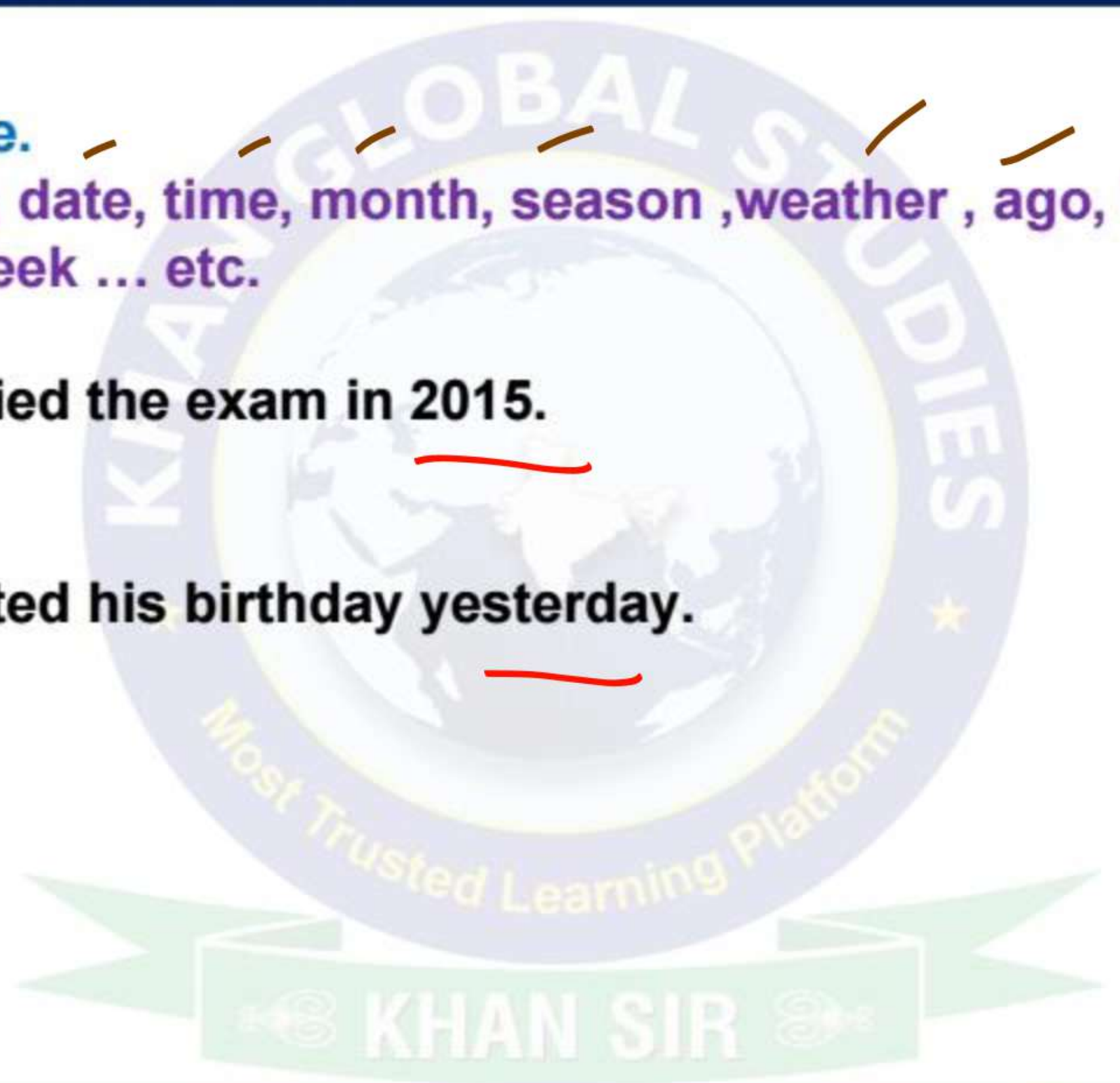
Simple past

↳ **Key words** – day, date, time, month, season ,weather , ago, Yesterday , last + year ,month ,week ... etc.

1. Raju ~~has~~ qualified the exam in 2015.

2. He ~~has~~ celebrated his birthday yesterday.

Past continuous

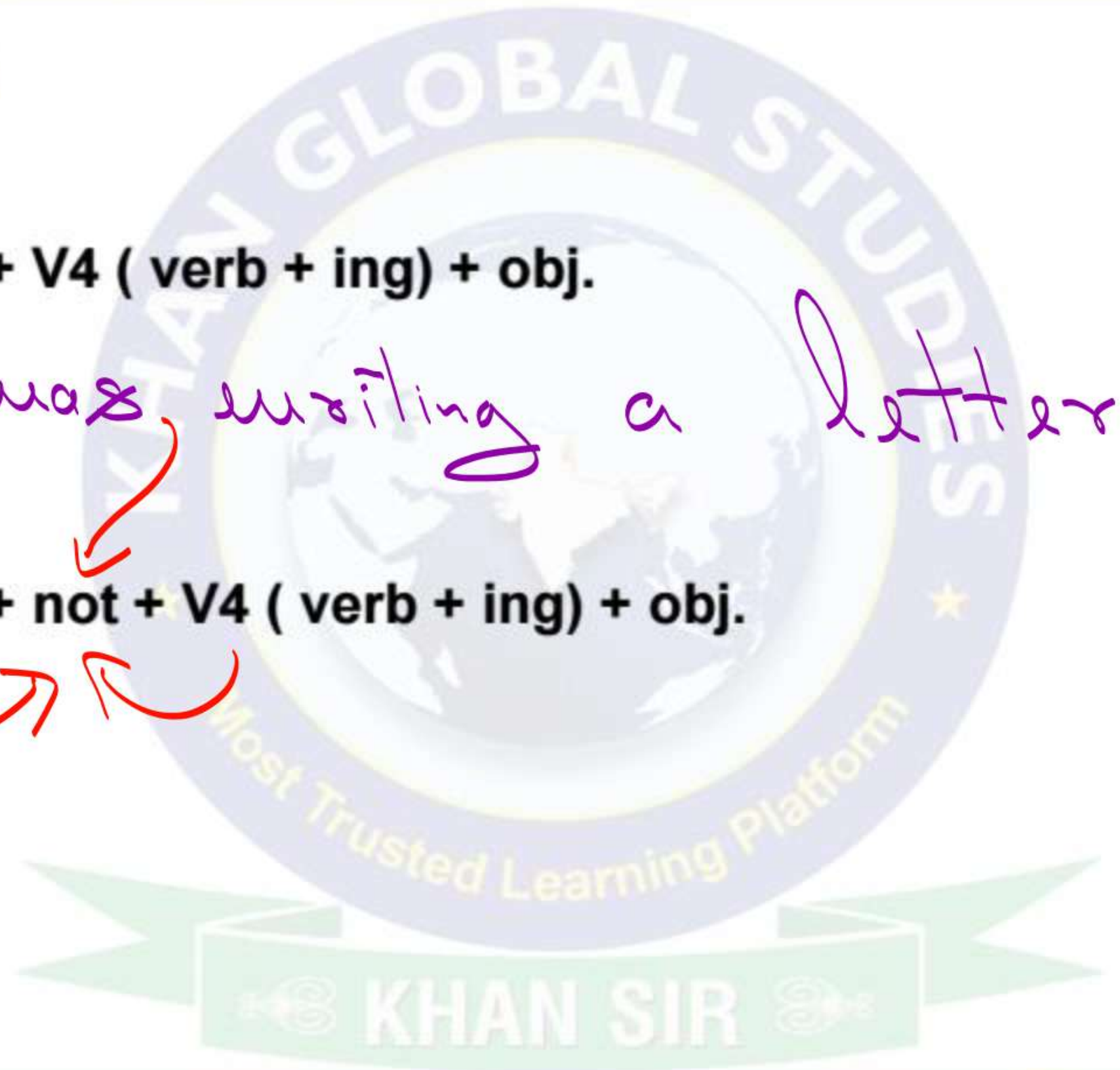
1. Positive

Sub + was/were + V4 (verb + ing) + obj.

→ She ~~was~~ writing a letter.

2. Negative

Sub + was/were + not + V4 (verb + ing) + obj.



Past continuous

3. Interrogative

Wh + was/were + sub + V4 (verb + ing) + obj?

→ was she writing a letter?

4. Interrogative negative

Wh + was/were + sub + not + V4 (verb + ing) + obj? ★

Positive

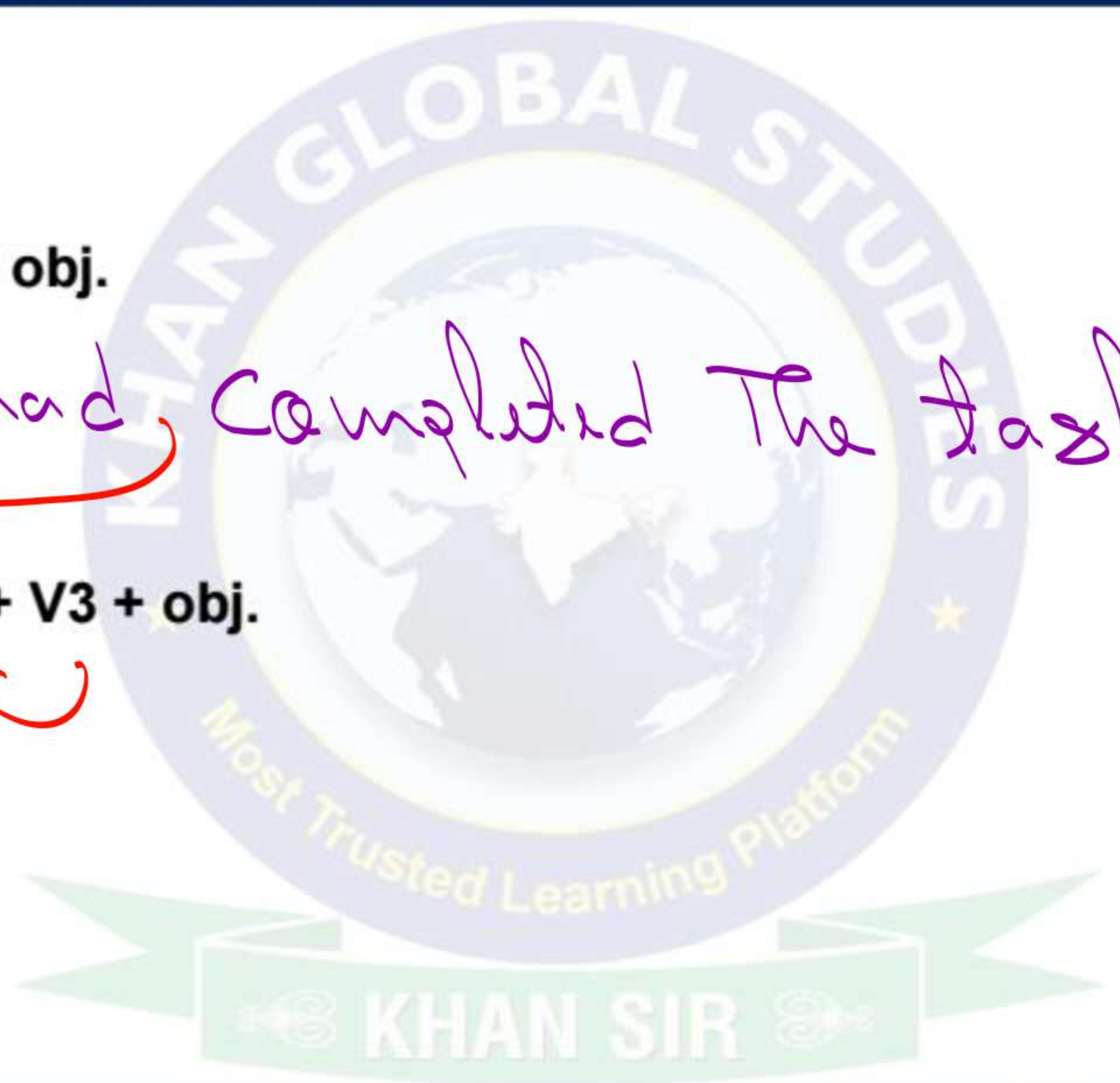
Sub + had + V3 + obj.

⇒ Raju had completed the task.

Negative

Sub + had + not + V3 + obj.

⇒

Interrogative

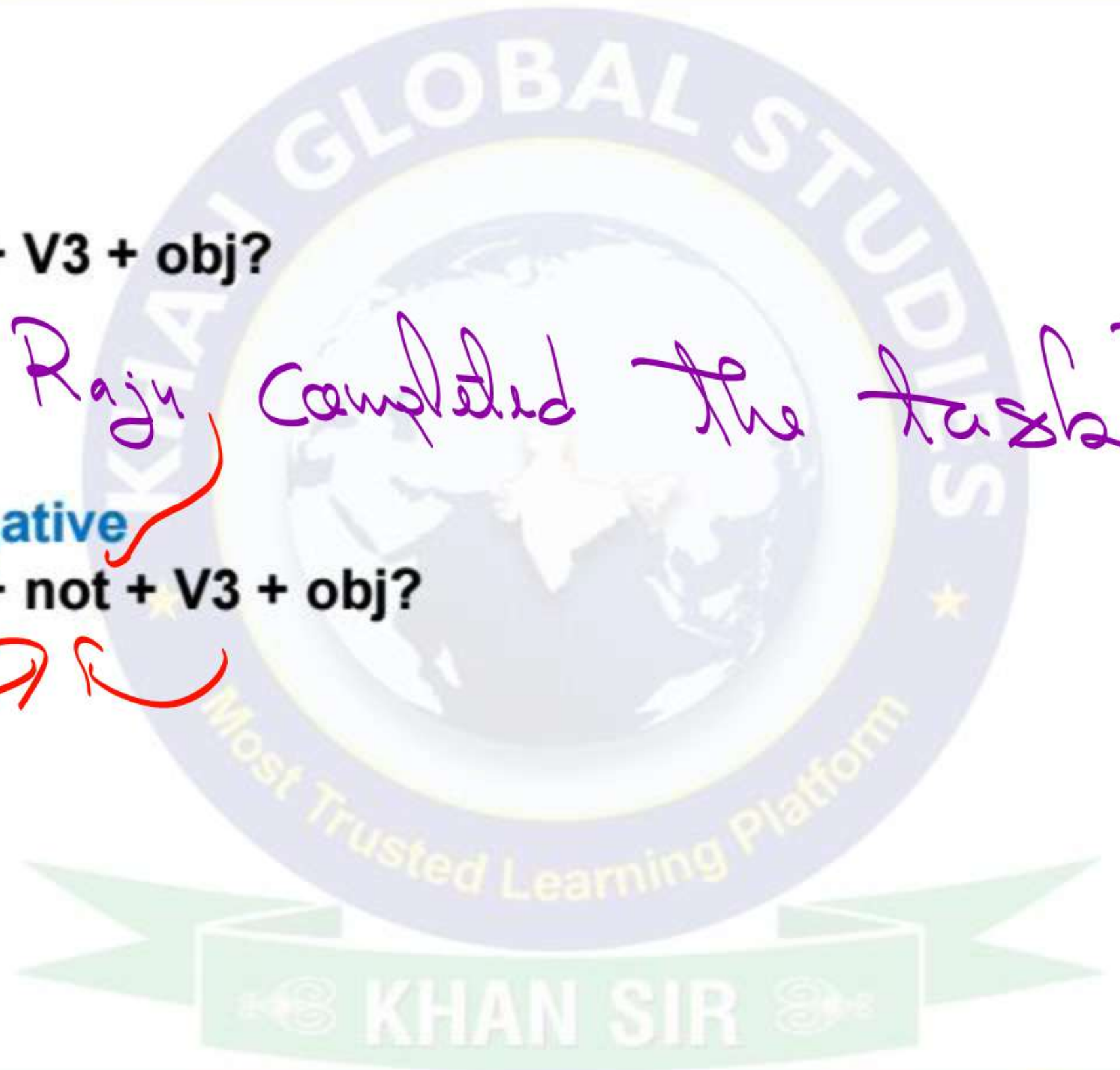
Wh + had + sub + V3 + obj?

→ had Raju completed the task?

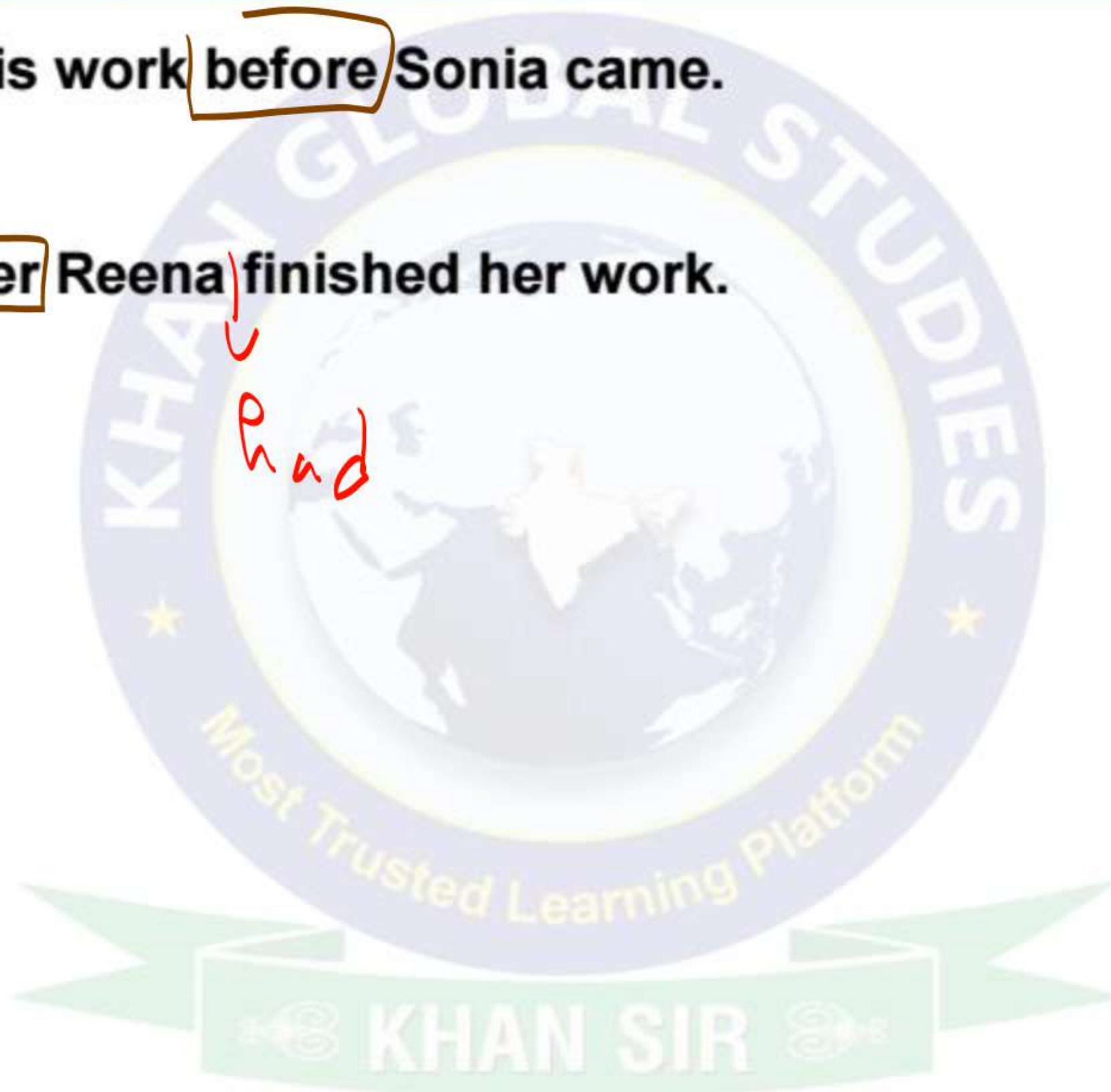


1. Ravi finished his work **before** Sonia came.

1. Mohit ~~took~~ medicine before He went to sleep.

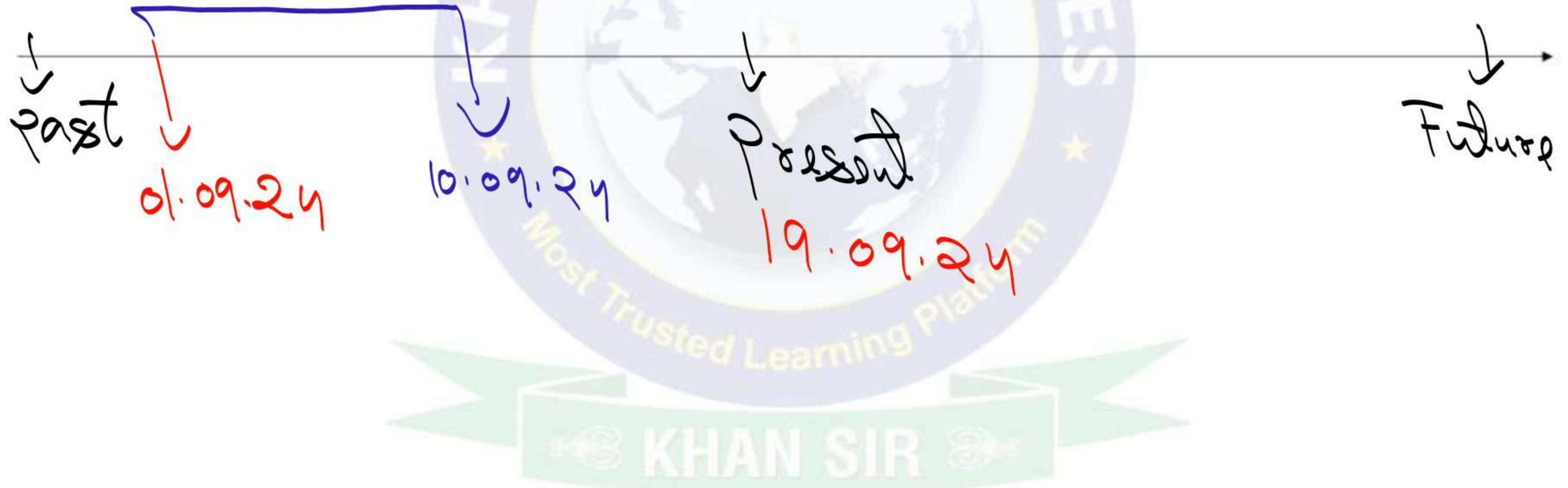
2. After He *had* picked up the stick, He hit the dog.

Past perfect continuous

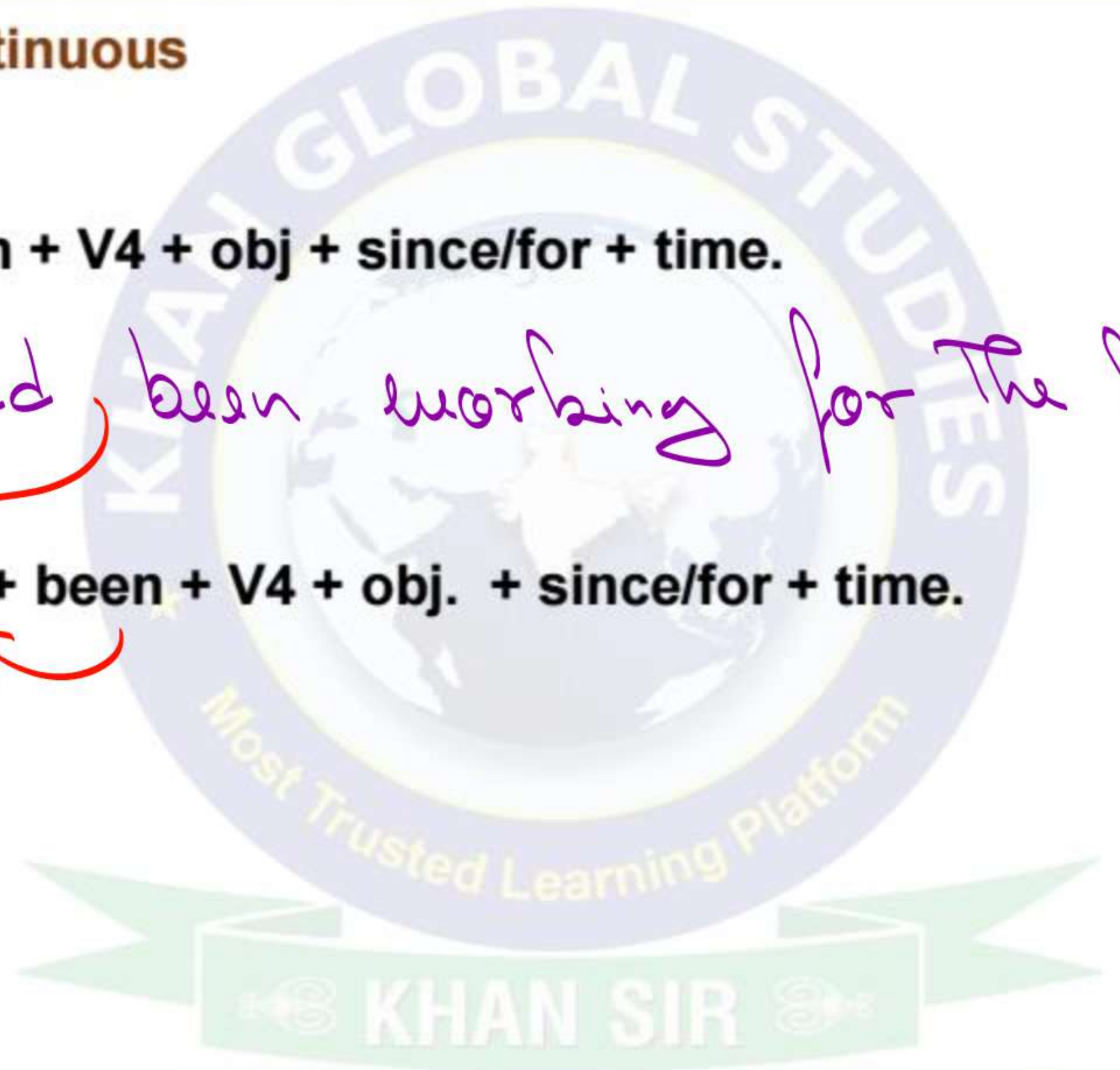
1. Positive

Sub + had + been + V4 + obj + since/for + time.

→ He had been working for the last two days.

2. Negative

Sub + had + not + been + V4 + obj. + since/for + time.



Past perfect continuous

3. Interrogative

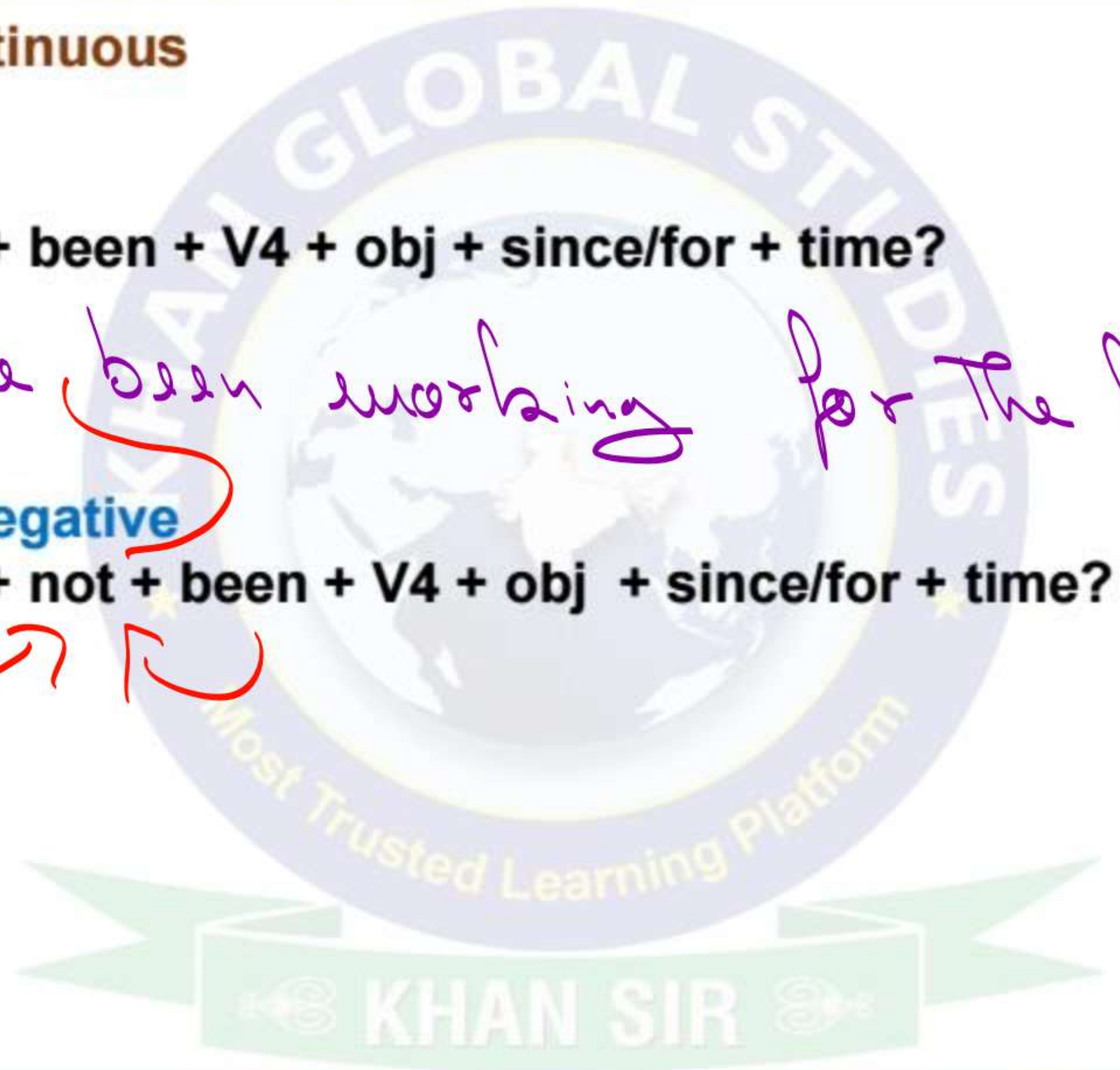
Wh + had + sub + been + V4 + obj + since/for + time?

→ *— had he been working for the last two days?*

4. Interrogative negative

Wh + had + sub + not + been + V4 + obj + since/for + time?

Positive

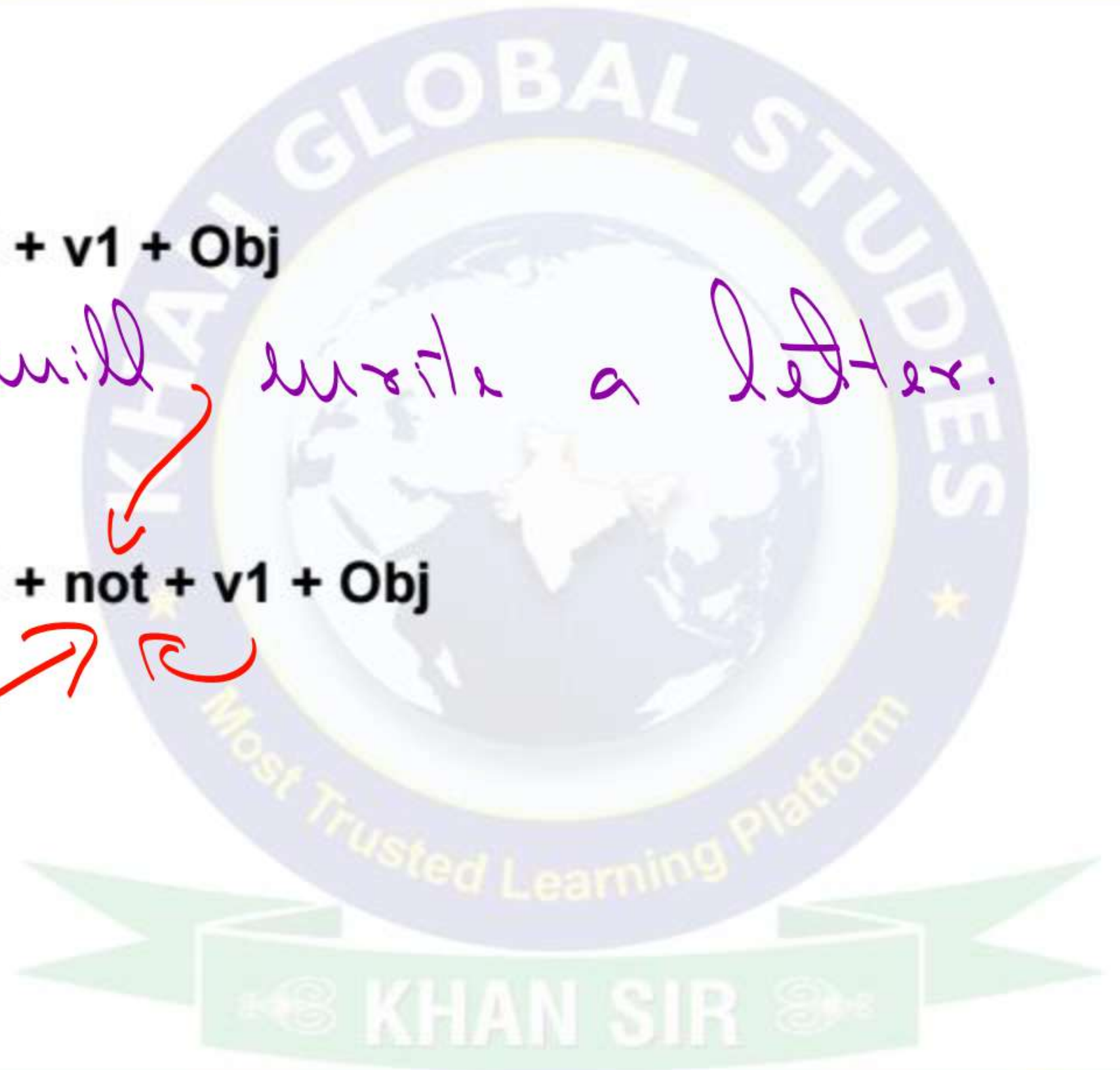
Sub + will / shall + v1 + Obj

⇒ Raju will write a letter.

Negative

Sub + will / shall + not + v1 + Obj

Simple future

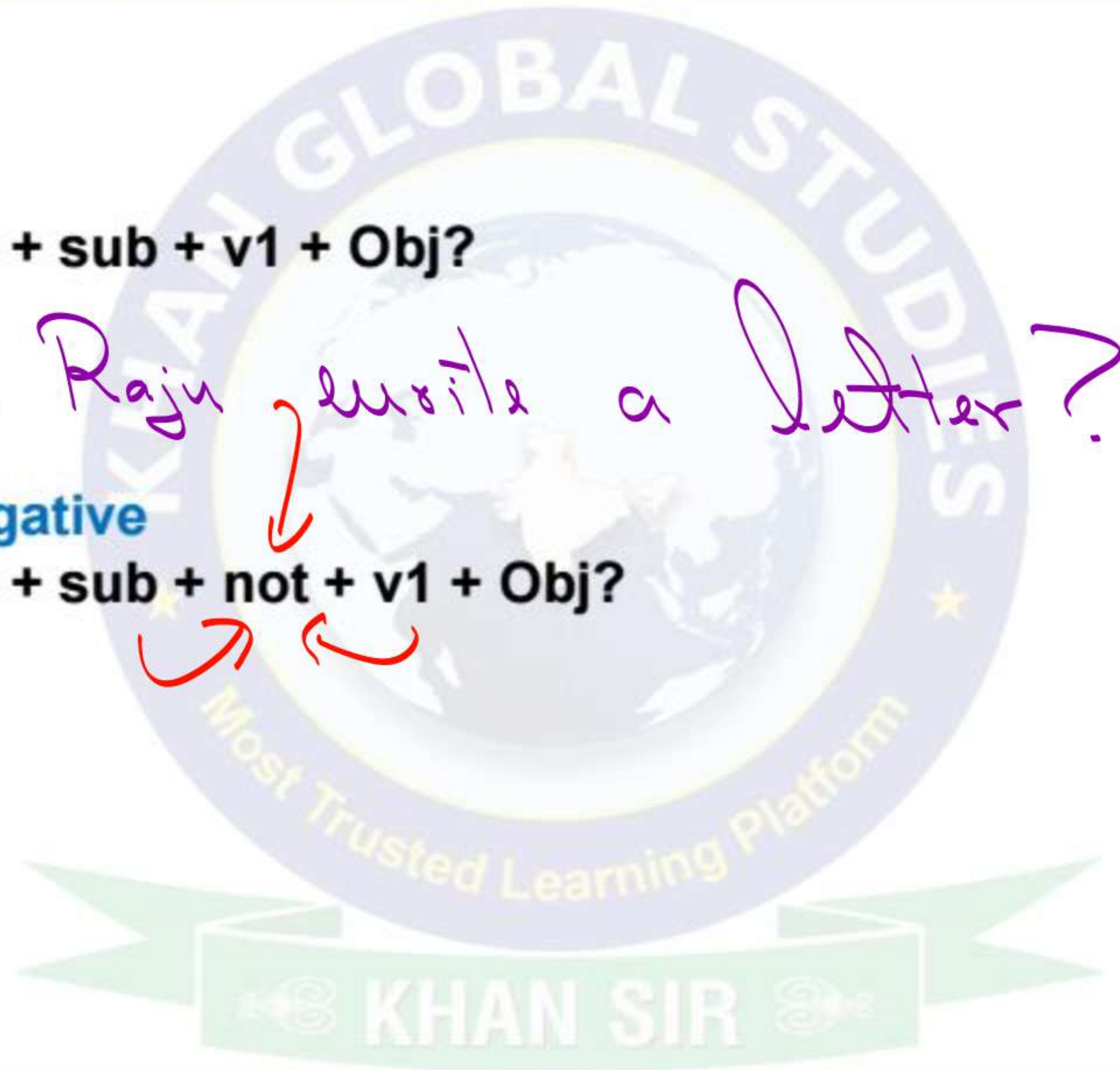
Interrogative

Wh + will / shall + sub + v1 + Obj?

→ Will Raju write a letter?

Interrogative negative

Wh + will / shall + sub + not + v1 + Obj?



1. Fixed action

→ Will = I / We

→ Shall = He, She, Name, - etc.

2. Not fixed action

→ Shall = I / We

→ We = He, She, Name, - etc.

Simple future

1. Not fixed action ✓

Shall – I / we

Will - He, she, it, they, you, name

2. Fixed action ✓

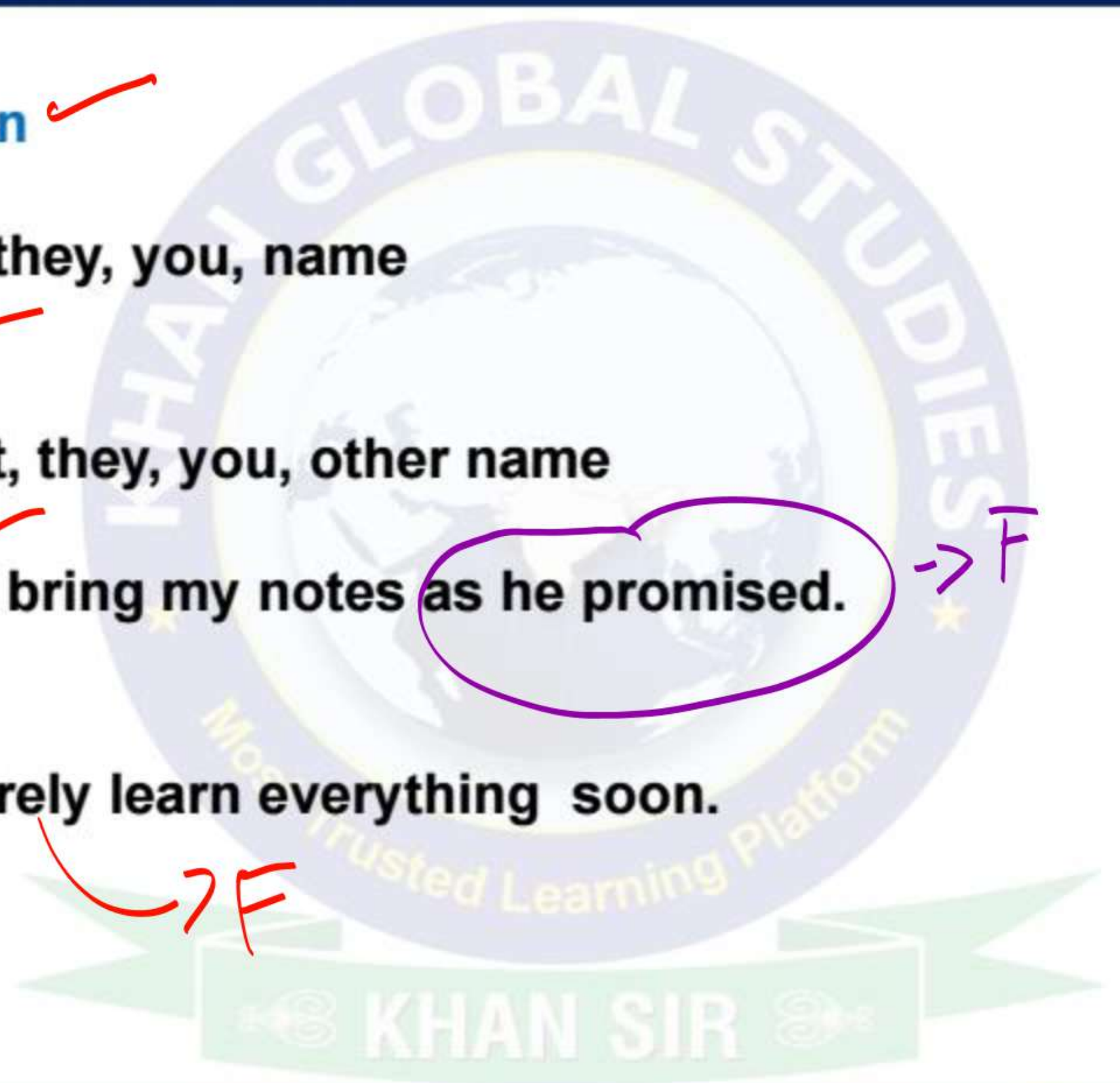
Will – I / We

Shall – He, she, it, they, you, other name

Example:-

1. Mohit will/shall bring my notes as he promised. (circled) -> F

2. He will/shall surely learn everything soon. -> F



Simple future

1. Not fixed action

Shall – I / we

Will - He, she, it, they, you, name

2. Fixed action

Will – I / We

Shall – He, she, it, they, you, other name

3. The angry girl said I will/shall definitely take Revenge.

2. Fixed action

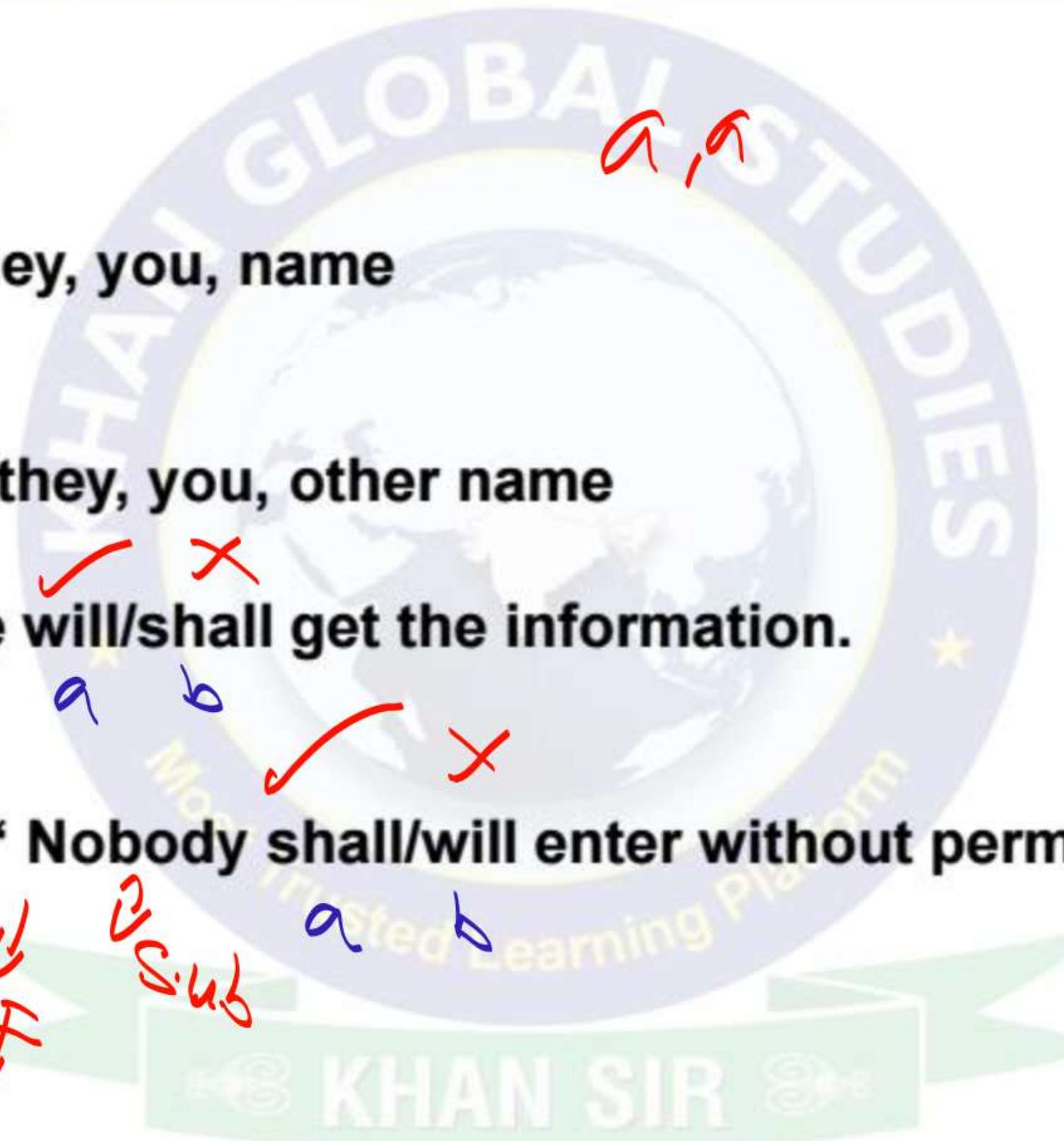
Will – I / We

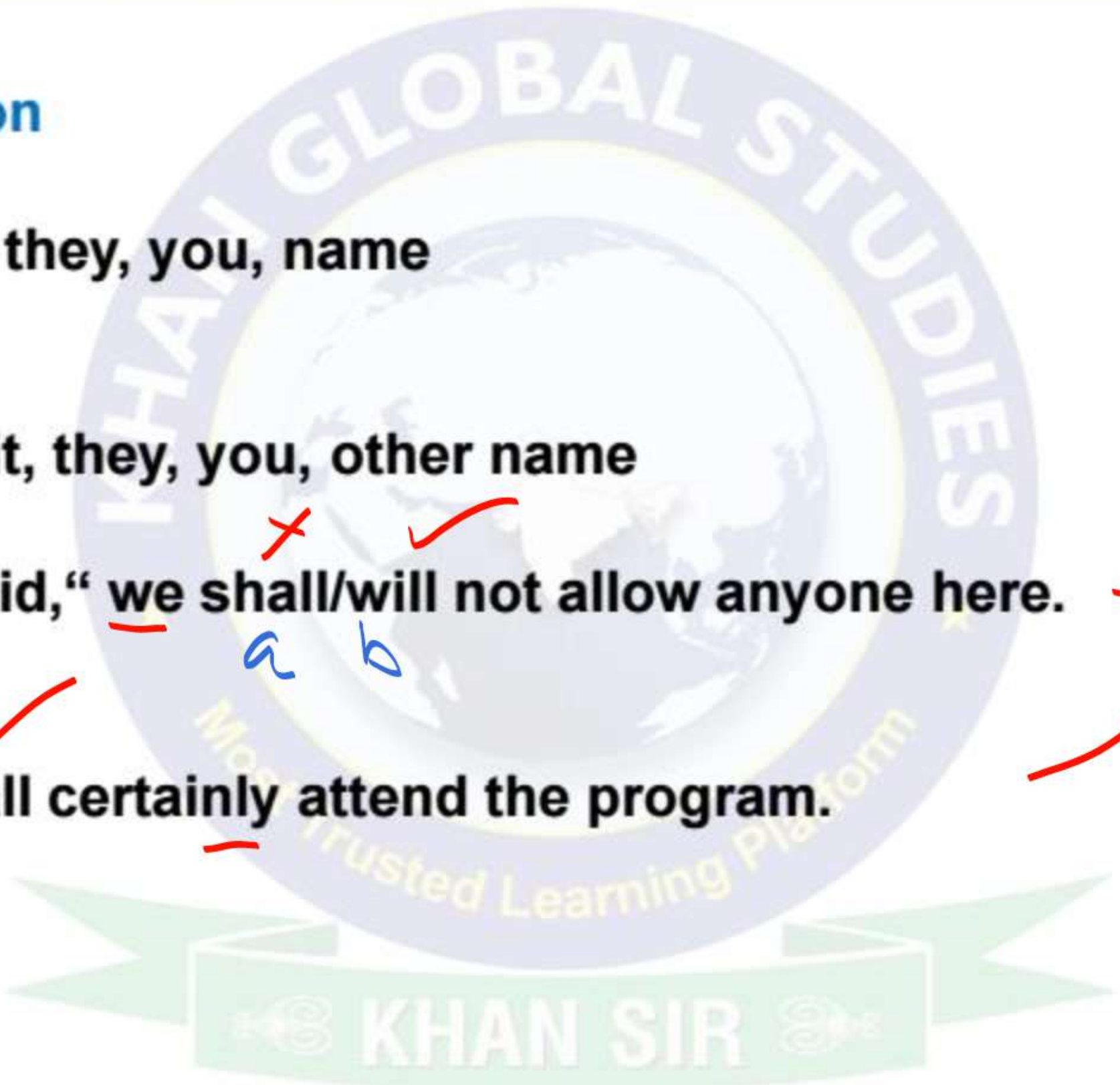

Positive

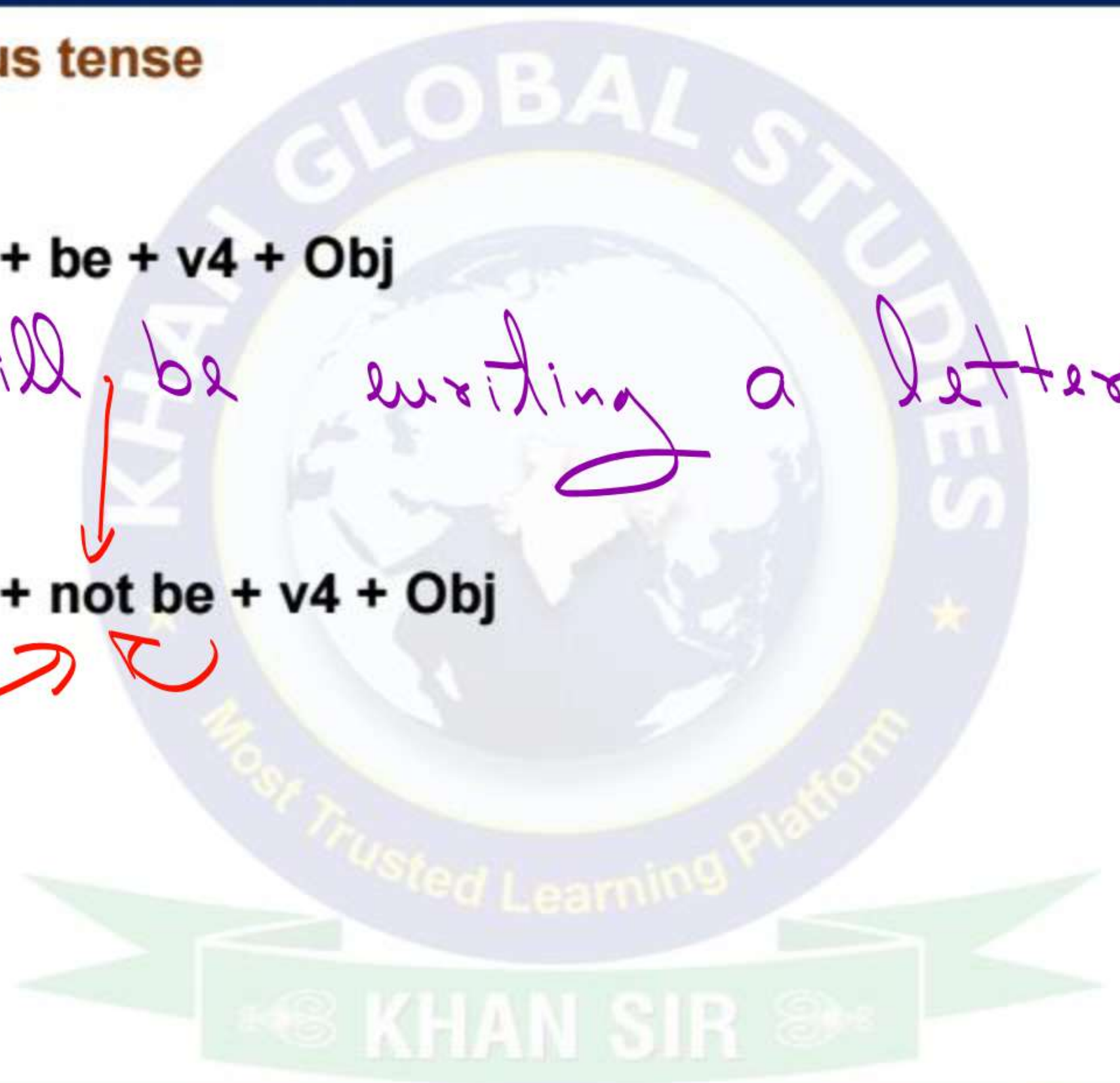
Sub + will / shall + be + v4 + Obj

⇒ He will be writing a letter, next Sunday.

Negative

Sub + will / shall + not be + v4 + Obj

Interrogative

Wh + will / shall + sub + be + v4 + Obj?

> — Will he be writing a letter, next Sunday?

Interrogative negative

Wh + will / shall + sub + not be + v1 + Obj?
