
Adverb of time – **when**

Today, tomorrow, yesterday, now, then... etc.


~~Soon~~ you will get a parcel.



Here, there, everywhere, nowhere, somewhere, In, out... etc.


Everywhere I am searching for you.



**She loudly screamed.**


