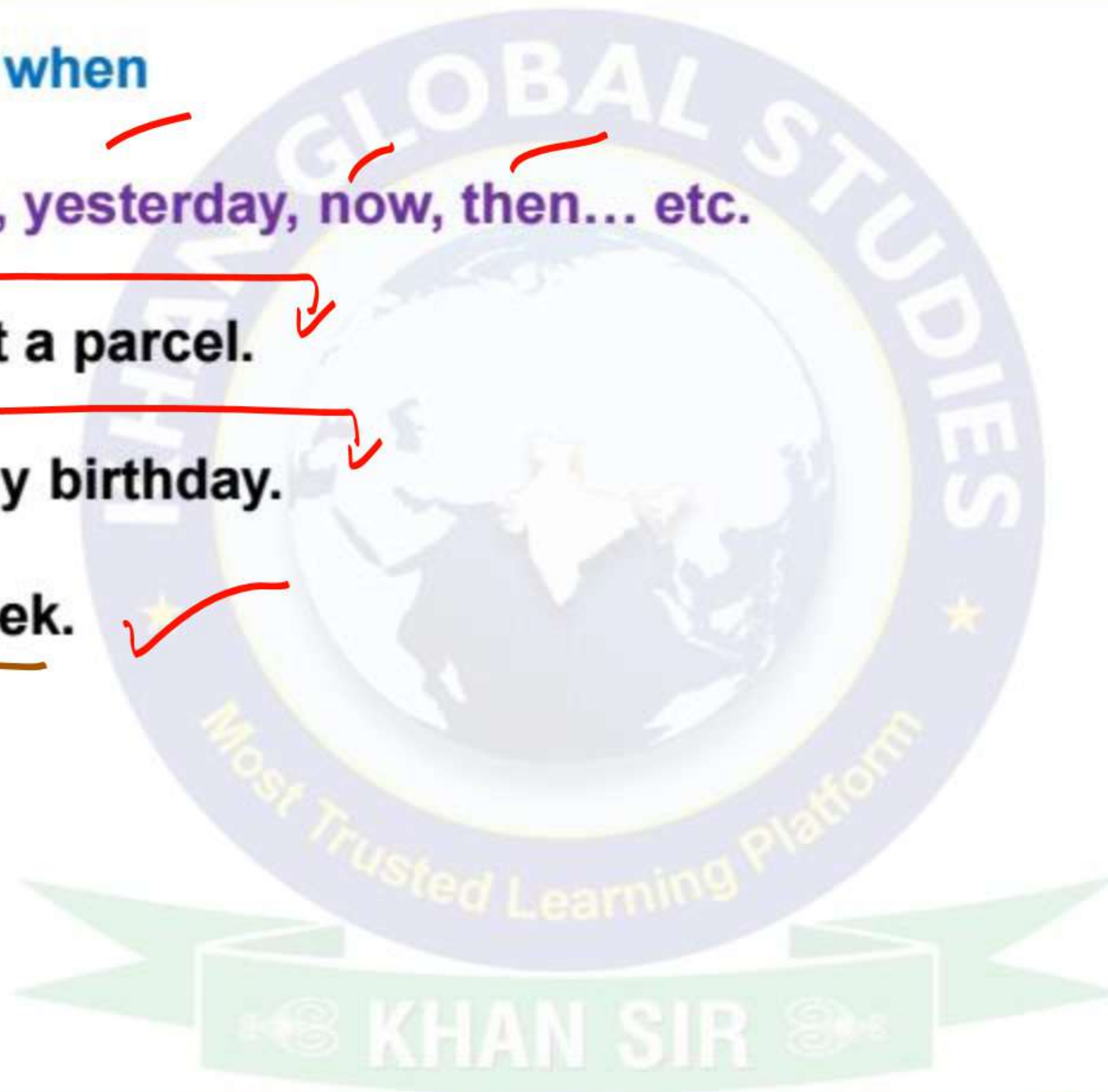
Adverb of time – **when**

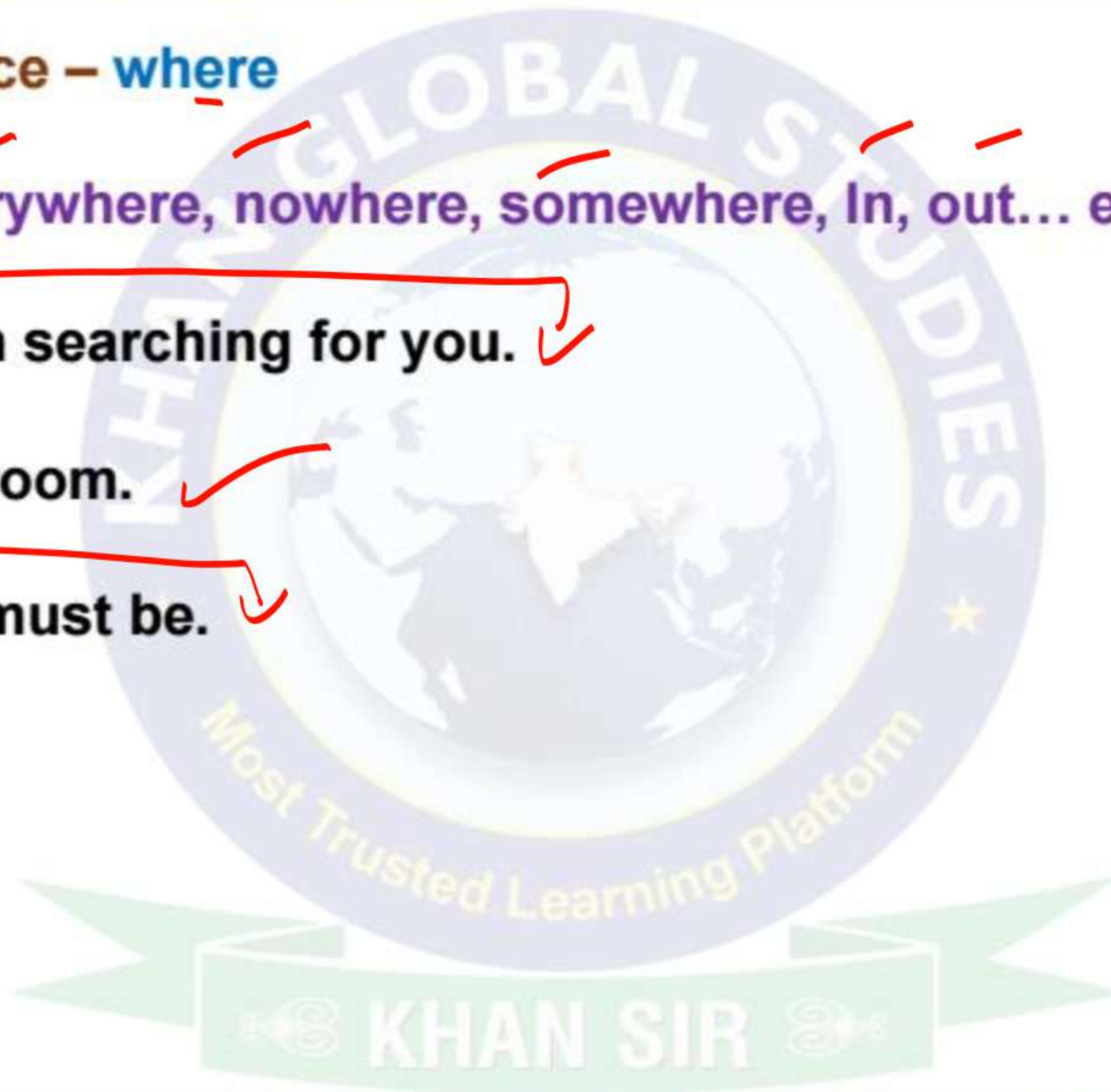
**2. Adverb of Place – where**

He nicely spoke.

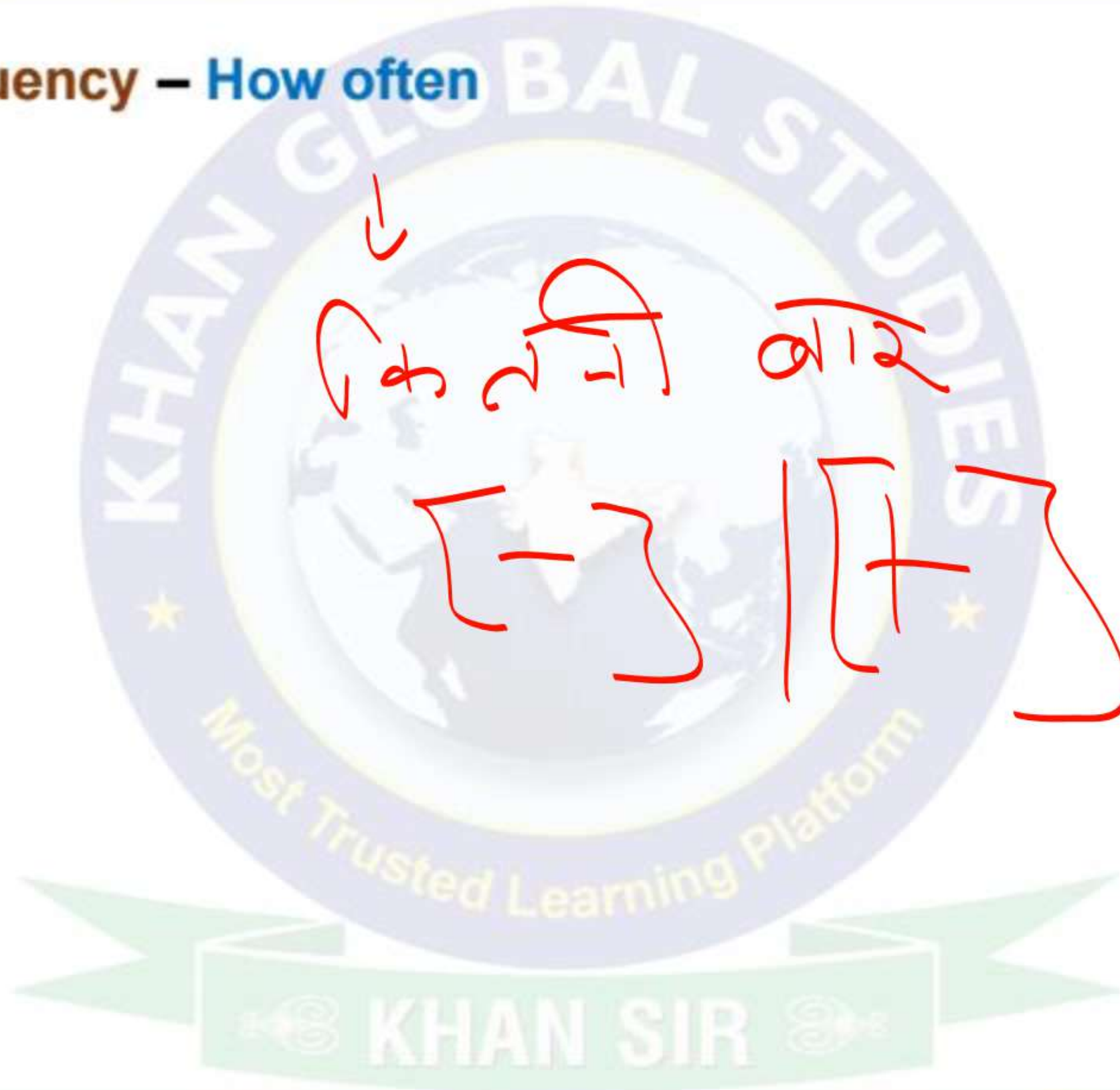

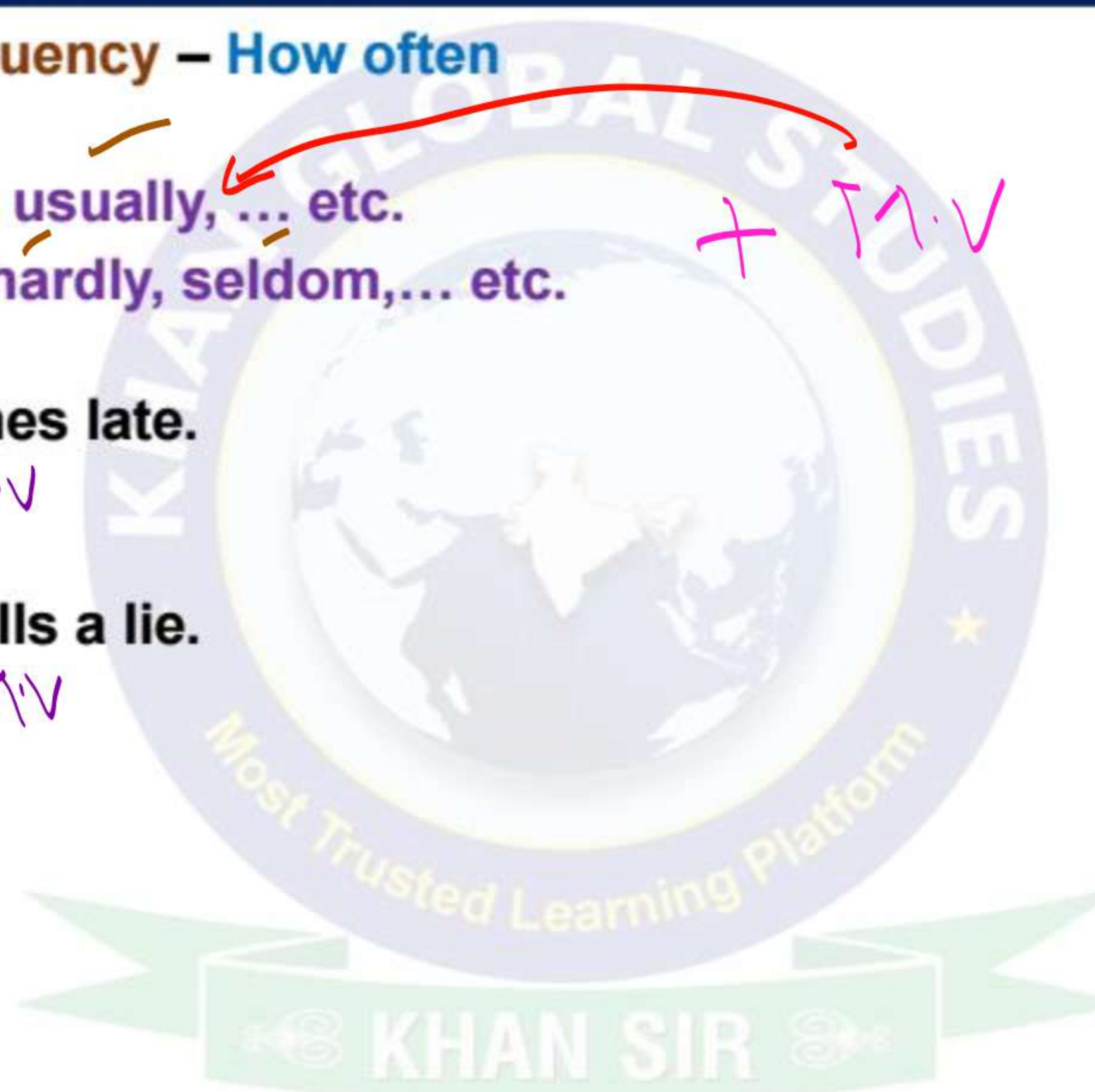
**4. Adverb of frequency – How often**

- never, rarely, hardly, seldom, ... etc.

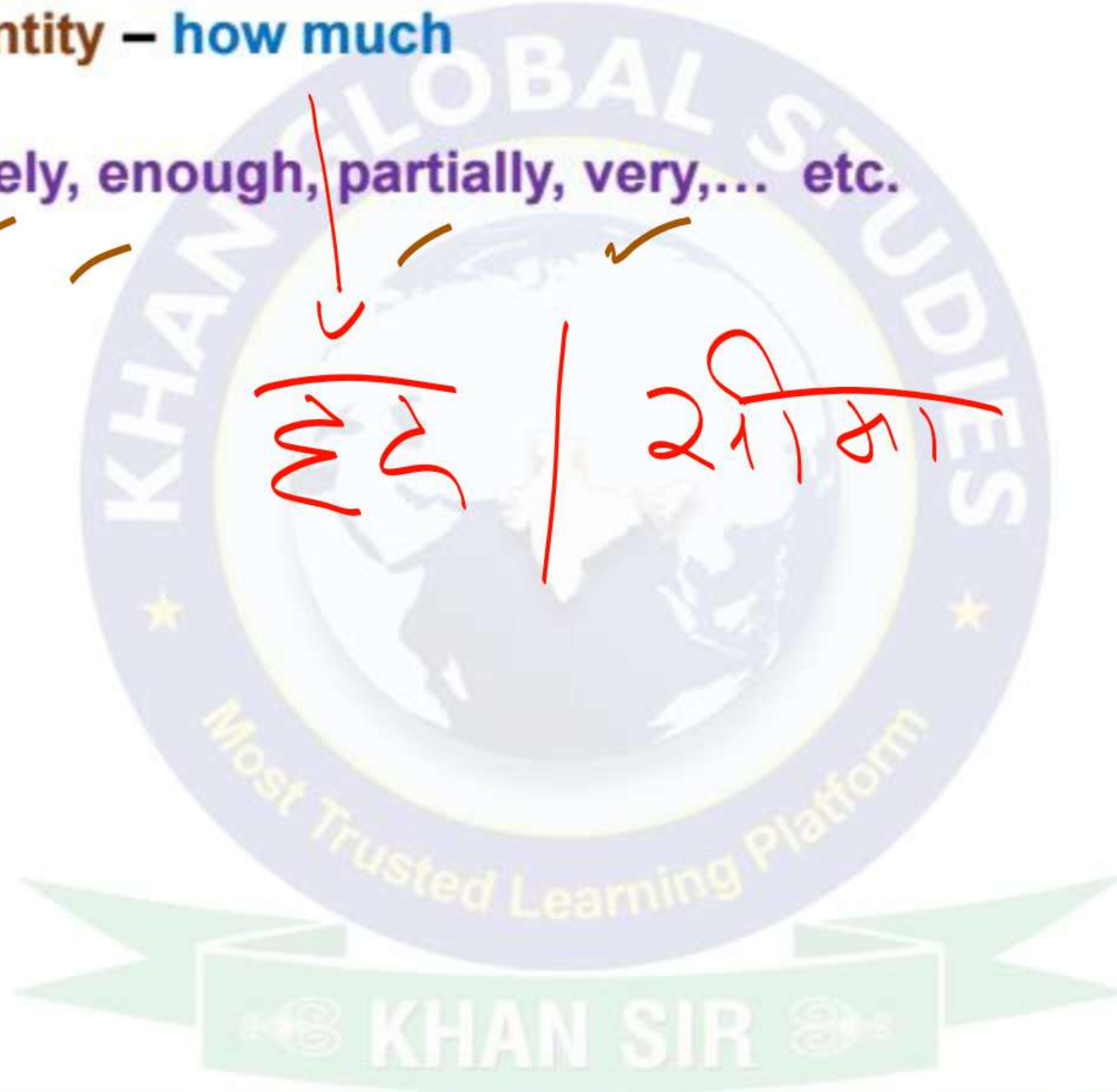
1. Always he comes late.

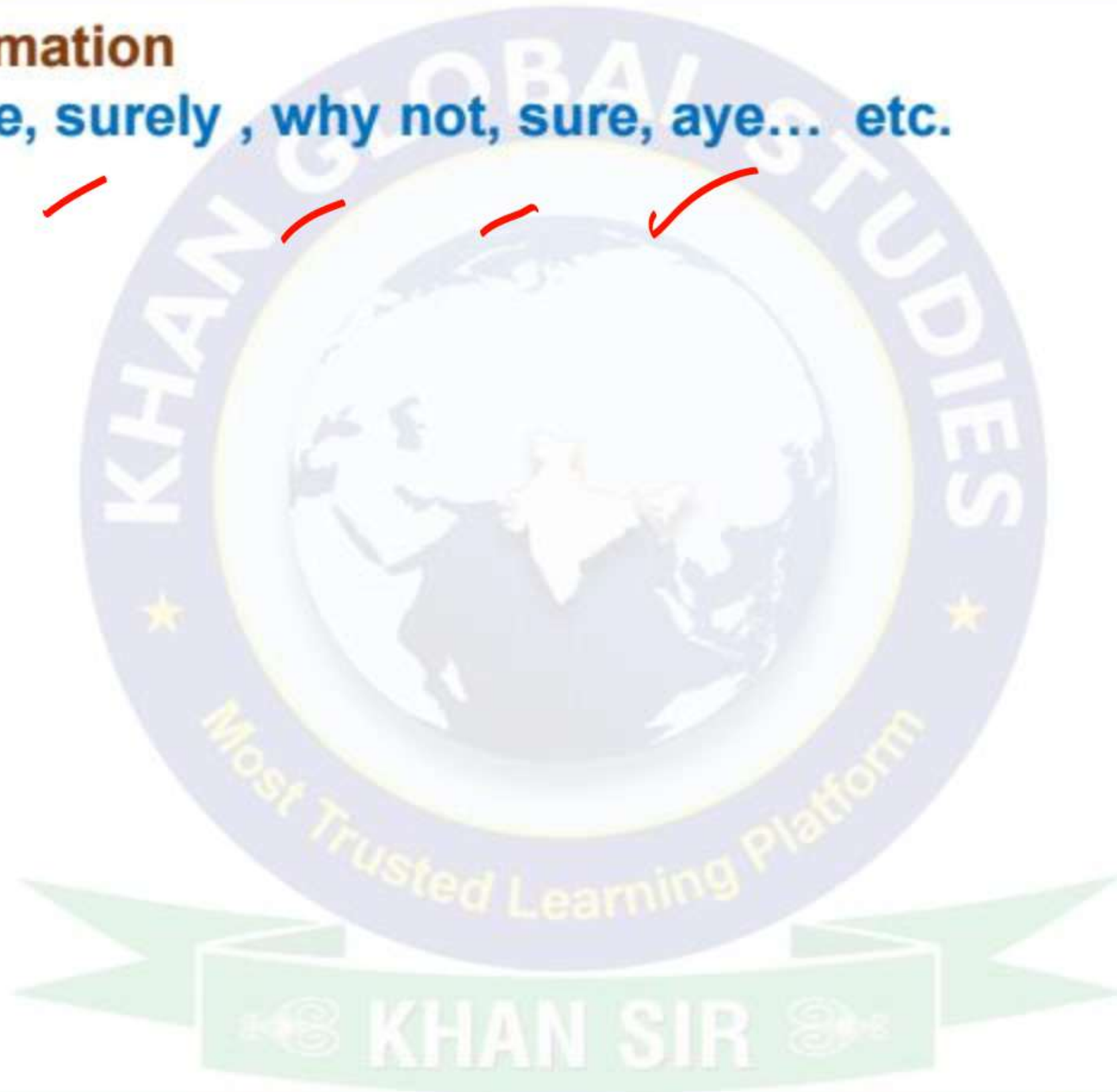

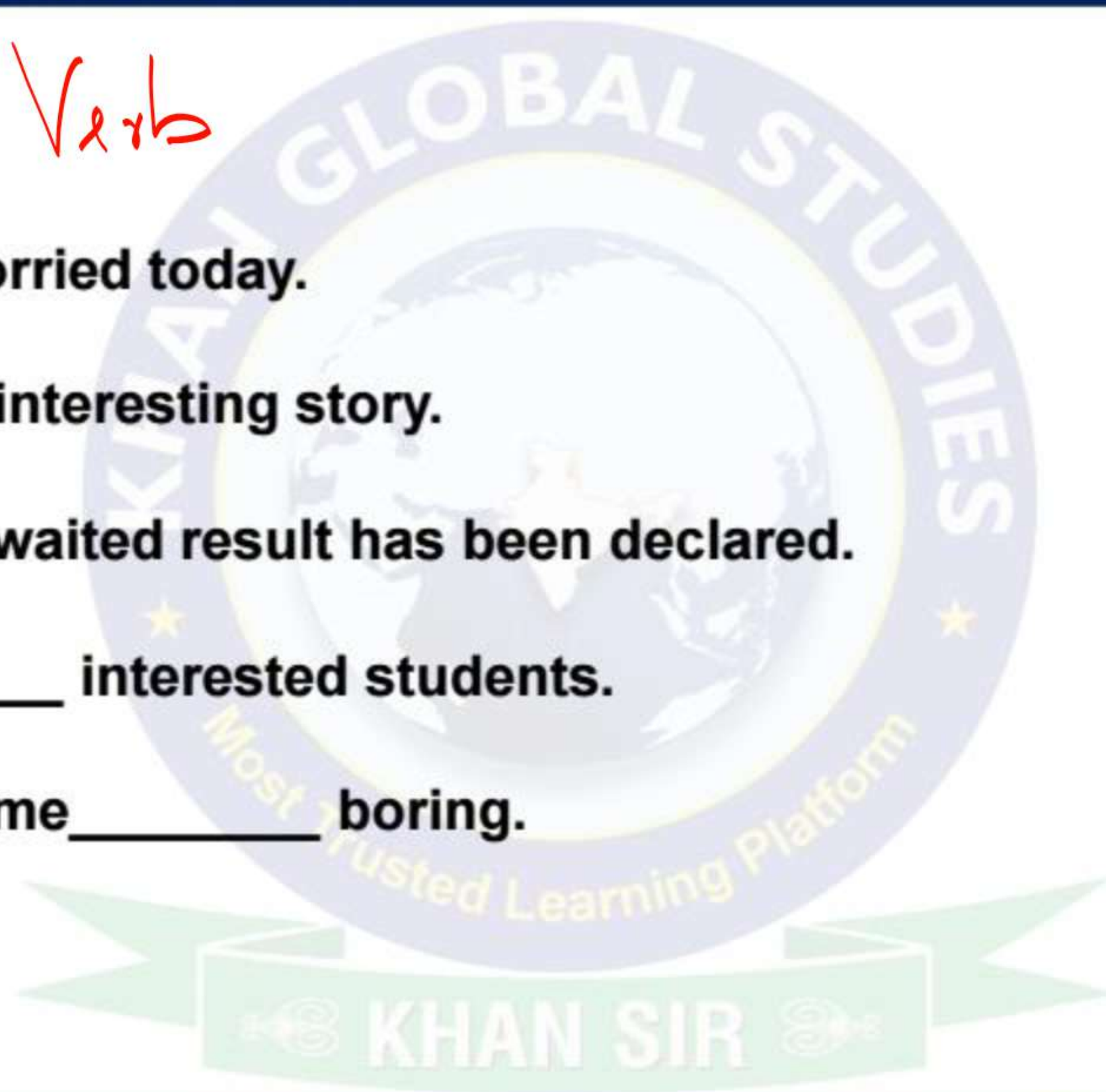

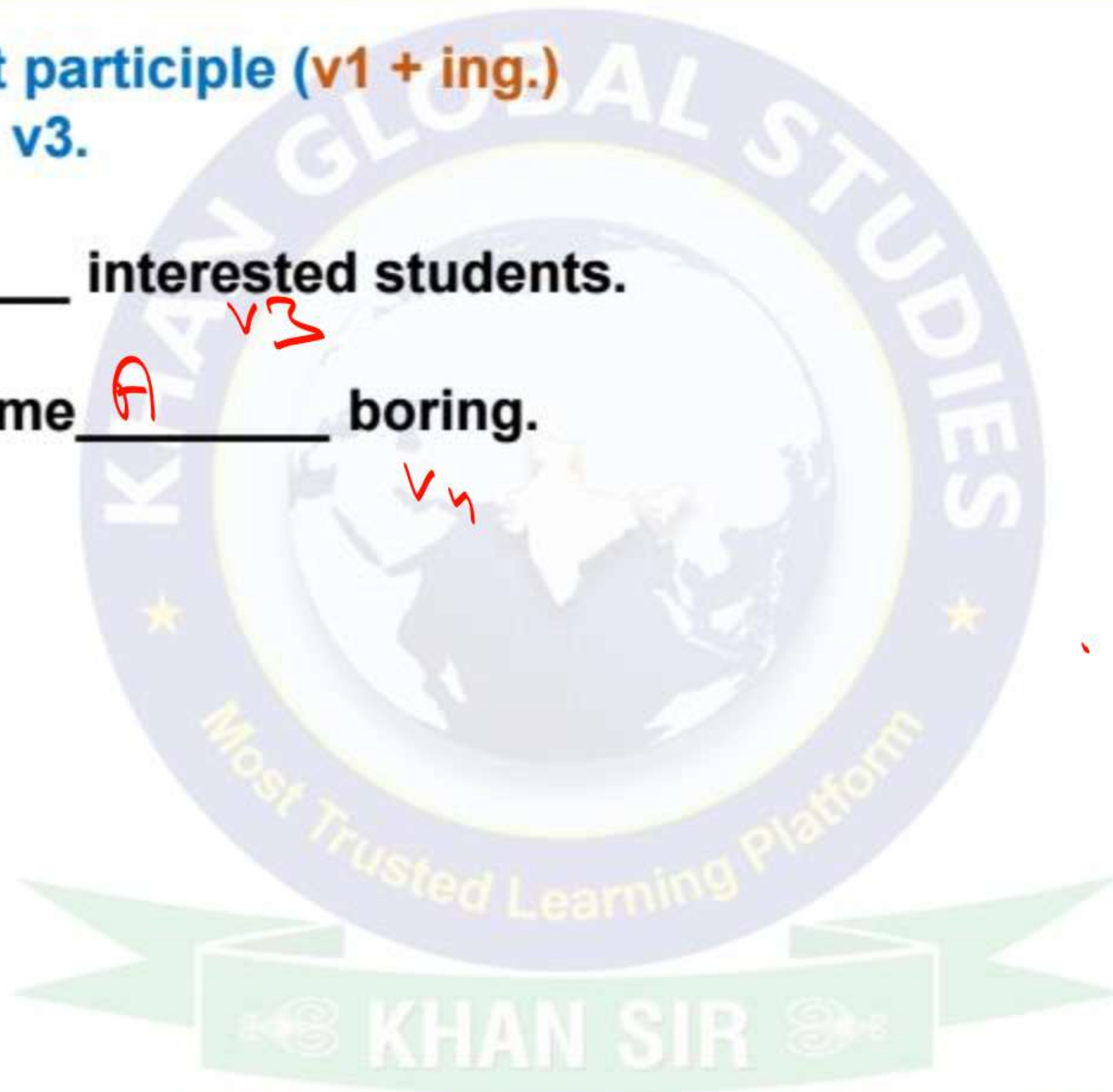
