$$[-] = 1 + 2 + 3$$

$$\Rightarrow 1+2, 1+3, 2+3$$

2. -ve = 1+2+3 = bad act, accuse, blame, guilty

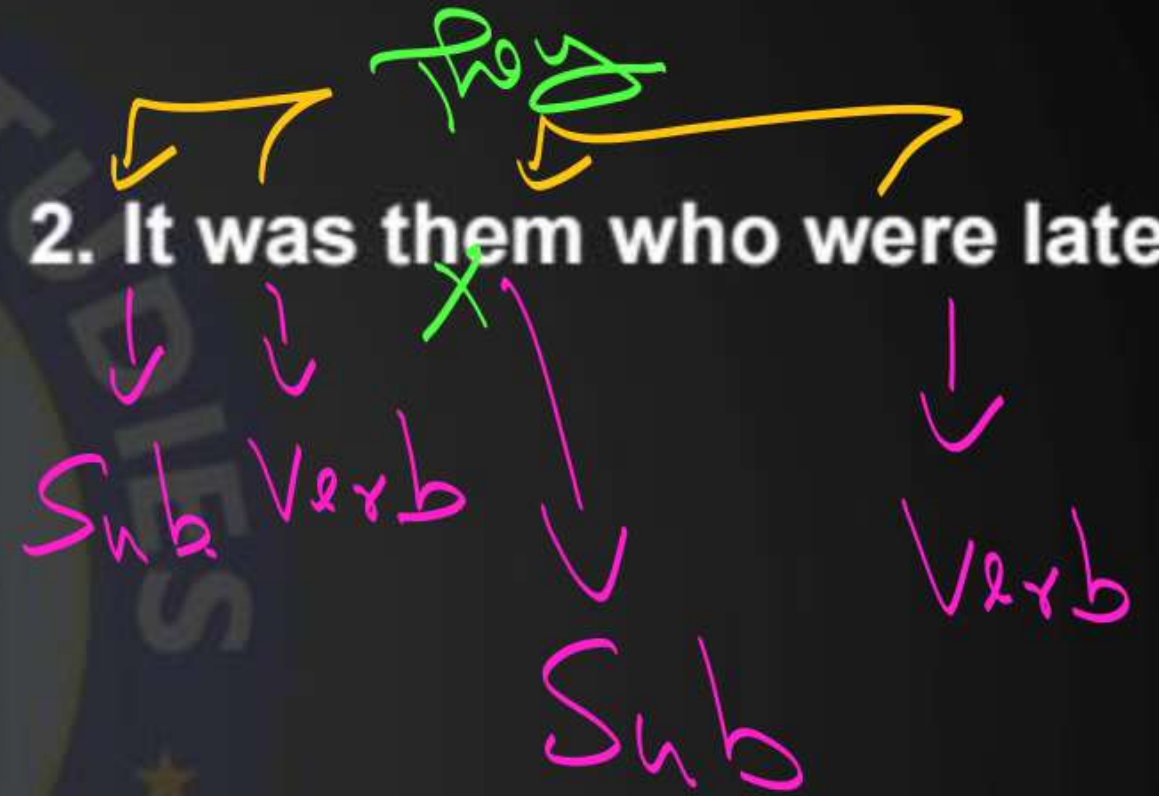

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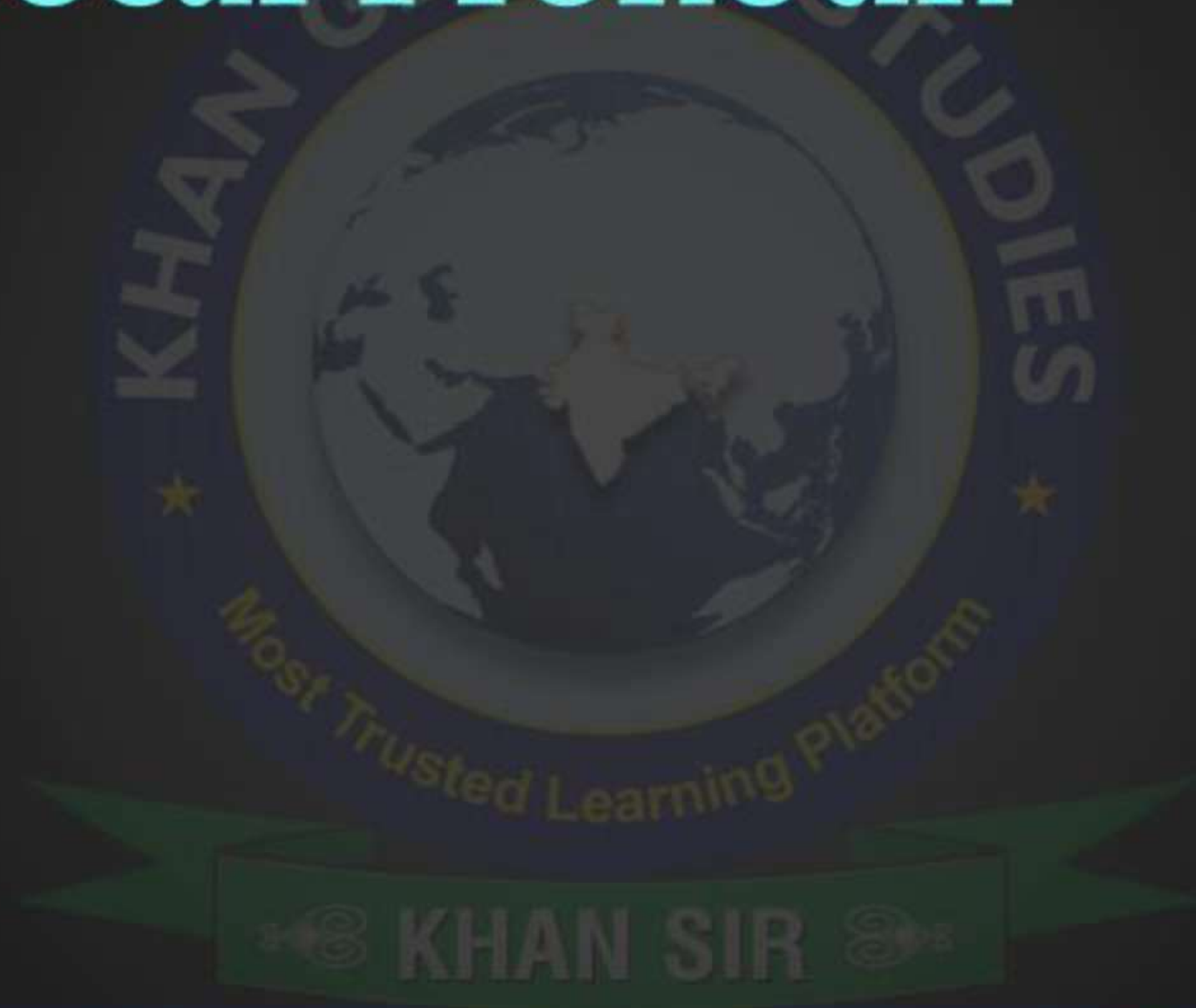

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Reciprocal Pronoun



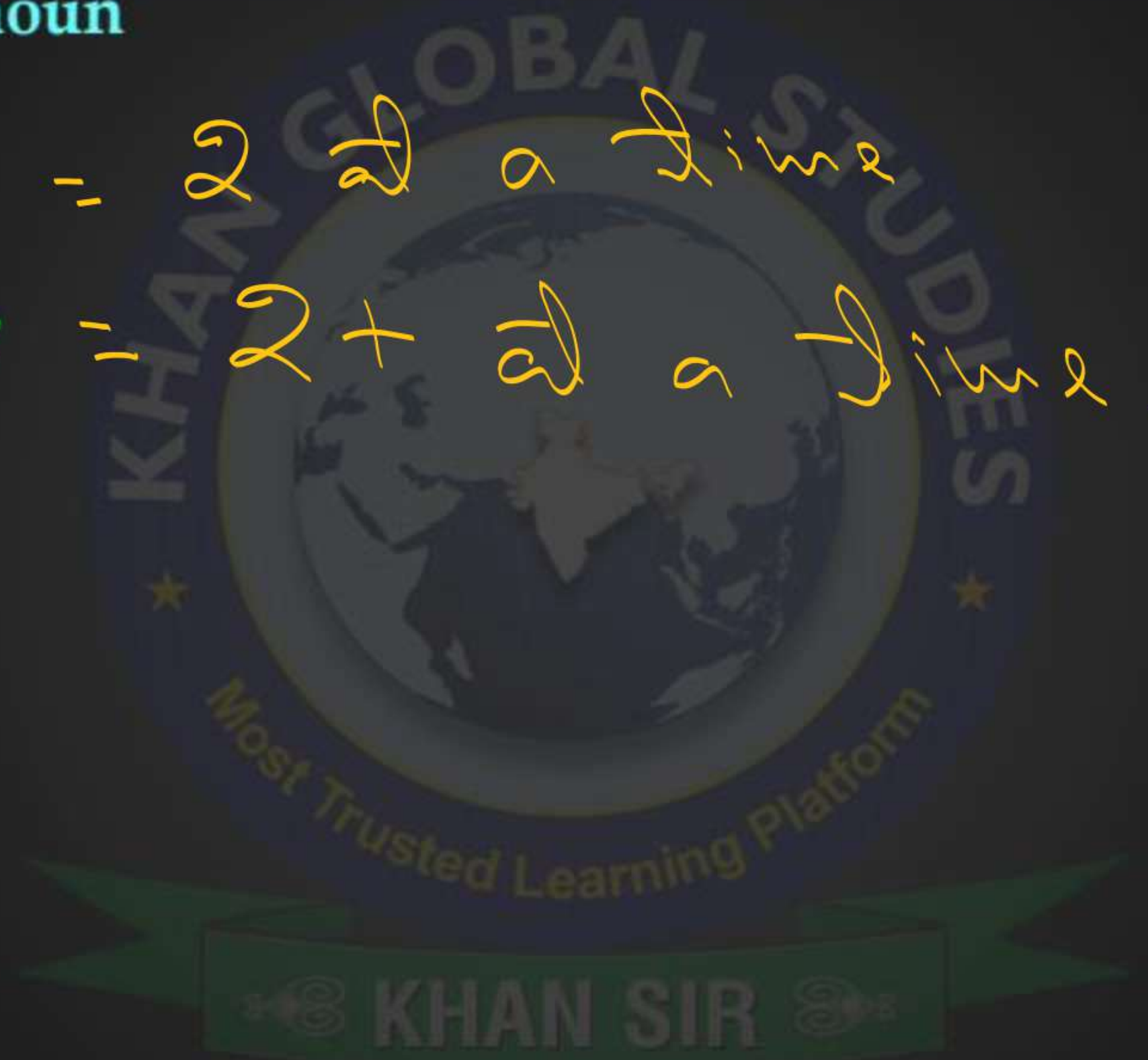
Reciprocal Pronoun

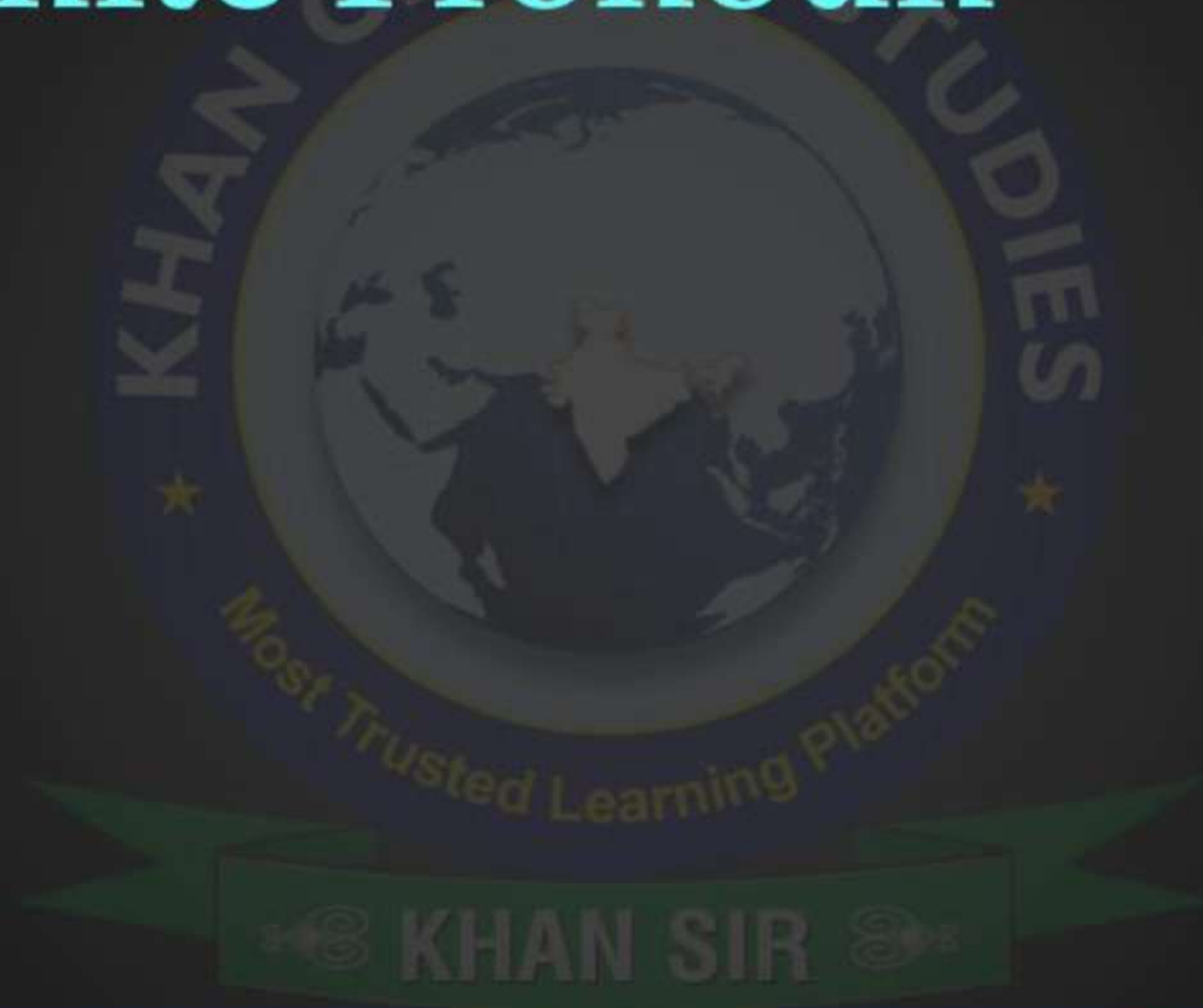

Type - 2

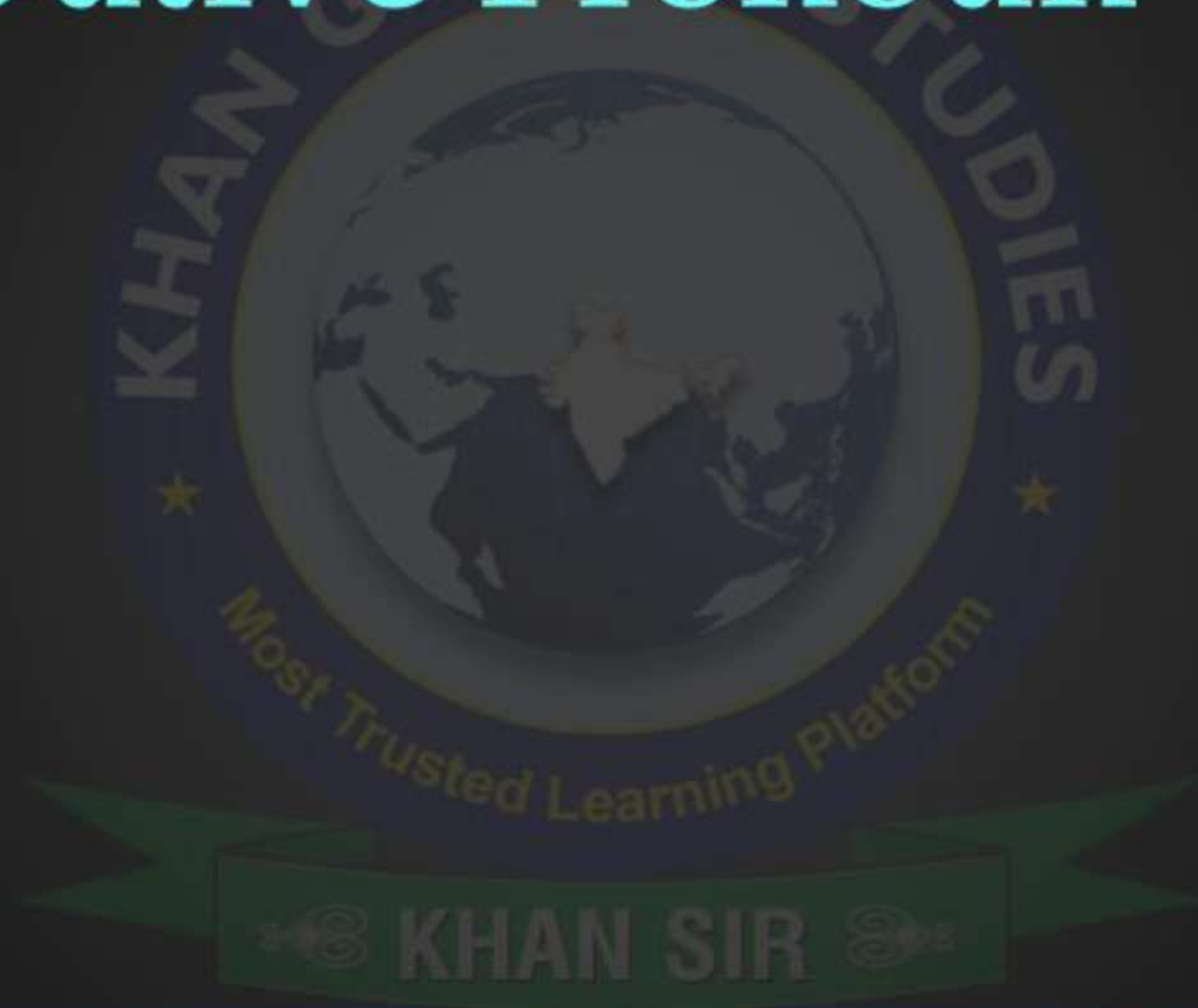
=> Everything, Anything, Something, Nothing - ^{It, It's, Its}=> Everything is easy when he/she/it is
