15,000 Women Self Help Groups (WSHGs) across the country to fly drones and provide drone-based services to farmers.
- The scheme aims to utilize innovation in technology to empower women in rural areas and make them the center of economic activity and rural prosperity.
- This scheme addresses the need to modernize the agriculture practices and increase the agriculture productivity by applying cuttingedge technology by rural women.
- It provides new opportunities for the country's new start-ups to enter the emerging field of Drone aeronautics.

GHAR Portal

Context

As informed by NCPCR, a total of 5175 children have been registered on the "Go Home and Re-Unite" (GHAR) Portal for repatriation.

Go Home and Re-Unite (GHAR) Portal

- GO Home and Re-Unite (GHAR) is a Portal developed by the National Commission for Protection of Child Rights (NCPCR), launched on 20th November 2022.
- It has been developed to digitally monitor and track the restoration and repatriation of children under the Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of Children) Act, 2015.

Salient Features of GHAR Portal

Salient features of GHAR Portal

To digitally track and monitor the children who are in Juvenile Justice system

Digital transfer of cases of children to the concerned Juvenile Justice Board for speedy repatriation of children Where there is a requirement of a translator/interpreter /expert, request to be made to the concerned State Government.

Child Welfare
Committees and District

A checklist format will be provided so that the children who are hard to repatriate or children who are not getting their entitled compensation can be identified.

Meri Gaon Meri Dharohar (MGMD)

- MGMD is a web portal that was launched in July 2023.
- The mission of the MGMD is to gather comprehensive data about the history, way of life, and culture of Indian villages.

Under MGMD, information is collected under seven-categories

- 1. Arts and Crafts Village.
- 2. Ecologically Oriented Village.



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- 3. Indian Textual and Scriptural Traditions Connected to a Scholastic Village.
- 4. Epic Village is associated with oral epics and Puranic legends, the Ramayana, and the Mahabharata.
- 5. Historical Village linked with Local and National History.
- 6. Architectural Heritage Village.
- 7. Any other feature that should be highlighted, like a shepherding village, horticultural village, fishing village, etc.

Financial assistance

 Under the Financial Assistance for Promotion of Art and Culture scheme, which consists of eight scheme components, a financial outlay of Rs. 353.46 crores has been approved for a period of five financial years from 2021–2022 to 2025–2026.

Features of MGMD

Recently, Prime Minister Narendra Modiannounced 'PM Surya Ghar: Muft Bijli Yojana', to encourage people to install solar panels on their rooftops.

Objectives of The Scheme

 This scheme aims to light up one crore households by providing up to 300 units of free electricity every month.

Total investment in the scheme:

• Rs 75,000 crore have been earmarked for this project.

Features of the scheme

 Subsidies and concessional bank loans: Substantive subsidies will be given directly to people's bank accounts. There is a provision for concessional bank loans to install solar panels.

- Promotion of Rooftop Solar Panels: Urban local bodies and panchayats will be incentivised to promote rooftop solar panels in their jurisdiction.
- Benefits of the scheme: The scheme will lead to more income, lesser power bills and employment generation for people.
- National Online Portal: A National Online Portal will integrate all stakeholders, consumers, urban local bodies, and financial institutions. This portal will streamline the application and implementation process.

SHRESHTA SCHEME

Context

Recently, **CBSE** has issued guidelines for the implementation of the SHRESTA Scheme 2023 in all affiliated private residential schools.

About SHRESHTA Scheme

 The SHRESHTA (Residential Education for Students in High Schools in Targeted Areas) program is launched by the Government to give meritorious SC (Scheduled Caste) boy and girl students admission in the nation's top private residential school.

Objectives of the Scheme

- To expand the scope of the government's development initiative.
- To bridge the gap by working with non-profit organizations in areas where Scheduled Castes (SCs) are underrepresented in the education sector.

- To create an atmosphere that will support the Scheduled Castes' (SCs) socioeconomic advancement and general development.
- To give talented Scheduled Caste (SC) students access to a high-quality education so they can pursue opportunities in the future.



Scheme is implemented in two modes

- In mode-I, a set number of deserving SC students—roughly 3000 students of class 9th and 11th in States and UTs—are chosen annually via the National Entrance Test for SHRESHTA (NETS) conducted by National Testing Agency's (NTA) and accepted into private residential schools connected to the CBSE/State Boards.
- Under mode-2, NGOs will receive funding to manage school and hostel projects related to the education of Scheduled Caste students. Every year, 13,500 slots are set aside for SC students.

Competition Commission of India

Context

The Competition Commission of India will soon start studying the impact of Artificial Intelligence (AI) on business and services.

Competition Commission of India

- The Competition Commission of India (CCI) is a statutory body established under the Competition Act, 2002.
- The Act forbids anti-competitive agreements, the misuse of a dominant position by businesses, and combinations (acquisition, takeover, and mergers and acquisitions) that have the potential to materially harm Indian competition.
- The Competition (Amendment) Act of 2007 amended the Competition Act of 2002, keeping it consistent with the principles of contemporary competition law.

Objectives of CCI

- To provide proactive engagement with the stakeholders, consumers, industry, government, and international jurisdiction.
- As a knowledge-intensive organization with a high competence level.

- Professionalism, transparency, resolve, and wisdom in enforcement.
- To eliminate practices that have adverse effects on competition, promote and sustain competition, protect the interests of consumers, and ensure trade in the markets of India.
- The commission has to give an opinion on competition issues on a reference received from a statutory authority.

Member of CCI

• CCI consists of a Chairperson and 6 Members appointed by the Central Government.

EDCIL Vidyanjali Scholarship Program

Context

Union Minister of Education and Skill Development & Entrepreneurship, Shri Dharmendra Pradhan, launched EDCIL Vidyanjali Scholarship Program scheme on 6th February 2024 in New Delhi.



More about News

- This initiative aims to ensure access to highquality learning systems by facilitating a seamless transition from secondary to higher education and extending financial support for the meritorious Navodaya Vidyalaya students who lack means.
- This scheme is in alignment with the NEP-2020, aimed at revolutionizing opportunities for quality education and access to higher education institutions.
- This scheme focuses on 'Going beyond mere Enrollment' and providing quality education.
- The **Online Vidyanjali Fintech Platform** was also launched during the event.



 Five significant MOUs were also exchanged between the government and private sectors towards nation-building and empowerment of the future workforce of India.

Deputy Chief Minister

Context

Recently, The Supreme Court of India dismissed a petition challenging the appointment of Deputy Chief Ministers in States on the ground that no such position exists in the Constitution.

Arguments of the petitioner

- The post of The Deputy Chief Minister is not mentioned in The Constitution.
- The appointment of the Deputy Chief Minister is motivated by religious and sectarian considerations.
- The appointment of the Deputy Chief Minister is against Article 14 (right to equality) and Article 15 (Prohibition of discrimination by the State).

Observations of the Supreme Court

- A three-judge Bench headed by Chief Justice of India found no harm in the appointment of Deputy Chief Ministers due to following reasons-
 - The Deputy Chief Ministers are Members of Legislative Assemblies (MLAs) of the States and Ministers of State governments.
 - The Deputy Chief Minister does not draw a higher salary and is as like as any other Minister in the government.

Constitutional provisions: Chief Minister and Council of Ministers

- Article 163: There shall be a Council of Ministers with the Chief Minister at the head to aid and advise the Governor in the exercise of his functions.
- Article 164: The Chief Minister shall be appointed by the Governor and the other Ministers shall be appointed by the Governor on the advice of the Chief Minister.
- The Post Of Deputy Chief Minister lacks any Constitutional backing.

Deputy Chief Minister: present scenario

- Presently 14 states have deputy chief ministers.
- Andhra Pradesh has five Deputy Chief Ministers while Bihar has two deputy Chief Ministers.

Anugrah Narayan Sinha

- He holds the distinction of being the first Deputy Chief Minister of Bihar in independent India.
 He remained Deputy CM until his death in 1957.
- **Appointment of Election Commissioners**

Election Commissione

Recently, the Supreme Court of India refused to pass any interim order staying the operation of a new law on the appointment of Chief Election Commissioner (CEC) and Election Commissioners. The Chief Election Commissioner and Other Election Commissioners (Appointment, Conditions of Service and Term of Office) Act, 2023.

Context

The Chief Election Commissioner and Other Election Commissioners shall be appointed by the President of India on the recommendation of a Selection Committee.

The Selection Committee will consist of 3 members

 the Prime Minister, the Union Cabinet Minister
 and the Leader of the Opposition.

Supreme Court's Judgement

The appointment of the Chief Election Commissioner and the Election Commissioners shall be made by the President on the advice of a Selection Committee that will consist of the Prime Minister, the Leader of the Opposition of the Lok Sabha and the Chief Justice of India(CJI). (The above-mentioned act replaced CJI with the union cabinet minister).

- Earlier Election Commissioners used to be appointed by the President on the recommendations of the Union Government.
- This law was brought by the Union Government after the Judgement of the Supreme court (September 2023) on appointment of Election Commissioners.



Election Commission of India

- The Election Commission of India (ECI) is a Constitutional body.
- The ECI was established on 25th January 1950.
- ECI derives its power of superintendence, direction, and control of elections to parliament, state legislatures, the office of the president of India, and the office of vice-president of India from Article 324 of the Indian Constitution.
- Presently ECI is a multi-member body consisting of Chief Election Commissioners and other Election Commissioners.
- The tenure of election commissioners is not prescribed in the Constitution.
- · As per Statutory law, the Chief Election Commissioner or an Election Commissioner shall hold office for a term of **six years**, or up to the age of **65 years**, whichever is earlier.
- The Chief Election Commissioner can be removed by the President on the approval of a resolution by a two-third majority in both the houses on the grounds of proven misbehavior or incapacity.
- Election Commissioner can be removed by the President on the recommendation of the Chief Election Commissioner.
- ECI has the power to register a political party but it cannot deregister a political party.

New Laws to Tackle Damaged Public Property


Context

The 22nd Law Commission of India recommended key changes in the law to tackle damage to public property.

Recommendation of law commission

- Presumption against the accused: A rebuttable presumption will be present if evidence demonstrates that the offense directly caused harm to the property
- The prosecution for assisting mischief: When public property is damaged as a consequence of demonstrations, hartals, or bandh called by any organization. The organization's officers will be found guilty of aiding and abetting the offense and will face appropriate sanctions.

- Punishment for abetment: The punishment for abetment shall be the same as that for the offense abetted.
- Definition of Fine: It will mean and include a sum equal to the market worth of the damaged public property.
- Bail: A person can be released on bail if the court satisfies itself that the person is not guilty
- Special Circumstances for Lesser Punishment: A court must record "special" reasons, rather than just any reasons if it sentences someone to fewer than six months in prison for mischief or damage to public property.



What is Public Property

Public property encompasses anything (land, buildings, equipment) owned or controlled by central/state governments, local authorities, public corporations, and specified institutions funded mainly by the government.

About the Law Commission

- The Law Commission of India is a non-statutory organization that was established by a notification from the Ministry of Law & Justice, Department of Legal Affairs, and the Government of India.
- Its purpose is to conduct legal research, and it reports to the Government on its findings in the form of reports.
- It works as an advisory body to the Ministry of Law and Justice.
- Present Chairman-Rituraj Awasthi.

NGOs' FCRA Registrations Canceled

Context

The Center for Policy Research (CPR) and World Vision India (WVI) registration under the Foreign Contribution Regulation Act (FCRA) has been withdrawn by the Union Ministry of Home Affairs.

Foreign Contribution (Regulation) Act, 1976

- The Act, which was first passed in 1976, requires registration for any association, group, or nongovernmental organization that wants to accept donations from overseas.
- The Union Ministry of Home Affairs controls foreign donations through the Foreign Contributions Regulation Act (FCRA) to make sure that the money doesn't compromise the nation's internal security.

Key Points

 NGOs whose registration was about to expire between September 29, 2020, and September 30, 2021, were granted an extension by the MHA to apply for a renewal until September 30, 2021.

FLOW OF CASH

- Kiren Rijiju said around
 25,000 NGOs registered under
 FCRA in the country
- 190 NGOS' FCRA placed on cancelled list of MHA in Telangana in 2017
- ➤ Quantum of foreign funds received in 2014-15 | ₹15,299 crore
- In 2015-16, foreign funds stood at ₹17,773 crore
- In 2016-17, foreign funds added up to ₹13,750 crore

- The deadline has been repeatedly extended by the MHA, with the most recent extension being March 31, 2024.
- According to a 2012 MHA Report, there are more than 20 lakh NGOs registered in the country; out of which less than 2% of these NGOs will only be registered under the FCRA.
- According to the ministry, 13,520 NGOs got foreign contributions totaling ₹55,741.51 crore in the fiscal years 2019–2020, 2020–21, and 2021–22.

Work Capacity Of Farm Labour

Context

A new study by Researchers from various universities in the United States of America, United Kingdom, and Australia highlighted that the physical work capacity (PWC) of farm labour is decreased due to heat exposure.

Key Points

- PWC is the ability to work hard for extended periods, having strong tolerance, and the capacity to prevent changes brought on by fatigue.
- In regions of Southeast and South Asia, West and Central Africa, and northern South America PWC reduced to 70%.
- · Process Flow of PM KISAN Scheme:
- On the other hand in the Indo-Gangetic region of India and Pakistan, PWC has gone below 40%.
- In addition to Climate Change it has become another threat to World's food security.

PM KISAN Scheme

Context


The Finance Minister in the Interim Budget has said that a total of 11.8 crore farmers have been provided financial assistance under the PM KISAN scheme.

About PM KISAN

- It is a **Central Sector** scheme with 100% funding from the Central government.
- An income support of ₹6000 is provided to all landholding farmers in 3 equal installments.



 Funds will be directly transferred to the Aadhar seeded bank account of beneficiaries.



Inflation Targeting

Context


Recently, the Finance Ministry said that inflation should be kept within the Range of **2% to 6%**.

What is inflation?

- Inflation is the rate at which prices of goods and services rise.
- The most commonly used inflation indexes are the Consumer Price Index and the Wholesale Price Index.
- The WPI is used as the benchmark for calculating inflation in India.

Types of Inflation

- 1. Demand-pull inflation
- 2. Cost-push inflation
- 3. Built-in inflation



What causes Inflation

- An Increase in the money supply is the root cause of Inflation.
- Money supply can be increased by the monetary authority of a country (RBI in India) by:
- 1. Printing more currency and increasing the money supply in the market.
- 2. Reducing the value of the legal tender currency.
- 3. Giving loans to the government through the banking system by purchasing government bonds.

Index of Eight Core Industries

Context

Index of Eight Core Industries increased by 3.8 percent (provisional) in Dec 2023 compared to Dec 2022.

FAME 2 Scheme

Context


Recently, the Government reported that subsidies under the FAME II scheme will be eligible for e-vehicles sold till 31st March, 2024 or till the time funds are available, whichever is earlier.

FAME scheme

- The Faster Adoption and Manufacturing of Electric Vehicles (FAME) was launched in April 2015 under the National Electric Mobility Mission to encourage electric and hybrid vehicle purchase by providing financial support.
- It was implemented by the Ministry of Heavy Industries.
- Its first phase was in operation from 2015 to 2019.


FAME 2 scheme

- Phase- 2 will have a total budgetary support of Rs. 10,000 crore and will run for five years, starting on April 1, 2019.
- The Ministry of Heavy Industries has increased the outlay of the FAME II scheme from Rs 10,000 crores to Rs 11,500 crores.
- This phase mainly focuses on supporting electrification of public & shared transportation, and aims to support through providing incentives for 7090 eBuses, 5 lakh electric 3 Wheelers, 55000 electric 4 Wheeler Passenger Cars and 10 lakh electric 2 Wheelers.
- Under the Scheme, the development of charging infrastructure is also encouraged.



Government has taken various steps to give Incentives on electric vehicles

 The Production Linked Incentive (PLI) Scheme for the Automotive Sector was approved by the government on September 15, 2021.



- PLI Scheme for Advanced Chemistry Cell (ACC):
 On May 12, 2021, the government approved the
 PLI Scheme to begin producing ACC domestically.
 The plan is for setting up a 50 GWh competitive
 ACC battery manufacturing facility in the
 nation. Furthermore, 5 GWh of specialized ACC
 technologies are covered by the Scheme.
- GST on EVs has been reduced from 12% to 5%.
- GST on chargers/charging stations for EVs has been reduced from 18% to 5%.
- The Ministry of Road Transport & Highways (MoRTH) announced that the battery-operated



vehicles will be given **green license plates** and be exempted from permit requirements.

Pradhan Mantri Matsya Kisan Samridhi Sah-Yojan

Context

Recently the Union Cabinet approved the Pradhan Mantri Matsya Kisan Samridhi Sah-Yojan.

About Pradhan Mantri Matsya Kisan Samridhi Sah-Yojan

- Pradhan Mantri Matsya Kisan Samridhi Sah-Yojan is a central sector sub scheme under the Pradhan Mantri Matsya Sampada Yojana.
- The objective behind this scheme was Formalization of the fisheries sector and supporting fisheries micro and small enterprises.

Pradhan Mantri Matsya Sampada Yojana

- The scheme is being implemented in all States and UTs for a period of 5 years from Financial year 2020-21 to Financial year 2024-25.
- · Aim
- 1. Promote Blue Economy by means of systematic and sustainable development of the Fisheries sector.
- 2. Modernisation of Fisheries sectors and creation of infrastructure for post harvest management.
- 3. Double fishers' and Fish farmer's income.
- India is the 3rd largest fish producer and the 2nd largest aquaculture producer globally.
- Under this sub scheme **₹6,000 crore** will be invested in the next **four years** from Financial year 2023-24 to 2026-27.
- An estimated outlay of 6000 crore consisting of 50% i.e. Rs.3,000 crore public finance including the World Bank and the AFD (Agence Française de Développement) external financing, and rest 50% i.e.Rs.3,000 crore being the anticipated investment from the beneficiaries/private sector leverage.

Government E-Marketplace

Context

Government e-marketplace surpasses INR 1 lakh crore Gross Merchandise Value milestone in record time.

More in the news

- Accelerated growth, increased efficiency, and unwavering trust propelling Government e-Marketplace (GeM) to achieve an impressive milestone.
- It crossed INR 1 lakh crore in Gross Merchandise Value (GMV) within a remarkable span of 145 days.
- This outstanding achievement signifies a substantial improvement compared to the previous year.

What is GeM

- GeM is a short form of a one-stop Government e-marketplace where common user goods and services can be procured.
- GeM is a dynamic, self-sustaining, and user-friendly portal for making procurements by Government officers.

Features

- GeM eliminated human interface in vendor registration, ordering placement, and payment processing, to a great extent.
- Being an open platform, GeM offers no entry barriers to bonafide suppliers who wish to do business with the Government.



 At every step, SMS and e-mail notifications are sent to both buyers and sellers.

What is eNAM

The National Agriculture Market (NAM) is a pan-India electronic trading portal that networks the existing Agricultural Produce Market Committees (APMC) to createing a unified national market for agricultural commodities.



Lakhpati Didi Scheme

Context

Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman announced to enhance the target for the 'Lakhpati Didi scheme' from 2 crore to 3 crore in Union Budget 2024-25.

About 'Lakhpati Didi Scheme'

- 'Lakhpati Didi Scheme' is a central government scheme to financially empower women driven by the Ministry of Rural Development.
- The initiative has been initiated by DAY-NRLM (Deendayal Antyodaya yojana-National Rural Livelihood Mission)
- Lakhpati Didis- A woman who earns a sustainable income of at least one Lakh per annum per Household.
- Prime Minister Narendra Modi had announced the Lakhpati Didi scheme on 15th August 2023.
- The scheme aims to provide skill development training and financial help to women in villages and encourage them to start micro-enterprises.

Features

- Women with annual family income of at least Rs 1 lakh can take benefit of this scheme.
- The scheme can be availed by joining a self-help group.
- Women self-help groups will be made self-reliant by teaching them technical skills like making LED bulbs, plumbing, drone repairing, etc.

Achievement

- Nearly one crore women have become Lakhpati Didi already.
- Eighty-three lakh SHGs with nine crore women are transforming the rural socio-economic landscape.

National Technical Textile Mission

Context

Up to February 2024, 137 Research Projects have been approved under NTTM.

More about news

 So far 137 research projects worth 474.7 crores (approx.) has been approved by the Government to realize the goal of NTTM.

NTTM

- The mission was approved in 2020 by the Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs with the aim to position the country as a global leader in technical textiles.
- It aims at taking the domestic market size from USD 40 billion to USD 50 billion by 2024.
- To make India a global leader in Technical Textiles, NTTM has been approved with an outlay of Rs. 1480 crore; from FY 2020-21 to FY 2025-26.

NTTM has four components

Components	Objective
1. Research, Innovation & Development	• Total Outlay: Rs. 1000 crore • Key area of Research activities: Fiber level like - Nylon, Carbon and Composite fibers, etc Application-based fibers like agro, sports, medical mobile textile, etc.
2. Promotion & Market Development	• Aim: NTTM will target an average growth rate of 15-20% per annum by 2024 and develop the domestic market size to 40-50 billion USD by 2024.
3. Export promotion	 Aim: 10% increase in the average growth of export per annum up to FY 2023-24. Establishment of "Export Promotion Council For Technical Textiles" to increase the export of Technical Textiles.
4. Education, Training, and Skill Development	 Provide technical education at the Engineering level, Launching different Skill development courses and training modules.

Other Government Schemes for the Textile Sector

- PM MITRA Park scheme: Seven Mega Integrated Textile Region and Apparel Parks will be set up in different states.
- 2. **PLI Scheme for Textile Sector:** Government approved total Rs. 10,683 crore for five years for enhancing India's textile manufacturing capabilities.



- 3. **100% FDI** (under Automatic route) allowed for the Textile sector.
- 4. SAMARTH Scheme: This scheme is a demand-driven and placement-oriented umbrella skilling program of the Ministry of Textile.
- 5. Amended Technology Upgradation Fund Scheme: To catalyze capital investments for Technology upgradation and modernization of the Textile industry.

Foreign Contribution Regulation Act

Context

Recently, CBI registered a case of alleged Foreign Contribution Regulation Act (FCRA) violation against an NGO named "Centre for Equity Studies", and over 20,000 FCRA licenses have been canceled.

About FCRA

- It was enacted in the year 1976 to regulate the receiving and utilization of foreign contributions by individuals or organizations.
- It directly comes under the Ministry of Home Affairs.
- **CBI** has the power to investigate or arrest any person for violation of FCRA.

Key Provisions

- Any person who is accepting foreign money or donations of more than Rs. 1 lakh, has to inform the Central government.
- Any person belonging to any of the categories specified in section 6 who wants to avail foreign hospitality shall apply to the Central Government.
- The application for grant of permission to accept foreign hospitality must reach the appropriate authority ordinarily two weeks before the proposed date of onward journey.
- The acceptance of foreign monetary assistance in case of a medical emergency, central government has to be informed within 60 days.

What are the foreign Sources

- 1. The government of any foreign country.
- 2. Any international agency except the United Nations, the World Bank, the International Monetary Fund, etc.
- 3. Foreign company and a citizen of a foreign country.

4. A society, club, or other association or individuals formed or registered outside India.

MSP

Context

Recently the demands of farmers to legalize MSP has not been accepted by the Central Government and it has invited farmers to discuss the issue with them.

Minimum Support Price (MSP)

- It is a type of market intervention used by the Indian government to protect farmers from any significant decline in farm prices by guaranteeing a minimum price for their produce.
- The Government of India declares the Minimum Support Prices (MSP) at the starting of the sowing season for specific crops based on the recommendations of the Commission for Agricultural Costs and Prices (CACP).
- Government agencies buy the whole produce that farmers offer at the minimum price specified by the government.

Objectives

- To insure the farmers against a steep decline in the prices of their produce.
- To encourage farmers diversify their crops as MSP is announced for a diverse range of crops.



Methods to calculate MSP

1. **A2 method:-** The minimum support price (MSP) is set at 50% more than the total amount a farmer



spends on labours, seeds, fertilizers, and pesticides.

- 2. **A2+FL** method:- The A2+FL method has been used by the Indian government to calculate the current MSP. The MSP is set 50% higher than the total that results from adding the amount farmers spend on labours, seeds, fertilizers, pesticides, and other farming-related expenses, as well as the value of labour supplied by family members for agriculture.
- 3. **C2 method:** The financial worth of the family members' labour on the farm as well as the expenses incurred, such as rent and other assets. After calculating these, MSP is set at 50% above the derived amount.

Swaminathan Commission

The Swaminathan Commission, suggested that the MSP should be at least **50%** higher than the **C2** cost.

Crops Covered

- Minimum support prices (MSPs) for 22 crops and fair and remunerative price (FRP) for sugarcane.
- Crops:- 14 crops of the kharif season, 6 rabi crops and two commercial crops.
- The list of crops are

 The MSPs of toria and de-husked coconut are fixed on the basis of the MSPs of rapeseed/mustard and copra, respectively.

PM Street Vendor's AtmaNirbhar Nidhi (PM SVANidhi) Scheme

Context

A study conducted by the Centre for the Analytical Finance of the Indian School of Business(ISB) found that PM -SVANidhi boosted the annual income of street vendors by Rs.23,000.

About PM SVANidhi Scheme

- It is a Central Sector Scheme, launched by the Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs on June 01, 2020.
- PM SVANidhi is a micro-credit facility scheme that provides street vendors with a collateral-free loan of Rs 10,000 with low rates of interest (below 12%) for a period of one year. On timely repayment of the first loan of Rs.10000, the second loan of Rs.20000, and the third loan of Rs.50,000 will be given.

Objectives of the scheme

- To improve the financial condition of street vendors by providing working capital loans without any collateral.
- To inculcate the habit of regular repayment by providing incentives.
- To promote digital transactions by means of rewards.
- Small Industries Development Bank of India (SIDBI) implements this scheme.
- The scheme has been extended till December 2024 from the initial target of March 2022.
- Eligibility:
 - The Scheme is available to all street vendors engaged in vending in urban areas.



Benefits of the scheme


- 1. There is a provision of interest subsidy @ 7% per annum on timely/ early repayment of the loan.
- 2. No extra charges will be levied for early/timely repayment of loans.
- 3. Digital transactions are being promoted through this scheme by means of cash-back incentives up to an amount of Rs. 100 per month.



MGNREGS

Context

A total of ₹86,000 crore has been allocated for Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Scheme (MGNREGS) under the Union Budget which represents a ₹26,000 crore increase in the scheme from last year.



Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Scheme (MGNREGS)

- It was implemented by the Ministry of Rural Development in 2005.
- It is one of the biggest work guarantee programs globally.



Objectives

The main objective of the program is to provide

adult members of rural households who are willing to perform unskilled manual labor related to public work with **100 days** of employment guaranteed every fiscal year.

Recent data of MGNREGA as of 2023-24

There are **14.33** crores of active workers.
There are **269.16** crores person days generated.
There are **41.75** crores DBT transactions.
There are **5.66** crores households benefited.

Features of MGNREGA

- For working as a MGNREGA worker, a person must have completed **18** years of age.
- "Household" means the members of a family related to each other by blood, marriage or adoption and normally residing together and sharing meals or holding a common ration card.
- There is a minimum wage for MGNREGA workers, "minimum wage" means the wage fixed by the State Government under section 3 of the Minimum Wages Act, 1948 for agricultural laborers as applicable in that area.
- "Unskilled manual work" means any physical work which any adult person is capable of doing without any skill or special training.
- The disbursement of daily wages shall be made on a weekly basis or in any case not later than a fortnight after the date on which such work was done.
- Provided further that the wage rate specified from time to time under any such notification shall not be at a rate less than sixty rupees per day.
- If an applicant for employment under the Scheme is not provided such employment within fifteen days of receipt of his application seeking employment or from the date on which the employment has been sought in the case of an advance application, whichever is later, he shall be entitled to a daily unemployment allowance in accordance with section of Minimum Wages act.
- Women must make up at least one-third of the beneficiaries.



GEOGRAPHY

Delayed Snowfall in Kashmir

Context

Kashmir, a major winter tourist attraction, has remained without snowfall for a very extended period in this winter season.

Reasons for the delay

- Role of Western Disturbance: winter precipitation in Kashmir valley occurs mainly due to western disturbance. Generally during winter five to six western disturbance events happen every month. But this winter only two western disturbances happened.
- Role of El Nino: Several past years like 2022, 2018, and 2015 winter was relatively dry in Jammu and Kashmir and snowfall was also very low. Therefore Scientists observed that there might be a contribution of El Nino this winter.
- Rising sea surface temperatures: This has affected global weather patterns and is partly to blame for the decline in precipitation and snowfall in the Himalayan region.





Western Disturbances

Western Disturbances are a group of cyclonic storms that move nearly 9,000 kilometers from the Mediterranean Sea to northwest India, bringing rainfall to the areas.

El-Nino

- El Nino is a climate pattern that describes the unusual warming of surface waters in the eastern tropical Pacific Ocean.
- El Nino is the "warm phase" of a larger phenomenon called the El Nino–Southern Oscillation (ENSO).
- El Nino has an impact on ocean temperatures, the speed and strength of ocean currents, the health of coastal fisheries, and local weather from Australia to South America and beyond.
- El Nino events occur irregularly at two- to sevenyear intervals.

Lakshadweep

Context

During the Budget speech Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman laid special emphasis on Domestic tourism with special focus on Lakshadweep.

Focused Area

- Port connectivity and infrastructure development on islands, including Lakshadweep.
- Geographical inclusivity through the development of all regions of the country.

Key Points

- To achieve this aspiration, the government increased budget outlay from Rs 818 crore to 1412 crore in 2024-25 under Swadesh Darshan Scheme and also announced a framework for Rating iconic tourist destinations.
- To promote tourism, the Prime Minister also visited Lakshadweep and shared photos from there.
- G-20 meetings organized throughout India showcased diversity in heritage and focused on showcasing MICE (Meetings,Incentives,Conference and Exhibition) infrastructure to the world.




Lakshadweep

- It is a tropical archipelago comprising 36 atoll and coral reefs situated in Laccadive sea.
- Minicoy, Thundi Beach and Kadmat beaches are Blue flag certified beaches.
- · Largest island: Minicoy Island
- The **9 degree channel** separates Minicoy island from the main Lakshadweep archipelago and the

Red Sea Crisis

Context

The Red Sea crisis is leading to higher freight costs on certain routes and a doubling of transit time of vessels.


More about the news

- The average increase in the freight cost for trade from India to Europe and US across the sector including pharma automobile and textile has been around 40-50% in January 2024 as compared to September 2023.
- Since India buys goods from Europe on a CIF (Cost, Insurance, and Freight) basis therefore India is less affected than other countries.

What are the effects

- Pressures on cash flow (foreign currency) will increase borrowing, especially for sectors such as iron and steel, chemicals, and textiles.
- Major shipping lines have rerouted their vessels around the Cape of Good Hope, which has increased time and costs, impacting both exports and imports.
- The crisis will increase shiping vessels fuel consumption because they are majorly depends on crude oil.

• Disbalance of exports and imports will impact India's Balance of Payment (BOP).



What is Cost Insurance and freight (CIF)

- These are the fees a seller pays to cover the costs, insurance, and freight of a dealer's order when it's enroute.
- Rules for CIF is set by the International Chamber of Commerce.
- CIF is only applicable when goods are transported through waterways.

EL-Nino

Context

Experts are expecting that South India may see early, intense heat waves due to El Nino and global warming.

More about the news

- The Northern hemisphere including south India is facing heightened temperatures due to the EL-Nino and global warming.
- Daily maximum temperature in southern India is 4° to 8° celsius above normal.
- According to the India Meteorological Department the worst affected areas are in the western and central Maharashtra, Rayalaseema in Andhra Pradesh, and northern Karnataka.





What is EL-Nino

- El-Nino is an abnormal situation that describes the unusual warming of surface water in the eastern Pacific Ocean.
- During El Nino, trade winds get weakened therefore warm water is pushed back east, toward the west coast of America.
- Low-pressure condition is formed that lead to heavy precipitation across the coastline.
- It has an impact on ocean temperatures, the speed and strength of ocean currents, the health of coastal fisheries, and local weather from Australia to South America.
- This event occurs irregularly at a 2 to 7-year interval.

How does El Nino affect the Indian monsoon:

 The trade winds that blow across the Pacific decrease during El Niño years, making it harder for them to force moisture-laden winds into the Indian subcontinent. Consequently, the monsoon winds across the Arabian Sea and the Indian Ocean become weaker, which lowers the monsoon's overall strength.



- In India, the monsoon season might start later than expected due to El Niño events. In a similar vein, El Niño may cause the monsoon to depart early, reducing the length of the rainy season overall.
- This phenomenon leads to drought in India.

ENVIRONMENT

Olive Ridley turtles

Context

Wildlife experts expected that Ridley turtles are likely to lay eggs this year near the mouth of Rushikulya river in Odisha.

About Olive Ridley Turtles

 Named for their distinctive olive green shell, these turtles have the largest population among all sea turtle species.



- · Habitat: Tropical & subtropical waters (Pacific, Atlantic, Indian Oceans),
- · Scientific name: Lepidochelys Olivacea,
- · Weight: Between 75 to 110 pounds,
- · Length: 24 to 28 inches,
- Diet: Omnivorous (crabs, shrimp, fish, jellyfish, seaweed, algae),
- · Behavior: Synchronized nesting (arribadas),
- Reproduction: Maturity: 6-10 years, Eggs/clutch: up to 100, Hatching: 50-60 days.

Key Points

• The good condition of the coast and a favorable

climate are responsible for this trend.

- Near Rushikulya River millions of female Olive Ridley turtles rush for mass nesting.
- Last year around 637,000 turtles laid eggs on the coast of Odisha.
- Conservation efforts are crucial to protect these gentle giants, ensuring their nesting grounds remain undisturbed and their future secure.
- Despite their large numbers, they are in IUCN's "Vulnerable" list because their survival is dependent on a limited number of nesting sites, and disruption to even one location could significantly impact the entire population.

Gangetic Dolphin

Context

Recently, the Gangetic River dolphin was rescued by Forest officials in Odisha from the Jalaka River, and are planning to release it into the Budhabalalang River.

Key Points

 The dolphin species was last seen in Odisha on October 23, 2020, when a dead Gangetic dolphin



- was found in the Govari River, near the village Kaikula in Odisha's Kendrapada district.
- Before that, a carcass of a Gangetic dolphin was found in Bhitarkanika waters in 1978.
- The state forest department preserved its skeleton and displayed it in its animal museum.

About Gangetic Dolphin

- · Habitat: Freshwater Ganges & Brahmaputra river systems of India, Nepal, and Bangladesh.,
- · Appearance: Blind, long-snouted, greyish-brown, up to 8 ft long.,
- · Diet: Carnivorous (fish, shrimp) using echolocation.,
- Behavior: Solitary or small groups, mothers & calves stay together.,
- Reproduction: 1 calf every 2-3 years, gestation 9-11 months.,
- Threats: Endangered, facing habitat loss, pollution, bycatch.,
- · IUCN status: Critically Endangered,
- · CITES: Appendix 1,
- · Wildlife Protection Act, 1972: Schedule 1.
- The Ganga River dolphin (Platanista Gangetica) is one of the three obligate freshwater dolphins in the world and is distributed in the Ganges-Brahmaputra-Meghna and Sangu-Karnaphuli River

- System in India, Nepal and Bangladesh.
- They are an indicator of the freshwater ecosystem because they live in freshwater only.
- They are blind by birth and use Ultrasonic sound to hunt their prey.



Conservation Programme

- In 2009, Gangetic dolphins were declared the National Aquatic Animal of India.
- Project Gangetic Dolphins was launched on 15th August 2023 by Prime Minister Narendra Modi for the Conservation of Gangetic Dolphins.

A recent study points towards the destructive impacts of climate change on nesting sites of Albatrosses.

About Albatrosses

 The wandering Albatross (Diomedea exulans) is the world's largest flying bird.



- These birds live in oceans for the majority of their life span and only come to land for breeding purposes.
- · They reside mainly in the southern ocean.
- IUCN status: Vulnerable

Threats

- The nesting site of Albatrosses depends on coastal vegetation, elevation, etc, and these factors are being altered by climate change.
- They also face risks from longline fishing trawlers.

Golden Tiger

Context

Recently a Rare Golden tiger was photographed in the Kaziranga National Park.

About Golden Tiger

- · Also known as Golden Tabby Tiger.
- It is a colour variant of the Bengal tiger and not a different subspecies.
- Pale-golden color and red-brown stripes are its identity.

Golden tiger: Matter of concern

- Colour variation may be a result of excessive inbreeding aggravated by habitat destruction and lack of wildlife corridors.
- Expression of recessive genes is due to inbreeding in a fragmented population.

Kaziranga National Park

- Located in the Nagaon and Golaghat districts of Assam.
- This National park is also a UNESCO World Heritage Site, a Tiger Reserve (2006), and an Important Bird Area recognized by BirdLife International.
- This park is the habitat of two-thirds of the world's Indian Rhinoceroses.
- Many small rivers flow through this park including the Brahmaputra.
- · Some important species of this park are -Wild Water Buffalo, Swamp Deer, Elephants, and Tall Elephant Grass.

Laughing Gull

Context

Recently, Laughing Gull, a migratory bird from North America, has been seen for the first time in the country at the Chittari Estuary in the Kasaragod district in Kerela.

Key Information

- Laughing Gull is a migratory species predominantly seen in North America, the Caribbean, and Northern South America.
- It is a diurnal species mostly found in Coastal Areas and is rarely found inland.
- It is a medium-sized gull having a wingspan of 37– 47 inches and measures 15–17 inches in length.
- Eats almost everything including Garbage therefore they are also termed as scavengers.





Schemes for Restoration of Mangrove Forests

Context

Union Budget 2023-24 announced 'Mangrove Initiative for Shoreline Habitats & Tangible Incomes (MISHTI)' to promote and conserve mangroves as a unique, natural ecosystem having very high biological productivity and carbon sequestration potential, besides working as a bioshield.

More about the news

- The promotional measures are being taken through a Central Sector Scheme named "The Conservation and Management of Mangroves and Coral Reefs" that has been launched under the National Coastal Mission Programme of the Ministry of Environment, Forest & Climate Change.
- PM Modi also launched MISHTI, which is a significant step in providing nature-based solutions for mitigating the effects of cyclones and storm surges and our fight against the climate crisis.

What are Mangroves

Mangroves are tropical plants that are adapted to loose and wet soils, salt water, and being periodically submerged by tides. Such areas are characterized by high rainfall around 1000 to 3000 mm.

Worldwide status

- As per the Global Forest Resource Assessment 2020, a total of 113 countries have mangrove forests.
- Asia has a large mangrove area of around 5.55 million hectares.

Major threats to Mangroves

- Urbanization: Urban developments including the construction of buildings and roads leading to the rapid reduction of mangroves.
- **Agriculture:** 1.5 lakh hectares of Sundarbans have been destroyed in the last 100 years for agriculture.
- Sewage and industrial pollution: Mangroves serve as a dumping ground for solid waste from various sources like industrial wastewater and wastewater from Municipal corporations.
- Cyclones: Frequent cyclone damage slows the recovery of mangroves and changes the forest composition in comparison to other regions that don't witness many cyclones. The recent cyclone Amphan has destroyed 18.8% of the Sundarbans.

Nagoya Protocol

Context

Recently, Cameroon adopted the Nagoya Protocol to benefit from its rich biodiversity.

More about the news

- Cameroon in Central Africa is home to vast biological resources, which have long been exploited by foreign firms without fair and equitable benefits to the communities that own them
- Cameroon has ratified the Nagoya Protocol on Access and Benefit Sharing.
- In accordance with the Nagoya Protocol, Cameroon is working to preserve and exploit a variety of biological resources, including the Bush Mango.

About Nagoya Protocol

- It is related to the Access to Genetic Resources and Fair and Equitable Sharing of Benefits arising from their Utilization.
- The Nagoya Protocol on ABS was adopted on 29 October 2010 in Nagoya, Japan, and entered into force on 12 October 2014.

What does Nagoya protocol cover

- Genetic resources that are covered by the Conservation of Biodiversity (CBD)
- Benefits arising from their utilization.
- Also covers Traditional Knowledge (TK) associated with genetic resources covered by the CBD.



Significance

- With the implementation of the Nagoya Protocol, both genetic resource producers and users will benefit from increased legal clarity and transparency.
- Establish more predictable conditions for access to genetic resources.
- Helping to ensure benefit-sharing when genetic resources leaves the country providing the genetic resources.


GROW Initiative

Context

Recently, NITI Aayog launched the GROW initiative to transform India's wastelands through agroforestry.

GROW (Greening and Restoration of Wasteland with Agroforestry)

- It aims to boost effort in environmental conservation and sustainable land use across India.
- By using remote-sensing and geographic Information systems (GIS), the initiative offers a comprehensive state-wise and district-wise analysis and provides crucial insights to government departments and industries engaged in greening and restoration projects.



- The initiative uses remote-sensing and GIS techniques to evaluate the suitability of agroforestry practices across all districts of India.
- It introduced an Agroforestry Suitability Index

- (ASI) for national level utilizing and prioritizing thematic datasets.
- This initiative includes the "Greening and Restoration of Wasteland with Agroforestry (GROW)-Suitability Mapping" on 'Bhuvan portal', ensuring universal access to state and district-level data.
- It is estimated that agroforestry occupies approximately 28.42 million hectares, or 8.65% of India's total land area. This project is in line with the country's pledge to rebuild 26 million hectares of degraded land by 2030 and create a new carbon sink that can store 2.5 to 3 billion tonnes of CO₂ equivalent.

Black Necked Crane

Context

The Wildlife Institute of India in association with the Zoological Survey of India have been carrying out assessment of the Black-necked cranes.

Number of Black Necked Crane in India

As per the survey conducted by the Wildlife Institute of India in 2016-2017 in the **Ladakh** region, the population size of black necked cranes was around **66-69** individuals. In Arunachal Pradesh, a small population of approximately **11** individuals arrives during the winter months.



About Black Necked Crane

 Distribution- China, Vietnam, Bhutan, and India(Ladakh and Arunachal Pradesh).



- The main breeding ground of this species is the **Tibetan plateau.**
- Black-necked crane species are omnivorous.
- The male Black Necked Crane is slightly bigger than the female.

Conservation Status

IUCN Red List: Near Threatened Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972: Schedule I

CITES: Appendix I

- The male Black Necked crane is central to Buddhist mythology and culture.
- The Bird is revered by the strong community of Monpas (major Buddhist ethnic group of Arunachal pradesh) as an embodiment of the sixth Dalai Lama (Tsangyang Gyats).
- The Black-Necked Crane was adopted as the state bird of the Union Territory of Ladakh in 2021.

Clean water crisis due to Nitrogen pollution

Context

A recent study published by Nature Communications has highlighted that an additional 40 million square kilometers of river basin area and 3 billion more people may face water scarcity by 2050 compared to previous estimation, due to nitrogen pollution.

About Nitrogen Pollution

- When the amount of Nitrogen Compounds like ammonia and nitrous oxides become too abundant ,it leads to Nitrogen Pollution.
- Nitrogen pollution is also the byproduct of burning fossil fuels to meet growing demands in the agriculture, transport, industry, and energy sectors.
- Nitrous oxide (N₂O) is a greenhouse gas, 300 times more powerful than carbon dioxide and has been proven to deplete the ozone layer.

How rivers getting polluted by Nitrogen pollution

- Human wastes, agricultural practices such as fertilizer application which are added into the river water.
- Sewage is the dominant source of nitrogen pollution in rivers due to rapid urbanization.
- Inadequate wastewater treatment infrastructure is also a significant reason in the present time.

What are the effects

 It reduces the source of clean water by polluting rivers.



- Consumption of contaminated water raises the risk of infants developing methemoglobinemia, commonly referred to "blue baby syndrome".
- 3. High levels of nitrate in drinking water can also increase the risk of cancer in adults.

The American Horseshoe Crab

Context

Recently, Environmental groups petitioned the U.S. government seeking endangered species protection for the "American horseshoe crab" which is also a living fossil under threat from commercial harvests for baiting and biomedical uses as well as from habitat loss and climate change.

What are Living fossils?

Living fossils are the living animals or plant species that are almost identical to species known from the fossil record. Living Fossils have changed very little over a long period.



Example of Living Fossils

• Horseshoe Crab, Ginkgo biloba, Coelacanth, Komodo Dragon, Red Panda, Tuatara, Nautilus, Purple Frog, Platypus, Koala etc.

Horseshoe Crab

Key points


- · Horseshoe crabs are marine arthropods.
- They live in shallow coastal waters and lay their eggs mostly on the coastal beaches in late spring and summer.
- · There are Four species of Horseshoe crab
- 1.The American horseshoe crab (Limulus polyphemus)
- 2. The tri-spine horseshoe crab (Tachypleus tridentatus)
- 3. The coastal horseshoe crab (Tachypleus gigas)
- 4. The mangrove horseshoe crab (Carcinoscorpius rotundicauda)
- Odisha is the largest habitat of Horseshoe crabs in India.

Importance

- · Medicinal use
- Horseshoe crabs contain blue blood which is used to test vaccines, drugs and medical devices to ensure that they aren't contaminated with dangerous bacterial toxins.
- A special clotting agent limulus amebocyte lysate (LAL) is found in Horseshoe crab's blood which detects a contaminant called endotoxin.
- The large hard shell of Horseshoe crabs acts as a

microhabitat for many other species like sponges, mud crabs and snails.

- Threats:
- 1. Habitat destruction;
- 2. Overharvesting for use as food
- 3. Biomedical testing.
- Conservation Status
- It is placed under Schedule IV of the Wildlife Protection Act 1972.
- · IUCN Status:
- American horseshoe crab: Vulnerable.
- Tri-spine horseshoe crab: Endangered.

Distress Alert Device for Fishermen


Context

ISRO Chairman Shri S. Somanath recently launched an improvised Distress Alert Transmitter (DAT) developed by ISRO at INMCC Bangalore.

What is DAT

- It is an indigenous technology developed for fishermen to send emergency messages from the fishing boat.
- The previous system of **DAT** has been operational since 2010 and till now more than 20,000 **DATs** are being used.
- Recently ISRO has developed the improvised

DAT as Second Generation Distress Alert Device (DAT-SG).





DAT-SG

- It can send back an acknowledgment to the fishermen who activate the distress alert from the sea.
- It can give information about potential fishing zones.
- It can be connected to a mobile phone using Bluetooth and messages can be read in the native languages.
- It can receive messages from the control center that will help to send advance alert messages of bad weather, tsunamis, etc. to the fishermen.

Working principle

 In this technology, the messages are sent through a communication satellite and received at a central control station where the alert signals are decoded for the identity and the location of the fishing boat.

Malignant Melanoma

Context

Sara Ferguson the Duchess of York, has recently been diagnosed with malignant melanoma.

What is Malignant Melanoma

Melanoma is a **tumor** caused by the malignant transformation of **melanocytes**. Generally it occurs on the skin and also can appear in other locations for example in the **gastrointestinal tract and brain**.

Key information


- Melanocytes are derived from the neural crest.
- It is caused mainly due to prolonged exposure to the Sun.
- People above the age of 40 are more prone to this disease.

Way to Cure

- Latest approach to cure this disease, is recently developed drugs i.e Dabrafenib and Trametinib.
 They target the effected cells.
- Early-stage surgery can cure, but for around 20%

of patients, additional treatment is required.

 Radiotherapy i.e. chemotherapy treatments is also one of the popular way for its treatment.



Lab Grown Sea Fish

Context

Recently, the Central Marine Fisheries Research Institute (CMFRI) has come into a collaborative Research agreement with a private organization "Neat Meatt Biotech" under the PPP Model to develop Fish meat in the laboratory.

Objective

The objective is to advance the production of cultured marine fish meat, addressing the rising demand for seafood and phasing out the strain on wild resources.

Key Points

- The process of producing lab-grown or "cultivated" fish meat involves separating particular fish cells and cultivating them in a lab environment without the use of animal components.
- The cells are then combined with nutrients in machines called "Bioreactors" that create the ideal condition for the cell to multiply.
- The final product will have similar flavor, texture, and also nutritional qualities as the original.





Benefits of Lab Grown Fish meat

- It has the potential to solve issues related to the environment and food security.
- It provides a sustainable and secure future for seafood production in India.

Healing Touch Device

Context

AIIMS has developed wound-healing devices with a combination therapy of negative pressure and oxygen delivery which is cost-effective for the patients.

The advantage of this Innovation

- · It takes less time to heal wounds.
- It reduces the number of dressing changes of the patients.
- It has better outcomes and reduced wound size and also helps in the formation of new and healthy tissue.
- · No exudates on clothes.
- It reduces microbial infection due to local oxygen delivery.




Asteroid Bennu

Context

NASA recently announced that it had successfully removed two stuck fasteners that had collected samples in 2020 from the Asteroid Bennu.

Asteroid Bennu

 Bennu is a carbon-rich asteroid that is about onethird of a mile (half a kilometer) wide at its equator.



- It is a **4.6 billion** years old small, near-Earth asteroid that passes close to the Earth about every **six years**.
- It is categorized as "potentially hazardous" due to its one in 2700 chances of colliding with Earth by 2182.
- It was likely formed in the main asteroid belt between Mars and Jupiter.
- Its orbital distance from the Sun is about 168 million kilometers.
- NASA sent a mission named OSIRIS-REx to collect the asteroid sample and bring it back to Earth.

New mission

The spacecraft of the mission OSIRIS-REx after delivering samples to the Earth, began a new mission as OSIRIS-Apophis Explorer (OSIRIS-APEX) to encounter asteroid Apophis in 2029.

MQ-9B Drone

Context

Recently the US Department of State approved the sale of an MQ-9B SkyGuardian Drone to India in a deal worth \$4 Billion.

Key Points

 The Defence Acquisition Council (DAC) had accorded the Acceptance Of Necessities (AoN) for the procurement of 31 MQ-9B UAVs.



- Out of 31 drones, 15 will be acquired for the Indian Navy, 8 for the Indian Army, and 8 for the Indian Air Force.
- The deal also includes 170 AGM-114R Hellfire missiles;
 16 M36E9 Hellfire captive air training missiles;
 310 GBU-39B/B Laser small diameter bombs (SDB) and 8 GBU-39B/B LSDB guided test vehicles.



About MQ-9B UAV

- Made by General Atomics Aeronautical System, it can stay airborne for over 40 hours and can be used for both military and civilian purposes.
- It can provide continuous intelligence and surveillance over vast areas, even beyond visual range with a top speed of 300 mph.
- It can arm up to 8 AGM and 114 Hellfire missiles with an operational altitude of 25000 ft.

Autoimmune Disease in Women

Context

Scientists at Stanford University have found an explanation for a decade-old Biological mystery, why more women compared to men suffer from autoimmune diseases, like Lupus and Rheumatoid Arthritis.

What is Autoimmune Disease

- When the immune system of a person is overactive, it starts to attack and damage a Person's own Tissues.
- In the case of Autoimmune Disease, the immune system of the patient is unable to detect the

- difference between Invader cells and Healthy Cells.
- 78% of people with autoimmune disease are Women.

Cause of Disease

- **Certain Medication** Some drugs may cause changes in the body that confuse the immune system.
- Genetics-Some autoimmune diseases run in Families.
- Infections- Microorganisms like Viruses and bacteria could set off changes that make the immune system attack itself.

Unfolding Biological Mystery

- Human cells typically have 23 pairs of chromosomes.
 Males and Females have the same appearances for
 22 of these pairs, known as autosomes. But the
 23rd pair is different between Males and Females.
- Chromosome is a microscopic thread-like structure made of protein and is found in the nucleus of every cell of animals, humans and plants.
- Two (XX) chromosomes in females risk overproduction of protein that might become lethal for women. So nature provided a process called "X chromosome inactivation".
- X chromosome inactivation achieved by courtesy
 of a molecule called "Xist", a type of long encoded
 RNA (Inc RNA). Xist inactivates one of the X
 chromosomes , however scientists found that
 in this process Xist also generates molecular
 complexes linked to many autoimmune diseases.
- During the normal process of cell dying, cells spill open, dumping their molecules in the bloodstream.
- In females, this dumped material includes the Xist molecule and protein attached to it. When immune cells encounter the Xist molecules, it finds protein stuck to them.
- Due to this unusual biological process, immune cells get confused and start making antibodies against the Xist protein, which may start attacking other parts of the body as well. Due to this, females have more autoimmune disease.
- Menhaving the 23rd chromosome as XXY (Klinefelter syndrome) have a high risk of autoimmune disease.




INSAT-3DS MISSION

Context:

The Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) launched its meteorological and disaster warning satellite INSAT-3DS from Satish Dhawan Space Centre (SDSC) in Sriharikota.

About INSAT-3DS Mission

 This mission is fully funded by the Ministry of Earth Sciences (MoES).



- This satellite mission is the result of the collaborative efforts of ISRO and the Indian Meteorological Organisation (IMO).
- This satellite is the third in a series of INSAT 3D satellites. INSAT-3D was launched in 2013.

- INSAT-3DS was launched by using the Geosynchronous Launch Vehicle (GSLV-F14).
- GSLV-14 placed the satellite into the Geosynchronous Transfer Orbit (GTO). Subsequent orbit-raising maneuvers will ensure that the satellite is positioned in a Geo-stationary Orbit.

Objectives of the mission

- To monitor Earth's surface and carry out Oceanic observations.
- To provide Satellite Aided Search and Rescue services.
- To provide data regarding various meteorological parameters of the Atmosphere.

Vyommitra

Context:

Union Minister of State (Independent Charge) of Science and Technology and Space said that "The uncrewed Vyommitra" mission is scheduled for the third quarter of this year while a manned mission "Gaganyaan" is scheduled to be launched next year in 2025.

VyomMitra

- It is derived from two Sanskrit words 'Vyoma' which means **Space** and 'Mitra' which means **friend**.
- It is a female looking robot which was introduced at the "Human Spaceflight and Exploration – Present Challenges and Future Trends" event in 2020.
- This robot was created for the unmanned Gaganyaan mission.
- It is also known as a 'half-humanoid robot' because of no legs attached to it.

Robot was designed by

- The ISRO Inertial Systems Unit (IISU) has designed, developed, and integrated the robot.
- Its fingers were built by Vikram Sarabhai Space Centre (VSSC).

Objective

 The Al-enabled robot is designed to ride a rocket and survive the stress and the vibration felt by astronauts in the flight.



Mission of the Robot

- Its mission is to perform a specific task to analyze how astronauts behave.
- She will answer in two languages and mimic every move that astronauts have to make.
- It will alert and carry out life support procedures, operating switch panels, and other human actions in space throughout the flight.

Gaganyaan Mission

- It was launched by the Prime Minister on Independence Day, 2019.
- Its objective is to send 3 astronauts into space for a 3 day mission.
- It will send the 3-member crew into a 400-kilometer orbit and then safely land them in Indian Sea waters.
- It involves the creation of many essential technologies, including emergency escape supplies, a system that mimics Earth's life support systems, and human-rated launch vehicles for the safe transportation of people into space.

Current Status of Railway Kavach

Context

As per recently released status report Kavach have so far been deployed on 1465 Route kms and 139 locomotives on South Central Railways.


About the Kavach system

- The KAVACH is an indigenously developed Automatic Train Protection (ATP) system developed by Research Design and Standards Organisation(RDSO).
- Modern electronics with Safety Integrity Level-4 (SIL-4) certifications are used in it.
- It avoids collisions between two locomotives by prohibiting trains from crossing red signals.

How does it work

- Using Radio Frequency Identification (RFID) tags facilitates two-way communication for any emergency messages between the loco-pilot and station master.
- The instrument panel within the cabin assists the loco-pilot in anticipating the signal without

- needing to visually see it resulting in maintaining constant speed.
- If a red signal is jumped and two trains come face to face on the same line, the technology automatically takes over and applies sudden brakes.

More about news


 In Bihar, 26 districts come under the Red Zone in providing Iron tablets to girls.



- Only 8.4% of children (up to age 5 years) in Bihar received Iron tablets.
- Sitamarhi district topped the list with 68.8% of children receiving iron tablets in school while Muzaffarpur is at the bottom among all districts of Bihar.
- In Muzaffarpur only 0.1% of government school students received the Iron tablets.

Anaemia Mukt Bharat Abhiyan

- Anaemia Mukt Bharat is an Intensified Iron Plus initiative aims to reduce anemia in vulnerable age groups of women, children, and adolescents.
- It was launched in 2018, under POSHAN Abhiyan.
- The Ministry of Health and Family Welfare took the initiative.
- It is mainly designed to reduce the prevalence of Anemia by 3% points per year between 2018 and 2022.
- This scheme is implemented through "6x6x6 strategy":



- 4. 6 target beneficiaries
- 5. 6 interventions
- 6. 6 institutional mechanisms.

CAR-T Cell

Context

Indigenous CAR-T cell therapy is now available for commercial use and the first patient(Dr. VK Gupta) has been declared free of cancer.


What is CAR-T Cell

A course of treatment wherein a patient's T cells are modified in a lab to combat cancer cells.

 The indigenous CAR-T cell therapy has been developed by IIT Bombay in association with Tata memorial hospital.

Method

- After isolating T cells from a patient's blood, the patient's cancer cells' gene encoding a unique receptor that binds to a specific protein is introduced to the T cells in a lab.
- A chimeric antigen receptor (CAR) is the name given to this unique receptor. Large quantities of CART cells are generated in a lab and infused into the patient.



High Altitude Pseudo Satellite (HAPS) vehicles

Context

Recently, the first flight test of a High Altitude Pseudo Satellite vehicle prototype was conducted by the National Aerospace Laboratories (NAL) in Bengaluru (Test carried out in the Challakere testing range in Karnataka).


High Altitude Pseudo satellite

- HAPS is a solar-powered "pseudo satellite".
- It is a new unmanned aerial vehicle (UAV).
- It can fly at an altitude of 18-20 km from the ground.
- It has the ability to generate solar power and can remain in the air for more than a month.
- The cost of operating HAPS is very low as compared



to Satellites that are usually placed at least **200 km** from the earth because it does not require a rocket to get into space.

 It is a 23-kg prototype with a wing-span of about 12 meters.



Benefits of HAPS

- It can significantly increase India's surveillance and monitoring capabilities in border areas.
- It can be used to provide mobile communication networks in remote areas.
- HAPS can be very useful during disaster situations.

Kyasanur Forest Disease

Context

A viral outbreak of the Kyasanur Forest Disease (KFD), a tick-borne hemorrhagic fever, is rising in Karnataka.

About the Disease

 The disease is caused by Kyasanur Forest disease virus (KFDV).

Transmission Transmission to humans may occur after a tick bite or contact with an infected animal	Diagnosis Diagnosis can be made in the early stage of illness by molecular detection by PCR
Signs and Symptoms Symptoms of KFD may appear suddenly 3-8 days after exposure	Treatment Hospitalization and supportive therapy is important for treating KFD
Risk of Exposure KFD has historically been limited to the western and central districts of Karnataka State, India	Prevention A vaccine does exist for KFD and is used in endemic areas of India

- KFDV is a member of the virus family Flaviviridae.
- KFDV was identified in 1957 when it was isolated from a sick monkey from the Kyasanur Forest in Karnataka.
- Rodents, shrews, and monkeys are common hosts for KFDV after bitten by tick-borne encephalitis
- The disease is highly fatal for humans.

Smart Gram Panchayat Project

Context

Union Minister Shri Giriraj Singh launched the pilot project 'Smart Gram Panchayat: Revolution Towards Digitization of Gram Panchayat' in all Panchayats of Begusarai District of Bihar.

Objective

To Digitize Gram Panchayat, Enhancing Connectivity and bridging the Rural-Urban divide.



Key Points

- The project aims to extend PM-WANI (Prime Minister WI-FI Access Network Interface) service in all Gram Panchayats across Begusarai District of Bihar.
- The Project is funded under the revamped Rashtriya Gram Swaraj Abhiyan (RGSA) and is implemented by the Ministry of Panchayati Raj(MoPR).
- Begusarai has become the first District in Bihar to equip all Gram Panchayats with WI-FI service under PM-WANI Scheme.



Beneficiaries

About the PM-WANI scheme

- PM-WANI stands for Prime Minister WI-FI Access Network Interface.
- Launched by the Department of Technology (DoT) in 2020.
- It consists of elements such as Public Data Office (PDO), Public Data Office Aggregator (PDOA), App Provider and Central Registry.
- The set target by the central government was to set up 10 million Wi-Fi hotspots across the country by 2022
- To facilitate ease of doing business and encourage local shops and small establishments to become Wi-Fi providers.
- Users can choose internet packages/coupons from the portal.



- Public Data Office (PDO): It will establish, maintain, and operate only WANI compliant Wi-Fi Access Points and deliver broadband services to subscribers.
- Public Data Office Aggregator (PDOA): It will be an aggregator of PDOs and perform the functions relating to Authorization and Accounting.
- App Provider: It will develop an App to register users and discover WANI compliant Wi-Fi hotspots in the nearby area and display the same within the App for accessing the internet service.
- Central Registry: It will maintain, in accordance with the WANI architecture and specifications, the details of App Providers, PDOAs, and PDOs.

About Rashtriya Gram Swaraj Abhiyan

- The 'RGSA' Scheme was launched by the Ministry of Panchayati Raj in 2018.
- Later it was revamped and the centrally sponsored scheme of RGSA was approved for implementation from 2022-23 to 2025-26.
- The objective of this scheme was to develop and strengthen the Panchayati Raj System across India in rural areas.


Mass Drug Administrative Campaign

Context

On 10th February 2024, a statewide drug distribution campaign was started to eliminate Lymphatic Filariasis disease (commonly called as elephantiasis).

More about news

- The campaign was started in **24** districts of Bihar and targeted to give medicine to 6 crore people.
- This distribution campaign is scheduled for 17 days in the state.



- Under this campaign, A Medicine named Albendazole tablet will be given to the people. (patient should not take tablet in an empty stomach)
- In 2023, the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare launched a nationwide Sarva Dawa Sevan or Mass drug Administration Campaign to eliminate this disease.
- Aim: To eliminate Lymphatic Filariasis by 2027, 3 years ahead of Global target.
- Mainly 92 districts of11 states which have relatively more cases of filariasis disease (Andhra



Pradesh, Kerala, Odisha, Madhya Pradesh, UP, West Bengal, Bihar, Gujrat, Chhattisgarh, Karnataka, Jharkhand) are the focused area of this campaign.

Lymphatic Disease

- Lymphatic filariasis is caused by infection with parasites classified as nematodes (roundworms) of the family Filarioidea. There are 3 types of these thread-like filarial worms:
- 5. **Wuchereria bancrofti**, which is responsible for 90% of the cases.
- 6. **Brugia malayi**, which causes most of the remainder of the cases
- 7. **Brugia timori**, which also causes the disease.
- Symptoms: Filariasis usually leads to a weakened immunesystem. Italsoleadstolymphoedema (tissue swelling) or elephantiasis (skin/tissue thickening) of limbs and hydrocele (scrotal swelling). Involvement of breasts and genital organs is common. Some people may experience Inflammation (an overactivated immune system)

SWATI Portal

Context

Recently, A single online portal representing Indian women and girls in STEMM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Mathematics, and Medicine) was created with the launch of the "SWATI (Science for Women-A Technology & Innovation)" Portal in New Delhi.

SWATI (Science for Women-A Technology & Innovation)

- The Indian National Science Academy (INSA), in New Delhi, launched the portal on International Day of Women and Girls in Science.
- The Portal is a complete interactive database which is developed and maintained by the National Institute of Plant Genome Research (NIPGR), New Delhi.
- This is the initiative of Inter Academy Panel (IAP) on Women in Science, Technology, Engineering, Mathematics & Medicine (STEMM).



Objectives

- To include each and every Indian woman in science, across all career stages and subjects.
- Long term research on the issues of equality, diversity and inclusivity in India.
- To support and unite all progress of science in the young female scientists, academics, researchers, and young start-ups from India and overseas under one roof.

Benefits

- It will serve in policy making to address the challenges of **Gender-gap**.
- Provide an opportunity to discuss and evolve a roadmap for 'Women in Science' & 'Science for Women'.

Tear Gas

Context:

Recently, Haryana Police deployed drones to drop tear gas shells on the protesting farmers.

About Tear Gas

- Tear gas (Lacrimator) is a group of substances that stimulate the nerves of the lacrimal gland in the eye that produces tears.
- It also causes severe eye and respiratory pain, skin irritation, bleeding, and blindness.
- Generally, the effect of tear gas is temporary and reversible.
- They are aerosolized liquids or solids that are dispersed in the air through the use of sprays, fog generators, grenades or shells.
- Tear Gas was extensively used in World War I.



Use of Tear Gas

 It is used to disperse crowd during protests and to control riots.

Protection Against Tear Gas

 Gas masks fitted with activated charcoal filters provide protection against Tear Gas.

Substances used in the Tear Gas

• Tear gas is made up of synthetic organic halogen

Important components of Tear Gas

1-chloroacetophenone - It chiefly affects the eyes. O-chlorobenzylidene malononitril- Burning sensations in the respiratory tract and involuntary closing of the eyes are caused by it.

compounds such as bromoacetone, ethyl bromoacetate, xylyl bromide, benzyl bromide and α -bromobenzyl cyanide.

 Oleoresin Capsicum (pepper spray) is also used in Tear Gas.

ART & CULTURE

Jain Sculpture of 11th Century

Context

Three Jain sculptures dated around the 11th century CE were discovered in Varuna village in the Mysuru district of Karnataka.

Jain Sculpture

- Jain sculptures were primarily notable for their magnificence which can be seen in the beautiful images of Jain Tirthankaras.
- Pillared chambers, inner sanctums, domes, and pointed towers are common elements of Jain temple architecture.



- Images of Jain Tirthankara are mostly those of Lord Parshvanatha, Rishabh Dev, or Vardhaman.
- The highest ideal of Jainism is the wandering and dispassionate ascetic, which is why Jains are always portrayed as yogis.
- They are depicted in only two positions: either

seated in the Lotus Position (Padmasana) or standing exclusively in the Jain posture of renunciation of the body (Kayotsarga).

Jainism

- Jainism also known as Jain Dharma, traces its spiritual ideas and history through the succession of twenty-four Tirthankaras (supreme preachers of Dharma), the first being Rishabhadeva, whom the tradition holds to have lived millions of years ago.
- It believes that the universe regulates itself, with souls evolving through karma.
- Three Pillars
- Ahimsa (Non-Violence): Reverence for all life, from the smallest insect to humans.
- Anekantavada (Multiple Perspectives): Truth is multifaceted, no single view holds absolute truth.
- 3. **Aparigraha (Non-Attachment):** Minimizing possessions and desires for inner freedom.
- **Spiritual Guides:** 24 Tirthankaras, with Mahavira (6th century BCE) being the last.
- Followers: Both monks and lay people strive for liberation through ethical living and self-discipline.
- **Practices:** Vegetarianism, fasting, meditation, minimal clothing for monks.
- Impact: Inspired vegetarianism, animal welfare movements, and philosophies of non-violence.

Shri Ram Temple, Ayodhya

Context

The 'Pran Pratistha' ceremony took place on the 22nd of January.

About Pran Prathista

Pran Pratistha is the act through which an idol transforms into a deity and giving the capacity to accept Prayers and Boons. For "Pran Prathistha" the following rituals are to be followed:



- Multiple adhivaas: Idol is submerged in various materials for healing and quality check.
- Jalādhivās: Submerged in water for one night.
- Dhānyādhivās: Submerging in grain.
- Ritual bath: Cleanses the idol.
- Abhishek: Performed with various materials based on ceremony scale. Can involve 108 items like panchamrit, fragrant water, cow horn water, and sugarcane juice.
- · Awakening the Statue
 - · Mantras: Chants invoke different deities to

animate specific body parts (e.g., Surya for eyes, Vayu for ears).

· Eye-opening ceremony

 Anjan: Kohl-like substance applied around eyes with a gold needle. The process is performed from behind as looking into the eye can be too much to take because of its brilliance.

Features of Ram Temple

Architectural Style

- Māru-Gurjara type of the Nagara style (prevalent in North India).
- Characterized by intricate carvings, towering Shikharas (spires), and ornate decorations.

Dimensions and Layout

• **360 ft** long, **235 ft** wide, **161 ft** high, spanning 4.0 hectares (10 acres).

Three storeyed

- Ground floor houses the revered idol of Ram Lalla.
- First floor features the "Ram Darbar," a complex with 05 halls: Nritya Mandap (dance hall), Rang Mandap (stage hall), Sabha Mandap (assembly hall), Prarthana Mandap (prayer hall), and Kirtan Mandap (chanting hall).
- The second floor's purpose is yet to be finalized.
- The remaining 23 hectares (57 acres) form a complex with a prayer hall, lecture hall, educational facilities, museum, cafeteria, and more.

Key Elements

- Five intricately carved mandapas (halls) between the sanctum sanctorum and entrance, each topped with a shikhara.
- Unique octagonal sanctum sanctorum (Garbhagriha) inspired by scriptures related to Lord Vishnu.
- 366 meticulously carved columns, each adorned with 16 idols depicting divine figures like the incarnations of Shiva, Dashavataras, Chausath Yoginis, and Saraswati.
- Five elegant domes and a majestic central tower adorning the rooftop.



- Special design allows natural sunlight to illuminate the inner sanctum, highlighting the idol of Ram Lalla.
- Advanced 3D analysis ensures structural stability for over 2,500 years.
- Design incorporates various Hindu mythological references and motifs, symbolizing piety and devotion.


Rajon Ki Baoli

Context

Mehrauli Archeological Park is the storehouse of monuments each narrating part of Delhi's history of the last thousand years. Rajon ki Baoli is one among them.

About Rajon Ki Baoli

 It is a complex that includes a Stepwell and a mosque with Chhatri (dome-shaped pavilion), situated 400 meters south of Adham Khan Tomb.



- It was made to serve the needs of **Mason** i.e. Raj Mistri.
- It was built in 1516 by Daulat Khan, Governor of Punjab during the Ibrahim Lodi Era.

- Out of the 66 steps, only 41 steps and 3 storeys are visible due to it being partially filled.
- The design of the Rajon ki Baoli represents the footprint of Indo-Islamic design.

390 years old Deepastastambham (lamp post)

Context

Recently, Telangana's trading ties were unravelled by a 390-years-old lamp post in Nalgonda district which was dedicated to **Kasi Viswanatha**.

About the lamp post

 Archaeologists Ashok Kumar and Srinivasan found this lamp post in Mudimanikyam village near Krishna river in Nalgonda district, Telangana.



- It is likely to have served as a lighthouse on the riverine trade route which is dedicated to Kasi Vishwanath.
- Inscription on the lamp post is written in a combination of Tamil and Telugu languages and is dated to 1635 C.E.
- This pillar is **20 feet** tall and has hollows for lamps.


Recently India's External Affairs Minister Dr. S. Jayshankar met with Iran's President.



 The IMEC Project was signed at the G20 Summit in New Delhi.





Kaladan multimodal project


Context


Kaladan Multi-Modal Transit Transport Project (KMTTP)

• The project's goal is to establish connectivity by

- land, sea, and road between India and Myanmar. Specifically, it will connect India's eastern seaports to Sittwe Port in Myanmar which will create an alternate access route to the Northeastern states of India.
- The project consists of a 158-kilometer waterway from Sittwe to Paletwa in Myanmar along the Kaladan River and a 109-kilometer road from Paletwa to Zorinpui on the border between India and Myanmar in Mizoram.



Components of KMTTP



Benefits for India

- This project will save time and money and will increase efficiency for the trade and commerce for India, compared to the existing route via Siliguri to Kolkata.
- Cost of transportation of goods from Kolkata to Aizawl saw a drop of more than 50%.
- Using marine transportation will significantly



reduce transportation's **environmental cost** due to a decrease in carbon emissions from fossil fuels, in addition to reducing traffic on the roads.

Indian Ocean Conference

Context


Recently, India has launched its UPI along with Rupay service in Mauritius and Sri Lanka.





ASER Report

Context:

Recently, **the** Annual Survey of Education Report (ASER) was released which showed that most of the youth aged between **14 to 18 years** are not able to solve basic standard math.

Key findings of the Report:

- The Report highlighted a huge skill deficit among adolescents.
- Overall, 86.8% of 14-18-year-olds are enrolled in an educational institution.
- In Std XI or higher, Arts/Humanities stream has the highest enrollment rate (55.7%), followed by STEM (31.7%) and Commerce (9.4%).
- Compared to males (36.3%), females are less likely than males to be enrolled in the STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics) stream (28.1%).
- The percentage of youth not enrolled is 3.9% for 14-year-old youth and is 32.6% for 18-year-olds.
- A higher percentage of males (40.3%) than females (28%) report doing work other than household work.

What is ASER:

It was established by the Pratham Education Foundation in 2005. The survey is conducted every alternate year to collect data on the enrolment status of children in the age group of 3-16 years, and basic reading and arithmetic levels of children in the age group of 5-16 years.

Wings India 2024

Context:

In the recently conducted "Wings India 2024" conference in **Hyderabad**, Civil Aviation Minister has stated that India's domestic air passenger traffic is expected to touch 300 million by 2030, an almost two-third rise from 153 million in 2023.



- It was handed over to the Indian Navy on December
 4, 2023.

Role of INS Sandhayak

- Primary role:- The ship's job is to conduct comprehensive hydrographic surveys of harbors, ports, and navigational routes.
- **Secondary role**:- The vessel will be equipped to perform a variety of naval tasks.



Features of the INS Sandhayak

- The ship is 110 meters long and 16 meters wide, with a displacement capacity of 3,400 tons.
- It has state-of-the-art hydrographic equipment, including side scan SONARs, autonomous underwater vehicles, satellite-based positioning systems, multibeam echosounders for deep and shallow water, and terrestrial survey equipment.
- With two diesel engines generating propulsion, the ship can reach speeds of more than **eighteen knots**.
- The product showcases the joint efforts of the Indian Navy and industry, particularly MSMEs, with over 80% of its cost being indigenous.
- The Indian Navy's Warship Design Bureau has been in charge of the project.

25T BOLLARD PULL TUG, MAHABALI



This year the award is also conferred to **Karpuri Thakur and Lal Krishna Advani**.

Chaudhary Charan Singh

- Chaudhary Charan Singh (23 December 1902 29
 May 1987) was an Indian politician and a freedom
 fighter. He served as the 5th Prime Minister of
 India and 5th Chief Minister of Uttar Pradesh.
- He was born at Noorpur in Meerut district of Uttar Pradesh.
- He was first elected to the Uttar Pradesh Legislative Assembly in 1937 from Chhaprauli.
- His role is important in the eradication of the Zamindari system in Uttar Pradesh. The Uttar Pradesh Zamindari and Land Reform Act, 1952 was the result of his untiring efforts which resulted in the abolition of the system throughout the state.
- He became the first non-Congress Chief Minister of Uttar Pradesh on April 3, 1967.
- He became the CM of the state for the second time in February, 1970.
- Chaudhary Charan Singh was elected to the Lok Sabha in 1977. He became the Union Home Minister and was subsequently elevated to the post of deputy Prime Minister. He became the Union Finance Minister in January 1979.
- He became the Prime Minister of India after the resignation of Morarji Desai in July 1979.
- He was Prime Minister only for 23 days.

- He was the 11th Chief Minister of Bihar, serving two terms- First term(December 1970 to June 1971), Second term(June 1977 to April 1979).

- The recipients receive a Sanad (certificate) signed by the President and a peepal leaf-shaped medallion.
- There is **no monetary grant** associated with this Award.

- The Award has been bestowed upon a total of 53 individuals, including 18 who were awarded posthumously.
- The Bharat Ratna was briefly suspended from July 1977 to January 1980 and for a second time from August 1992 to December 1995.

Bihar during Medieval Era

The Medieval history of Bihar starts from the 8th Century itself with the rise of Pala dynasty in the region of Bengal and Bihar. But, the real start of Medieval history of Bihar is considered with the invasion of the Turkish invader "Bakhtiyar Khalji" in the late 12th Century and the early 13th Century.

Turkish invasion under Bakhtiyar Khalji

- The first Turkish invasion in Bihar was done by Ibn Bakhtiyar Khalji.
- He was credited with the establishment of Turkish power in Bihar.
- His most important victory was the victory at **Odantapuri in 1198.**
- Bakhtiyar Khalji destroyed the Nalanda University and established the city of Bakhtiyarpur.
- He was killed by his officer Alimardan and buried at Imadpur locality of Bihar Sharif.
- · Nickname- Ghazi Ikhtiyar.



Important Dynasties, Who Ruled Bihar

(1) Slave Dynasty

 Iltutmish was the first Sultan to bring Bihar under Delhi Sultanate.

- During the rule of Iltutmish, **Malik Jani** was appointed as the first governor of Bihar.
- Iltutmish's son Nasiruddin Mahmud organized Awadh, Bihar and Lakhnauti as a single administrative unit and ruled from 1227 AD to 1229 AD.
- During the reign of Balban, Gaya region of Bihar was under Delhi, which is mentioned in Gaya Prashasti of king Vanraj of Gaya.
- Tughril Khan, the ruler of Lakhnauti, accepted the suzerainty of Balban but later on he rebelled in 1279AD.

(2) Khilji Dynasty

- In 1297 Alauddin Khilji sent Sheikh Mohammad Ismail to Darbhanga but, he was defeated by Raja Shukra.
- Some coins during the time of the Khilji dynasty have been found from **Shahpur** (**Bhojpur**).

(3) Tughlaq Dynasty

- Bihar Sharif was the capital of Bihar during the Tughlaq period.
- **Muhammad bin Tughlaq** merged Bihar with Delhi Sultanate after detaching from Bengal.
- Ghiyasuddin Tughlaq established a mint-town at Tirhut sometimes called Tughlaqabad.
- A fort and a Jama Masjid were built in Darbhanga during the time of Mohammad bin Tughlag.
- Muhammad Bin Tughlaq changed the name of Darbhanga to Tughlaqpur.

(4) Afghan Rule in Bihar:


- Sher Shah was born in 1472 AD.
- His Ancestors initially lived in Afghanistan. So, His rule is considered as Afghan rule.
- Farid Khan (Childhood name of Sher Shah) was the son of Hasan Khan Sur, Jagirdar of Sasaram in Bihar.
- He got the title of 'Sher khan' by Mohammad Bahar Khan Nuhani.

Sher Shah's Tomb

- The construction of this tomb was started by Sher Shah but It was completed by his son Islam Shah.
- The tomb was designed by Mir Muhammad Aliwal Khan.
- The tomb is made up of red sandstone in octagonal shape.
- · Location- Sasaram, Rohtas District.



Contributions of Sher Shah

- He introduced **'Sarkar'**(Districts) first time in the history.
- Introduction of **Zabit System**, made by Todar Mal.
- Introduction of silver coin or Rupai of 178 grain and copper coin 380 grain.
- · He also started the practice of Patta and Kabuliyat.
- He constructed Sadak-e-Azam and Badshahi Sadak, which was later on known as Grand Trunk Road.

(5) Bihar Under Mughal

Rulers	Events
Humayun (AD. 1530-1540 & 1555-56)	·In 1532, Humayun attacked Chunar Fort for the first time. The end of power of Nuhanis in Bihar began when humayun defeated the Afghans at Dohra sarai in 1532 AD.
Akbar (AD.1556 -1605)	 After battle of Rajmahal (12 March, 1576), fought between Mughal forces and Dawood Khan, Akbar made Bihar a separate subah of his empire. In 1587 Man Singh was appointed as governor of Bihar, He administered excellently and crushed all rebellions. Man Singh made Rohtas his capital. Asif khan was appointed as last governor of Bihar during the reign of Akbar.
Jahangir (AD.1605- 1627)	 Bihar was mainly affected by the rebellion of Jahangir (Salim) in the last year of Akbar's reign. He made a grant of Madad-i-mash land to descendent of the famous Pir Damaria's family. During the reign of Jahangir, Mehrunisa also known as Nur Jahan (wife of Jahangir) passed through Darbhanga where she constructed Noor Sarai and a Mosque. In AD. 1621 Jahangir appointed his son prince Parvez as Governor of Bihar. Parvez was the first Mughal prince to rule Bihar, established a city Parvezabad, now known as Paleza. Nazar Bahadur (officer of Parvez) constructed the famous Sangi Masjid, now known as Patthar ki Masjid in Patna.

KNOW YOUR BIHAR

Shah Jahan (AD.1627-1658)

- Shah Jaha (Prince Khurram) revolted and turned his attention towards Patna, when Parvez was the governor of Bihar.
- Saif Khan, appointed as the governor of Bihar by Shah Jahan was discussed by Peter Mundy as the best governor of Bihar under Mughal.
- Shahi Idgah in Patna city was built by Saif Khan.

Aurangzeb (AD. 1658-1707)

- The **first** governor of Bihar during the reign of Aurangzeb was **Daud Khan Quraishi**.
- Daud khan founded the city of **Daud Nagar** in the Gaya district.
- European travellers **Tavernier** and **Bernier** visited Patna during the reign of **Jan Nishar Khan** (Governor) in the rule of Aurangzeb.
- Aurangzeb appointed his favourite grandson Azim-Us-Shan as the governor of Bihar. He renamed Patna as Azimabad after his name.

Farrukhsiyar (AD. 1713-1719)

- Farrukhsiyar came back to Bihar from Bengal in 1711 AD.
- · He was born in Patna.
- He was the **first** Mughal ruler who was coronated in **Patna** in 1713 AD.

Sikhs in Bihar

- The relation of Sikhism has been very old in Bihar.
- Guru Nanak Dev had visited Gaya, Rajgir, Patna, Munger, Bhagalpur, Kahalgaon for propagating Sikhism.



- Guru Teg Bahadur, on his way to Assam, on a peace mission, had left his wife at Patna where she gave birth to Shri Guru Govind Singh.
- Shri Guru Govind Singh, the tenth and the last of the Sikh Guru, was born at Patna in 1666.
- · Guru Govind Singh announced the
- establishment of Khalsa on 1st of Baisakh 1699.
- A Gurudwara was constructed by the name of "TakhtShri Harmandir jee" at Patna Sahib, the birth place of Guru Govind Singh.
- The Gurudwara is the second most important religious place of Sikhs after Golden Temple, Amritsar.

Rule of Pala and Sena dynasty in Bihar

- 1. The Pala Dynasty
- After the invasion of Magadha and Gauda by Yashovarman of Kannauj, a period of anarchy arose in the state. This anarchy was too much to be borne with patience for long. The people elected Gopala as their king. He founded Pala dynasty. He was followed by many important rulers like Dharmapala, Devapala, Vigrahapala, Narayanapala etc.

Important Rulers	Their works		
Gopala	 Founded the Pala Dynasty in 750 AD. He not only ended the political anarchy in Bengal but also extended Pala dominion in Magadha. He was a Buddhist and founder of Odantapura Vihara of Bihar sharif. Gopala was succeeded by his son Dharampala. He made every attempt for the sovereignty of whole north India and for the possession of Kannauj. He is referred as Uttarapathaswami by a Gujarati writer. The Munger copper plate inscription of Devapala informs that Dharampala had left to his successor a kingdom free from the troubles. He was the first Pala king who assumed full imperial Titles of Maharajadhiraja, Parameswara and Paramabhattaraka. He built Vikramashila Mahavihara in Antichak village of Bhagalpur. He also built Sonapura Vihara in North Bengal. An image of four faced Mahadeva was installed in Bodh Gaya during his reign. 		
Dharam pala			
Devapala	 Dharampala was succeeded by his son Devapala. He conquered Utkala (Orissa) and Pragjyotisha (Kamrupa, Assam). The inscriptions of Devapala have been found in Ghosrawan, Hilsa, Nalanda and Munger. He established friendly and cultural relations with Balaputradeva, the king of Suvarnadvipa On the request of Balaputradeva, Devapala granted five villages for the maintenance of monastery built by Balaputradeva. 		



2. The Sena Dynasty

- The Palas were succeeded by **Sena** dynasty who ruled in **Bengal** and **Bihar**.
- The Dynasty was founded by **Sumantsena** described as **Brahmakshatriya**.
- · Sumantsena was succeeded by his son Hemantsena.
- The invasion of Bakhtiyar khalji took place during the reign of Lakshmansena.

Local Ruling Dynasties of Bihar

Karnata Dynasty

- The Karnata dynasty in Mithila was founded in 1097 AD. with its Capital at Simraon in Champaran.
- The founder of this Dynasty was Nanyadeva.
- · He is also known as **Karnatakshatriya** and **Karnatakulbhushana** in Mithila tradition.
- At the time of foundation of this dynasty, Rampala was the ruler of Pala dynasty.
- Bakhtiyar Khalji passed with his army through Tirhut during the reign of Narsimhadeva.
- Harisimhadeva was the last great ruler of Karnata dynasty.
- After the defeat at the hand of Ghiyasuddin Tughlaq, Harisimha entered Nepal where he introduced the worship of a goddess Taleju.
- The area of Nepal was also under Karnata Dynasty.

Chero Dynasty

After the decline of the Pala Dynasty, tribal states emerged in Bihar, in which the Chero dynasty was the most prominent.

• This powerful kingdom was founded by the ruler Chero Raj in the districts of Shahabad, Saran,

Champaran, Muzaffarpur and Palamu.

- · Chero of Shahabad were divided in to **four** kingdoms.
- 1. **Ghughuliya kingdom-** ruled by **Ghughuliya** with its capital at **Bihiya**.
- 2. **Bhojpur-** ruled by **Sitam Rai** with its capital at **Tiravana.**
- 3. **Chainpur**-ruled by **Salabahim** with its headquarter at Chainpur (**Kaimur**).
- 4. Sasaram- Ruled by Phoolchand with its headquarter at Dev Markandeya.
- Phoolchand is credited with starting of **Jagdishpur fair**.
- The greatest kings among the Chero rulers were Medini Rai, followed by his son Pratap Rai.
- During the Reign of Pratap Rai, Three Mughal invasions took place and finally in 1660 AD., Chero was merged in to the Mughal empire.

Ujjaini Dynasty of Bhojpur

- Unable to face the challenge of Muslim power the Rajput king of Dhar, **Bhojraj** along with his son **Devraj** and other Rajput followers moved to **Shahabad** and **Palamu** and took shelter under the Chero King **Raja Mukund**.
- Originally, they were from Ujjain so they were called Ujjaini Rajput.
- Chero King Mukund was succeeded by Sahasbal. Sahabal killed Bhojraj. In retaliation Devraj killed Sahabal in 1324 and captured major portion of Chero Kingdom.
- · Devraj founded the city of Bhojpur.
- In 1611 Ujjainis won a decisive battle against Cheros, with the help of Mughals.




