Nutrition Rehabilitation Center

Context

In the last one year there has been negligence in sending weak children from hospitals to Nutritional Rehabilitation Centers (NRC).

More Information

 In the year 2022, UNICEF advised the Health Department to send weak and malnourished children coming to the OPD (Outpatient Department) to the Nutritional Rehabilitation Center after their recovery.



Nutrition Rehabilitation Center (NRC)

- It is a type of **Facility-based** care where both mother and kid get healthy food and medicine.
- The project provides assistance to children aged 6
 months to 60 months who are Severely and Acutely
 Malnourished (SAM). They are only released, once
 they have fully recovered.
- Mothers also receive training in nutrition, basic healthcare, hygiene, etc.
- In Bihar, NIDAN operates Nutritional Rehabilitation Center.
- In Bihar, an estimated 9,74,610 children, or 8.33 per cent of the total, suffer from severe and

acute malnutrition, putting them at a high risk of death.

Bihar uses AI for Road Construction & Repairing

Context

Recently, for the First time on an experimental basis, the Road Construction Department of Bihar decided to use AI to construct roads at Block Level.

More about the news

- In every Block 60 km of Road will be monitored by Al.
- For Al monitoring, a Vehicle-Based Mobile Application will be used.
- Road auditing will be done by vehicle, and then Al will transform all the audit Reports into images.
- Al-based systems will use image recognition and machine learning to identify potholes, cracks, bumps, and other hazards related to roads.
- The data gathered from these systems will be used to inform Road maintenance plans, tracking the condition of roads, etc.

Other Initiative

- Bihar Rural Road Maintenance Policy-2018: Bihar uses several norms of NHAI and International standards in the maintenance and repair of rural roads.
- Anurakshan Mobile App: It is designed for online vigilance of rural Roads.

Center of Excellence (CoE) for Jardalu Mango

Context

The Bihar Government has announced the setting up of a Centre of Excellence (CoE) for Jardalu Mango in Shahkund, Bhagalpur.

More about the news

- Under the 4th Agriculture Roadmap, a CoE for Jardalu Mango was proposed in Bihar.
- In this CoE, Shed net and Poly house will be established, using which the fruit is grown in an artificial environment.

- The CoE will also serve as a knowledge and skill centre for farmers and training of new technology will be provided to them.
- Research on Jardalu Mango will also be done here, in order to improve the quality.

Jardalu Mango



Other CoE in Bihar

- Center of Excellence for Vegetables at Chandi, Nalanda (opened under India-Israel cooperation).
- Center of Excellence for Mango & Lichi at Vaishali (opened under India-Israel cooperation).

Paying Guest Hut Initiative

Context

To boost Tourism in the state, the Department of Tourism has launched the Paying Guest Hut initiative in which villages that are nearby to tourist places will be opened for paying guest facilities.

More about the news

- AIM: To develop all villages adjacent to tourist places in Bihar.
- No financial support will be provided for this scheme, rather the government encourages the villagers to construct huts and act as a facilitator

for implementation of this scheme.

 The tourism department mapped the potential villages and explained the concept of paying guests to the villagers and its associated benefits.

For this, two Tourist places from every district will be selected.

Reforming the Health System of Bihar

Context

District Hospitals in Bihar will be connected with medical colleges and a "Doctors Mentoring Programme" will be started in the state to provide better health facilities.

More about the news

- With the help of medical colleges better health facilities will be provided in District hospitals.
- Doctors of the District hospital will be trained in new technology, new health guidelines, modern medicines etc. through medical colleges.

Key Focus area

• To reduce **Infant Mortality Rate (IMR)**, and provide better health facilities to Newborn babies.

Training phase

- In the first phase, Doctors will be trained in emergency childbirth, and providing better health facilities to children.
- In the second phase, doctors of medical colleges will be trained to inspect the hospital every 3 months and give on-the-spot training if required.
- Doctors Mentoring Programme launched by the Department of Health, Bihar, and Indian Public Health Foundation.

Krishi Dev Gyan App

Context

A pilot project named "Krishi Dev Gyan App", Smart Farm Project, is being tested in Dobhi, Gaya.

Krishi Dev App

- It is an app developed by IFFCO which provides information about the crops to farmers.
- Through this, farmers will get information related to soil moisture, water requirements of plants, plant diseases, pests, and weather-related information on their mobile, a week in advance.
- Farmers will also be able to start and stop the motor pumps installed in their fields from their mobile app while sitting at home.
- Soon farmers across the state will be able to use this app.

Benefits of the App

- This application will detect the common diseases of the plants growing in the field and will inform the farmers through messaging as well as calls.
- It will also provide solutions and suggestions to farmers to save the crops.

Solar Park along the Canals in Bihar

Context

The Government of Bihar will make a total of 250 MW solar park along different canals of Bihar.

More about the news

- The total combined length of canals under this project will be around 500 km.
- Canals on different rivers such as Son, Kosi, Gandak, Bagmati, etc. will be used for this project.
- Total outlay for this project is 1.5 thousand crores.
- Initially, 2 MW Solar plant construction work started on Son Canal in Bikram, near Patna. Likewise, a 10 MW solar plant will be built on Phulwaria Lake in Nawada.
- Need of this Project: The state government has to fulfill the target of Renewable Purchase Obligation (RPO).
- As Bihar has limited potential for Wind energy and Hydel energy, therefore, developing a Solar park is necessary for Bihar to fulfill the target of RPO.
- · Other Solar Projects in Bihar:

Kajara Solar Plant, Lakhisarai	185 MW Solar PV Plant with a 254 MW battery energy storage system.	
Kadirabad Floating Solar power plant, Darbhanga	2 MW capacity	

- Government Schemes:
 - PM KUSUM Scheme: For installation of solar pumps in rural areas to reduce dependence on the grid.
 - Rooftop Solar Scheme: To harness solar power by installing Solar panels on rooftops.
 - Solar Park Scheme: To build a number of Solar Parks in India with a capacity of nearly 500 MW.

Glauconite and Nickel-Chromium Mining in Bihar

Context

The Union government has issued a Notice for Inviting people for tender of Nickel-Chromium mines in **Aurangabad** and **Rohtas** Districts of Bihar.

- Since November 2023, the Central government has been issuing orders for the development of these mines in Bihar.
- By Including these mines, 9 Mineral Blocks have been identified as 'Very Important Mines' in the state.

Note: There are four levels of exploration G1, G2, G3, and G4 where G stands for 'Geological'.

Uses of Minerals

- Nickel (Ni)-Chromium (Cr):
 - Nickel is used in steel to increase tensile strength and hardness, and also improves corrosion resistance.
 - 2. Chromium is used in steel to improve oxidation and corrosion resistance.
- PGE Mineral: used for LED panel making.
- Platinum: used in Jewellery.

Mukhyamantri Jan Arogya Yojana

Context

The Bihar government has decided to give health Insurance of Rs.5 lakh to 58 lakh Families in the state.

About the Yojana

- Under the National Food Security Act (NFSA)-2013, a total of 1.79 crore families are listed from Bihar and out of these a total of 1.21 crore families are insured under the Ayushman Bharat PM Jan Arogya Yojana, thus approximately 58 lakh families are not covered in the Ayushman Bharat PM JAY Scheme.
- So, the Bihar Government has decided to provide health insurance to these 58 lakh deprived families.

- Under "Mukhyamantri Jan Arogya Yojana" these deprived families will get Insurance of Rs. 5 lakh per year.
- The Health and Supply Department, Government of Bihar will be the implementing agency of this scheme.
- Eligibility: Beneficiary must be a resident of Bihar and must have a Ration card.

Avushman Bharat PM-JAY

1. Launched by	PM Narendra Modi on September 23, 2018, from Ranchi.
2. Monetary Coverage	Up to 5 lakh per family per year, for secondary and tertiary care hospitalization.
3. Beneficiary	PM-JAY primarily targets the poor, deprived rural families and identified occupational categories of Urban workers as per the latest SECC (Socio Economic and Caste Census) data. Approximately 10.74 crore families were identified (approximately 50 crore beneficiaries).
4. Funding	Centrally sponsored scheme

Bihar State Fasal Sahayata Yojana

Context

Bihar government aims to bring 1.5 crore farmers under Fasal Sahayata Yojana in the next 5 years.

More about the news

- **1. Five Lakh** Farmers will be brought under the benefits of Kisan Credit Card in the next 5 years.
- **2.** Rs. **541 crore** has been allocated under the Fasal Sahayata Scheme for the financial year 2024-25.
- **3. PACS** (Primary Agriculture Credit Society) would be developed as a multipurpose centre with facilities like CSP Centers, Generic Medicines, fertilizers, pesticides, drones for spraying pesticides, and Petrol outlets available for the farmers.
- **4.** In the first phase, 105 PACS have been selected for the **Jan Aushadhi Centre.**
- **5.** Godowns have been constructed at 6073 PACS with an additional storage capacity of 15.12 lakh metric tonnes.

Bihar State Fasal Sahayta Yojana

- The Scheme was Launched in 2018 by CM Nitish Kumar.
- The scheme strives to back farmers with financial incentives in the event of a crop loss due to natural calamities.
- Benefits:
 - 1. Rs 7500 per hectare, if crop loss is less than 20%.
 - 2. Rs 10,000 per hectare, if crop loss is more than 20%.

JEEVIKA Library

Context

Jeevika Library in Bihar is to be opened in **434** more blocks.

Objective of JEEVIKA Library: Its objective is to support Rural education through libraries.

Key Points

- In an attempt to support rural education, it is scheduled to be opened in every block of Bihar.
- In **Kurkuri** village of the **Phulwari** block, the **101st** library will be opened soon.
- Libraries are currently running in 100 blocks of 32 districts.
- Each of these libraries is monitored by the Vidya Didis.

- It runs for eight hours a day.
- Each library has a digital library facility and about one thousand books.
- There will be a children's section in all libraries.



Books available under Jeevika Library:

- Contemporary Magazine;
- · Daily Newspaper;
- Administrative services books;
- BPSC, Railway, Banking examination books.

Facilities under Library

- Guidance for preparing for jobs and competitive exams.
- Career counselling from experts for rural talents.
- · Conducting short training courses.
- Assistance programme for women who have missed their studies to get admission to education institutions.

Infrastructure Development in Bihar

Context

On 21st February 2024, CM Nitish Kumar inaugurated a total of **3618** projects worth Rs. 4446.188 crore from Patna.

More about the news

 Of the total 3618 projects, there are 3590 rural roads and 28 road bridges. These roads and bridges have been constructed by the Rural Works Department, Bihar under different schemes of the State.

Details of development projects

- The target of six hours to reach the capital Patna from any remote area of the State has been achieved. Now work is being done on the target of Five hours.
- The annual budget of the Rural Works Department which was only Rs. 1390 crore in FY 2007-08, has now been increased to Rs. 11,569 crores in FY 2023-24.
- Mukhyamantri Gramin Sadak Unnayan Yojana: This scheme was launched in 2023, for the maintenance and widening of rural roads in Bihar.

Turn the Bus App

Context

The Bihar Rural Livelihood Programme, **JEEVIKA** has added more than 1 lakh children with **Turn** the Bus App in Bihar.


More about the news

- In December 2023, JEEVIKA ran a special campaign in different districts of Bihar to engage rural and economically backward students with this app.
- For the students unable to take tuition or coaching classes due to financial constraints or any other reasons, JEEVIKA launched a special campaign targeting their preparation for the 10th and 12th Board exams.
- Last year 1,85,000 students of class 10th and 12th took digital classes on this app for their board exam.

 JEEVIKA has also signed an MoU with Turn the Bus App in 2019 in Patna.

About the App

- This app was Launched in 2018 by a USA-based Edtech non-profit organization.
- This app is like other e-education apps that provide digital education. This App has features like online classes, online tutorials, quizzes, NCERT materials, and question-answer sections.
- Mission: To reduce income inequality by reducing educational inequality with the help of smartphones.
- Partners of this App: JEEVIKA, BSEB Patna, Tech organizations like- Amazon, Microsoft, Democracy Labs, etc, and Higher Institutions like IIM Calcutta, etc.



Destination Bihar Expo 2024

Context

On 23 February 2024, CM Nitish Kumar launched **Destination Bihar Expo-2024,** in Gandhi Maidan, Patna.

More about the news

- This five-day Expo was organized by the Bihar Industry Association and CREDAI (The Confederation of Real Estate Developers' Associations of India).
- Approximately 250 companies and more than 400 stalls from across the country have displayed their products and services at the Expo.
- Stalls of different departments and undertakings of the State government were also set up.
- Objective of the Expo: It will increase the investment in MSME and other industrial sectors in the state.
 This will increase the rate of industrialization and employment opportunities in the state.

 During this Expo, a conference was also organized to discuss the "NEW IT POLICY - 2024" of the Bihar government.

New IT Policy 2024

- · Launched in January 2024 by the Government of Bihar
- Duration: Five years.
- Under the policy, fixed capital investments up to Rs 30 crore are eligible for a 30% subsidy. Additionally, an option of 10% interest subvention up to Rs 40 crore for five years is also available.
- Investors can avail Lease Rental Subsidy of 50% of the rental value for a period of five years. Additionally, they can also get a 25% electricity tariff subsidy for five years.

Bihar Integrated Water Resource Management (BIWRM) Project

Context

The Department of Economic Affairs, Ministry of Finance recently approved the proposal of financial help to Bihar from the **World Bank** for the water resource management project of the state.

More about the news

- The World Bank will provide financial assistance of Rs. 3090 crores for the BIWRM Project in Bihar. It is around 70% of the project cost and the remaining amount will be provided by the Bihar government.
- This project is proposed to be carried out in six years at an estimated cost of Rs. 4415 crore.

The objective of this Project

 Better management of water resources in the state, minimizing the risk of floods in Bihar, and creation of additional irrigation potential in the state.

Development Works Proposed Under BIWRM Project

- Targets of schemes like "Jal Jeevan Hariyali Abhiyaan" and "Har Khet tak Sinchayi ka Pani" will be fulfilled.
- 2. The Early Warning System of State will be modernized.
- **3.** Study of old Barrage strength and maintenance of the Barrage will be carried out.
- **4.** Funds will be used for the various **River Interlinking Projects** in Bihar, etc.

Simaria Dham

Context

On 24 February 2024, CM Nitish Kumar inaugurated development works in Simaria Dham, Begusarai.

More about the news

Simaria Dhamis being rejuvenated

Highlights of the scheme of Water Resources Department

- · 550-meter-long staircase wharf and River Front
- · Security ring in the river parallel to the ghat
- Changing Room
- Place for Ganga Aarti
- Pavilion for Religious Rituals
- Sitting arrangement for devotees- Dharamshala complex, Toilet Complex
- Development of Kalpavas area in one lakh square meters, attractive lighting and plantation
- Beautiful Pathways
- Parking Facilities
- Watchtower etc.
- To develop Simaria Dham on the lines of Haridwar's Har Ki Pouri Dham, CM Nitish Kumar laid the foundation stone for the revitalization of the Simaria Dham a cultural epicentre along the Ganga, on 30 May 2023.
- The Water Resource Department has developed a staircase ghat, changing room, Ganga Aarti place, parking, 3-story Dharamsala, etc. at a cost of about Rs. 115 Crore for the convenience of the devotees.
- This development work is being carried out under the "Riverfront Scheme" of the water resource department.
- Revitalization of Simaria Dham will establish the place as a pilgrimage site and tourism site which will increase tourism, and employment opportunities in the region and will boost the socio-economic condition of people in the region.

Simaria Dham

- Simaria Ghat is situated on the left bank of the Uttar Vahini Ganga River famous for spiritual and religious point of view from the ancient era itself.
- Simaria Dham has the distinction of being an important place for "Kumbha Sthali" and "Kalpwas fair" since the Vedic era.
- It is believed that since the time of Raja Videh, the tradition of month-long Kalpvas Mela has continued in Simaria Dham.
- Kalpwas fair is held every year in the month of Kartik. The government of Bihar accorded State fair status to Kalpvas fair in 2012.
- Even for the **last rites**, it is considered the most sacred place in the entire Mithila region.

Tourism Sites in Bihar

Context

The Ministry of Minority Affairs for the first time, has asked for information from the Government of Bihar about the specialities and religious connections of **70 sites** in the state.

More about the news

- The Ministry of Minority Affairs selected these sites from the database of the Archaeological Survey of India (ASI).
- The objective of the Ministry for this data collection is to know the status of maintenance work and other arrangements related to the protection of these sites.
- These 70 sites have been selected from 17 different districts of Bihar.

State-Level Fellowship Scheme

Context

The Department of Education, Govt. of Bihar will launch a State-level Fellowship scheme to increase research and innovation in the state.

More about the news

- This scheme will be launched in FY 2024-25 to increase the research and innovation in higher education in the state.
- **Beneficiary:** There is a proposal to provide benefits to **meritorious students** of all socially and economically weaker sections.
- A committee will be established by the Bihar State Higher Education Council to select researchers. This committee will scrutinize online applications received by the researchers and then select the best of them.
- Coverage: Fellowship will be provided to the respective students for studying in foreign as well as Indian institutions.
- Every year 400 to 450 meritorious students (all subjects students eligible) of Bihar will be given a fellowship to pursue PhD.
- Outlay: Approximately Rs 6 to 8 crore will be spent every year.
- Researchers will be provided Rs 10-12 thousand every month.

Other Initiative

Student Credit Card: A scholarship of up to Rs.4
 Lakh is provided per student under this scheme (to study in 42 different subjects).

Health Care Development Projects in Bihar

Context

Recently in Bihar, healthcare development projects like PMCH redevelopment work, E-Kshamata app, monitoring and implementation of the U-WIN Portal, Tele Monitoring Cell, etc were implemented.

More about the news

PMCH Development Work:

 On 27 February 2024 CM Nitish Kumar inaugurated the first phase of the redevelopment project of PMCH.

Redevelopment works include-

- 1. OPD block of 20 departments, Blood Bank, and medical store.
- Green GIS Power Sub Station, 550-bed Girl's Hostel, Multi-level Parking, etc.
- In February 2021, CM Nitish Kumar launched the redevelopment project of PMCH with the vision to make it a world-class public healthcare facility centre in the state.
- The project aims to develop PMCH as a 5462-bed hospital, with the completion of development works in 3 phases by 2028.

History of PMCH

- In 1874, it was established as a Temple Medical College (TMC) by the Britishers.
- On 25th February 1925, TMC was renamed as Prince of Wales Medical College, Patna

e-Kshamata App

- To increase the skills and learning capacity of nursing students in the state.
- The Health Department of Bihar in collaboration with **Aastrika Foundation** launched this app.
- Benefits: Online study material of ANM and GNM courses, online training facilities, online tests, etc.
- These facilities are available free of cost to all 121 Nursing College students.

Immunization program Monitoring

 Due to the proper implementation of the Aadarsh Immunisation Center and Corners, U-WIN Portal and Tele Monitoring Cell in Bihar, IMR (infant mortality rate) was reduced to 2 points further and now IMR is 27 points (for Bihar).

1. U-WIN Portal

- For the electronic registry of maintaining all routine immunization work like the Co-WIN Portal.
- The U-WIN portal acts like a one-stop solution for India's Universal Immunization program, record of all vaccinations of children and pregnant mothers, etc are recorded by this portal.
- The portal was Launched in 2023 by the Government of India.

2. (Children friendly) Adarsh Immunisation Centre and Corners	 260 centres established in the state. Objective: for immunization of children Launched: In 2021 Health Department, Bihar launched these centers in 35 districts initially.

- A total of 1371 bird species have been found in the country.
- Due to the reduction in Bird species in the state, it is likely to have a deep impact on the ecosystem in the coming days.
- This Bird count was done by: The Zoological Survey of India (ZSI), WWF, Mandar Nature Club, and professional Bird experts and students.

- Method of Counting: Bird counting is done by the "Point Counting Method". For this photos of the Birds are collected by experts, and cameras are equipped with GPS.
- Top Counts Districts: 1. Paschim Champaran 2. Bhagalpur, 3. Jamui, 4. Patna.
- Top Hotspots region: 1. Jagatpur Lake (Bhagalpur),

- This amount will be spent on programmes like Jeevika, Saat Nischay-2, and Women's Health, Education, Employment, Welfare, etc.

About Gender Budget in Bihar

- The Gender Budget in Bihar was presented in FY 2008-09, for the first time.
- The main objective of this Budget is to ensure proper implementation of different schemes for the development and promotion of women.
- The Schemes are divided into two categories under this Budget:

Category-A	100% Expenditure on women	Schemes and Programmes which are fully allocated for the welfare of women and girls.
Category-B	> 30% and < 100% Expenditure on women	Any schemes in which some components are related to women and girls welfare.

Child Welfare Budget 2024-25

 A total of Rs 55,000 crore, which is 16% of the total Budget will be spent on different children's welfare programmes in the state in FY 2024-25.

About Child Welfare Budget in Bihar

- The Child Welfare Budget in Bihar was presented for the First time in the FY 2013-14.
- After Kerala and Assam, Bihar was the 3rd State of India to present a children's Budget.
- Under this Budget amount has been spent on the health, education, and welfare of children below the age of 18.

Panch Pran Programme

Context

On the occasion of Bihar Police Week, the Panch Pran (oath) was administered to all Police personnel in the state.

- Scientists of the Geological Survey of India(GSI)
 confirmed the presence of these minerals in this
 550 sq KM area of forest.
- Now, the Company selected for exploration work will mark the place where the large reserve of these minerals exists and also find out the amount of these minerals present.

- By SUVIDHA App farmers can apply for free electricity connection.

National Dolphin Research Center, Patna

Context

On 4 March 2024, CM Nitish Kumar inaugurated the National Dolphin Research Center (NDRC), at Patna.

More about the news

 NDRC is the first Dolphin Research Center not only in India but also in the entire Asia. This centre has been established near the Ganga River on the premises of Patna University.

- Renowned Gangetic Dolphin expert, RK Sinha proposed the idea of NDRC, a decade ago.
- The Project got approval in 2013 and CM Nitish Kumar laid the foundation stone of this centre in 2020.


The objective of NDRC

- Scientists will do research on the various aspects of the Dolphin behaviour in their natural habitat, and study factors such as food habits, Survival Skills, Cause of death, and adaptation to climate change of the Gangetic Dolphin in this centre.
- NDRC will also play a crucial role in training fishermen on methods to avoid accidentally harming dolphins during fishing activities.
- Thus, the centre will play a crucial role in conducting research and conservation of the Gangetic Dolphin.
- The other objective is to establish NDRC as a **Center of Excellence** for Gangetic Dolphin Research.

About Gangetic Dolphin

- The Gangetic River dolphin is one of the four Freshwater Dolphin Species in the World.
 - 1. Yangtze River in China [now Extinct]
 - 2. Indus River in Pakistan
 - 3. Amazon River in South America.
- In Bihar the Ganga River Dolphins are found at the -
 - Confluence of the Ganga and Gandak at Doriganj, in the Saran

· Characteristics:

- Gangetic Dolphins are blind and find their path and Prey in river water through Echolocation [By emitting sound (Ultrasonic Sound)].
- Gangetic dolphins prefer to live in water that is at least 5 to 8 feet deep and a zone where there is little or no current.

· Significance:

 As Gangetic Dolphins live in freshwater, they act as a reliable indicator of the River Ecosystem.

Important facts

- In 2009, the Government of India declared the Gangetic Dolphin as a National Aquatic Animal and 5th October as a National Ganga River Dolphin Day.
- This Dolphin is mainly found in the Ganga-Brahmaputra River and their tributaries in India, Nepal, and Bangladesh.

Air Pollution in Bihar

Context

In a recently released IIT Delhi report, 8 districts of Bihar were declared as **Hot Spot districts** in air pollution.

More about the news

- Bihar State Pollution Control Board (BSPCB) with the help of IIT Delhi has conducted a study on the sources of Air Pollution in Bihar.
- In this report mainly six sources of Air Pollution are identified.

Sources of Air Pollution in the State

Key Findings of Report

- Hot-Spot Districts: Patna, Vaishali, Samastipur, Saharsa, Purnia, Bhagalpur, Rohtas and Banka.
- The contribution of Transport and Solid Waste Trash in Bihar air pollution is 20%.
- In Transport Sector Pollution: Only Patna district is declared as Hot-Spot district.
- For Household uses Biomass (Cow dung, Wood, etc) is still used in Patna, Vaishali, and Samastipur.
- **Highest Air Pollution from Agriculture:** In four districts, Saharsa, Rohtas, Bhagalpur, and Purnia.

Government initiatives to curb air pollution in the state

- Patna Clean Air Action Plan- Launched by BSPCB to tackle Air Pollution in the City by taking Scientific measures regarding air pollution.
- Ban old Public Diesel Vehicles in the City and promote CNG/Electric Vehicles.
- "Integrated Dashboard for Air Quality Monitoring Center" established in all 543 Blocks of the state.
- Draft of "Climate Resilient and Low Carbon Development Pathway for Bihar"-For the Sustainable environmental development in the state.

Bihar Governor Carried Lord Buddha's Holy Relics to Thailand

Context

A 22-member delegation led by the Governor of Bihar, Shri Rajendra Vishwanath Arlekar and Union Minister of Social Justice and Empowerment Dr. Virendra Kumar has carried the Sacred Relics of Lord Buddha to Thailand, for 26 days exposition in Thailand.

More about the news

- The Holy relics of Lord Buddha and his two honoured disciples, Arahata Sariputra, and Arahata Maudgalayana, are set to embark on a sacred journey to Thailand on 22 February 2024.
- Four bone Fragments of Lord Buddha (acknowledged as Kapilvastu Relics) are presently kept at the National Museum and will be taken to Thailand.
- For The first time, the relics of Buddha disciples Arahata Sariputra and Arahata Maudgalayana from

- **Sanchi (M.P)** were carried along with the relics of Lord Buddha.
- These sacred relics are showcased at multiple venues across Thailand, allowing devotees and enthusiasts to pay homage to these revered artefacts.



- These sacred relics are also exhibited during the "Makha Bucha Festival" such that common people pay their reverence to the sacred relics.
- These Relics fall under the "AA (Rare) category" of antiquities and art treasures. This means these relics are not meant to be lent for exhibition, within India or in foreign countries.
- However, on the Special request of the Thailand government, the Exhibition of these relics was held in Thailand.
- In the past, Relics were taken to Sri Lanka (1976, 2012), Mongolia (1993, 2022), Singapore (1994, 2007), South Korea (1995), and Thailand (1995).

Significance of this Event

 This is a landmark event in the India-Thailand relationship that highlights the civilizational connection between the two countries. This cultural event is also part of India's Act East Policy to strengthen ties with South East Asian countries.



Increasing Road Accidents in Bihar

Context

A Survey conducted by the Traffic Police of Bihar reveals that more than 8898 people died in Bihar in 2023 in road accidents.

More about the news

- This Traffic Police Survey report said that the maximum number of people (around 3345) who died in a road accident in 2023 were Pedestrians.
- In this report mainly 8 reasons were found for road accidents in Bihar.
- Due to vehicle overturning, the collision with a vehicle, crossing the road by running, and not following the traffic rules (like wearing Hamlets, fastening the seat belt, etc).
- According to NCRB's "Accidental Deaths and Suicides in India 2022" report, Bihar ranks 13th in the country. As per the report, Bihar Road accidents in 2022 increased by 13.1% with respect to the year 2021.

Bihar government initiative to curb road accidents

- Traffic Police Station: In 2023, the state government opened 28 more Traffic Police Stations (earlier 12 traffic police opened), such that Traffic management in the state is properly managed.
- Highway Police Patrol Force: The state government deployed the Highway Patrol Force along the National Highway to reduce road accidents in the state.
- Liquor Prohibition in Bihar: Bihar imposed a complete liquor ban in the state in 2016. Due to this decision road accidents in Bihar also reduced.
- Installation of Camera: Bihar police also installed cameras at various places such that if any person violates traffic rules (overspeed, wrong-way driving, etc.), then police issue E-Challans to them.
- National Road Safety Week: To increase awareness about road safety to curb road accidents, National Road Safety Week is celebrated from 11th to 17th January 2024.

Medical Education in Bihar

Context

Very soon Diploma of National Board (DNB) course and admission in 22 new Nursing Institutes will be started in Bihar.

More about the News

- The Government of Bihar, is planning to start DNB Courses in all District Hospitals and other State main Hospitals.
- From this, 100 DNB seats at the PG level will be increased in the state, which will help provide better health facilities to the people of Bihar.
- Studying Medical students in this course also provided their health services in the hospitals.
- Recognition for the DNB Course is given by the National Board of Examination for Medical Sciences.

22 New Nursing Colleges Opened in Bihar

- From this Session, Admission of students will take place in all 22 new ANM, GNM, and BSc Nursing Institutes in the state.
- Now, 1320 new seats for Nursing added to the nursing course in the state.
- This helps in the improvement of the healthcare facilities in the state.

Current Status of Healthcare Facilities in Bihar

- As per the 5th edition of the NITI Aayog Health Index 2020-21, Bihar's ranking is 19th among the large states.
- In Bihar, Doctor Population ratio is around one doctor per 22,000 people at government Hospitals, While WHO recommended Doctor to Population is 1: 1,000.
- Bihar also suffering with poor healthcare infrastructure, less number of Nursing Staff, and healthcare officials.

Significance of the above projects

 DNB Course pursuing medical students have already completed their MBBS, So they also provide health care services in the Hospitals along with their studies, this helps in overcoming the shortage of doctors in the state.

 Bihar also faces a shortage of trained Medical Nurses, the Newly established ANM or GNM and BSc nursing colleges will help in overcoming this problem.

Inauguration of Agriculture Schemes in Bihar

Context

On 15 March 2024, CM Nitish Kumar inaugurated several schemes of the Agriculture Department, Bihar.

More about the news

- CM Nitish Kumar launched the Four "Agriculture Knowledge Vehicles" from Patna. The objective of these vehicles is to provide information about modern agriculture methodology to the farmers.
- Under the 4th Agriculture Road Map, there
 is a provision to provide Modern Agriculture
 information to the farmers of the state.
- CM Nitish Kumar inaugurated/laid the foundation stone of 20 schemes (related to Agriculture), worth 811 crore rupees.
- · Schemes Launched by CM Nitish Kumar:
 - Bihar Nutritious Grain (Millets) Development Scheme
 - Bihar Maize Development Scheme

- 2. The population of the state is increasing so there is a need for these townships of the cities.
- 3. The main town of the city is already overpopulated.

- This mission was launched in the year 2015 by the Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs.

- The Home Department related to this Bihar police special branch constable and Bihar police special branch sub-inspector Rules 2024 has been approved.
- A special training will be provided to this cadre forces.

 All the recruitment of this special branch will be done separately.

Need of this Special Cadre Police

- According to the National Crime Records Bureau (NCRB), "Crime in India-2022" report, Bihar topped in ATM frauds and disputes (especially related to land and property) in India.
- Overall, Bihar recorded a 23% surge in the number of crimes under the Indian Penal Code (IPC) and special and local laws (SLL), in comparison to 2021.
- With 4736 riots reported in 2022 in the state, the second highest in India after Maharashtra.

- Bihar also registered a 35% rise in forgery/cheating and fraud incidents in 2022.
- Around 50,000 cases registered in Bihar every year related to liquor since the Bihar Liquor Prohibition Act came into effect.
- Also, Bihar ranked 2nd in Murder cases and ranked
 3rd in kidnapping and abduction cases in the country.
- Thus, there is a need for improvement of the lawand-order situation in Bihar.
- To make Bihar as a Startup Hub in the country, attracting foreign investment in the state and developing Bihar a manufacturing destination, the state government must free Bihar from crime and illegal activity.

Supreme Court declared Electoral Bonds Unconstitutional

Context


In a unanimous judgment, the Supreme Court declared the Electoral Bond as unconstitutional and manifestly arbitrary. The judgment is given by a **5-judge bench** headed by CJI D.Y Chandrachud.

More About the News

- The judgment held that the scheme and the preceding amendments made to the Representation of People Act, Companies Act, and Income Tax Act violated the voter's Right to Information about political funding under Article 19(1) (a).
- The court observed that the scheme promoted economic inequalities as the corporations with financial power gained an advantage over ordinary citizens.
- So, the Issuance of Electoral Bonds to be stopped now.

Electoral Bonds

- It provides a mechanism for individuals and organizations to contribute political parties, ensuring the anonymity of the donors.
- It was introduced in 2017 with the aim to bring transparency to political donations, and they were rolled out in 2018.
- Electoral Bonds are available at selected branches of the State Bank of India.
- These bonds were purchased either by an individual on their own or in partnership with others.
- The name of the donor is not disclosed on the Electoral Bond.
- Only political parties that are officially recognized under Section 29A of the Representation of People Act 1951 and have received at least 1% of the total votes in the most recent elections to the Lok Sabha or state assemblies were eligible to receive funds through these bonds.



Demand of Full Statehood in Ladakh

Context

Recently, people in Ladakh came on to the streets, demanding full Statehood and Ladakh's inclusion in the **Sixth Schedule** to safeguard their land, culture, language, and environment.

Current status of Ladakh

- After the abrogation of Article 370 in 2019, Ladakh was announced as a Union territory of India.
- Ladakh don't have a legislature, unlike J&K.

What is the Sixth Schedule

- The Sixth Schedule under Article 244 provides for the formation of autonomous administrative divisions for the tribals that have some legislative, judicial, and administrative autonomy within a state.
- Currently Assam, Meghalaya, Tripura, and Mizoram are in the sixth schedule.

Features of the Sixth Schedule

- The Sixth Schedule provides for the creation of Autonomous District Councils in certain tribal areas of the North-Eastern states.
- All District Councils have the power to make laws on a range of subjects such as the allotment of land, use of water courses, and inheritance of property.

- As per the constitution of India Autonomous District Council consists of not more than 30 members.
- Out of 30 members only 4 members can be nominated by the Governor of the state and the rest shall be elected.
- If there are different Scheduled Tribes in an autonomous district, the governor can separate them as **Autonomous Regions**.

Tribals in Ladakh

In Ladakh, 90% of the population belongs to the tribal community. Some of the tribes inhabiting Ladakh are as follows:

Privileges Committee of Lok Sabha

Context

The Privileges Committee of the Lok Sabha has recently issued a notice summoning the West Bengal Chief Secretary and other officers.

About Privilege Committee

- The Privileges Committee is a parliamentary committee present in both the Houses of Parliament.
- In Lok Sabha, this committee consists of 15 members nominated by the Speaker, while in Rajya Sabha it consists of 10 members nominated by the Chairman.
- Its primary function is to investigate questions involving the breach of privileges of the House or its members.
- The committee investigates each case to determine whether a breach of privilege has occurred or not.
- It submits appropriate recommendations in its report before the speaker or the Chairman.
- Any member of the House can raise a question involving a breach of privilege with the consent of the Speaker/Chairman.

Punishment

 If a member is found guilty, they may face suspension or expulsion from the House. For example, in 1978 Indira Gandhi was expelled from the House for the abuse of powers during Emergency.

Nutritional Needs of Adolescent Girls

Context

Recently, an agreement has been signed to address the nutritional needs of adolescent girls in five "Utkarsh" districts.

More about the News

- The Ministry of Women and Child Development and the Ayush Ministry have signed an agreement to implement Ayush interventions to address the nutritional needs of teenage girls in five "Utkarsh" districts.
- The 5 pilot districts are Dholpur in Rajasthan, Paschimi Singhbhum in Jharkhand, Bastar in Chhattisgarh, Gadchiroli in Maharashtra, and Dhubri in Assam.
- Both ministries have committed to create "Anaemia-Mukt Bharat" through the agreement.

Mission Utkarsh

- It was launched in January 2022.
- 15 central ministries and departments are working to improve the selected key performance indicators in bottom districts and bring them to the levels of state and national average.
- A programme known as "Rapid improvement of selected districts" aims to enhance few Key Performance Indicators (KPIs) in districts that the Central Ministries have shortlisted.

Objectives of Mission Utkarsh

- To improve the performance of the selected districts KPIs from the current/base level to state average within a year and to take them to national average or better within 2 years.
- To enhance performance throughout district's by utilizing the knowledge acquired through this Mission.

PM-JANMAN (Pradhan Mantri Janjati Adivasi Nyaya Maha Abhiyan)

- It was announced in the Union Budget 2023.
- It is a centrally sponsored scheme.



- It was launched by Prime Minister Narendra Modi on 15th November 2023, from the Khunti district of Jharkhand on the occasion of 'Janjatiya Gaurav Diwas' which is celebrated on the birth anniversary of Birsa Munda.
- Nearly 80% of the allocated amount is only for the construction of houses and roads.
- It was launched for the Financial Year 2023-24 to 2025-26 under the Development Action Plan for Scheduled Tribes (DAPST).

Aim of PM-JANMAN

- The objective is to reach 22,000 families belonging to Particularly Vulnerable Tribal Groups (PVTG) in 200 districts throughout the nation.
- It was launched to increase awareness and ensure that all government programmes are fully implemented in the PVTG majority tribal communities.

Pradhan Mantri Fasal Bima Yojana

More about the news


- An amount of Rs 31,130 crore was deposited by the farmers during this financial year.

About PMFBY

- The Pradhan Mantri Fasal Bima Yojana (PMFBY) scheme was launched by the Ministry of Agriculture & Farmers Welfare in New Delhi from the Kharif season of 2016 onwards.
- PMFBY is the Largest crop insurance scheme in the history of independent India and globally, the third largest scheme in terms of premium.

Objectives

- To Provide financial support to farmers suffering crop loss/damage arising out of unforeseen events.
- To Stabilize the income of farmers to ensure their continuance in farming.
- Encouraging farmers to adopt innovative and modern agricultural practices.
- Ensuring the flow of credit to the agriculture sector which will contribute to food security, crop diversification, and enhancing growth and competitiveness of the agriculture sector besides protecting farmers from production risks.



Sashakt Nari - Viksit Bharat Programme

Context

Recently, The Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi participated in Sashakt Nari– Viksit Bharat programme organized in New Delhi.

More about the programme

Namo Drone Didi's initiative

- · Under the initiative, rural women are given training to become drone pilots for agricultural purposes.
- · Aim of the initiative-
- To enhance financial autonomy of the women by economic empowerment, especially in rural areas.

- Around Rs 8,000 crore Bank loans were disbursed to Self Help Groups (SHGs) at subsidised interest rate.
- About Rs 2,000 crore Capitalization Support Fund was given to SHGs by the PM.

Context

Recently, GOI announced the extension of Rs 300 per LPG cylinder subsidy to poor women under Ujjwala.

About the Ujjwala Scheme

- Pradhan Mantri Ujjwala Yojana is a scheme launched by the Ministry of Petroleum & Natural Gas to provide LPG connections to women from Below Poverty Line (BPL) households.
- The scheme was launched on 1st May 2016 in Ballia, Uttar Pradesh.



Objectives of the scheme

- To promote women's empowerment
- · To provide clean cooking fuel
- To prevent hazardous health related issues among

the millions of rural population due to use of fossil fuel.

Eligibility Criteria

- The applicant should be women above the age of 18 years.
- The applicant must be a rural inhabitant carrying a BPL card.
- The women applicant should have a savings bank account in any nationalized bank across the country to receive subsidy amount.
- The applicant's household should not already own a LPG connection.

Note: According to WHO in 1990 indoor pollution killed 1.9 million Indians pre-maturely. After LPG came this number started to decline.

ECONOMICS

Railway Infrastructure Projects

Context

Recently, PM launched 2000 railway infrastructure projects worth Rs 41,000 crores. Around 25,000 crore will be spent under Amrit Bharat Station.

Amrit Bharat Station

- The government has laid the foundation stone of rail overbridges and underbridges as part of an initiative to modernize important railway stations.
- Currently, the plan calls for the modernization and upgrading of 1309 stations throughout the Indian Railway network.
- Thirty-three Railway Stations from Bihar have been selected for special attention under this initiative.
- It involves creating Master Plans and executing them in phases to enhance various station facilities.

Features of Amrit Bharat Station

- One of the most important aspects is the availability of specific areas in stations, like Executive Lounges and spaces for small business meetings, to accommodate various passenger requirements.
- The plan also prioritizes the building of high-level platforms for all station categories, with platforms typically extending up to 600 meters and measuring between 760 and 840 mm in height.

 Essential facilities are provided, such as restrooms, Divyangjan (specially abled people) facilities, escalators, furniture in the waiting-hall, and free Wi-Fi Connectivity.

Important fact

- In 2023, the Indian Railway carried 1512 MT of freight in addition to serving 3.52 billion passengers.
- Every day, it runs more than 13,000 trains, linking 7,325 stations around the country.

India-EFTA Trade and Economic Partnership Agreement


Context

- Member countries: Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway and Switzerland.





- KLIP is the world's largest multi-stage lift irrigation project.
- This project is located on the confluence of the rivers **Pranhita** and **Godavari** in Telangana.
- A series of underground and surface water pumping stations are the striking features of this project.

Benefit of the Project

- It will increase water availability for irrigation and drinking purposes.
- It will increase groundwater levels in Telangana.
- Water conservation programmes like Mission Kakatiya and Mission Bhagirath will be boosted by this project.

Godavari River

- The Godavari is the **second longest river in India**.
- · It is also known as the Dakshin Ganga.
- **Origin-** Trimbakeshwar Hill near Nasik in Maharashtra.


Coronal Mass Ejection

Context

The Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) said that the Plasma Analyser Package for Aditya (PAPA) payload onboard the Aditya-L1 has detected the impact of Coronal Mass Ejections (CMEs).

NATIONAL

Features of PAPA



- **1.** PAPA is an energy and mass analyzer intended for low energy in-situ measurements of solar wind ions and electrons.
- 2. The Solar Wind Electron Energy Probe (SWEEP) and the Solar Wind Ion Composition Analyser are its two sensors.
- **3.** The sensors can also determine which way solar wind particles are arriving.

About Coronal Mass Ejection

- Coronal Mass Ejections (CMEs) are large expulsions of plasma and magnetic fields from the Sun's corona (Outermost layer of the Sun). They can eject billions of tons of coronal material and carry an embedded magnetic field.
- CMEs travel outward from the Sun at speeds ranging from less than 250 kilometers per second (km/s) to as fast as nearly 3000 km/s.
- The fastest Earth-directed CMEs can reach our planet in as little as 15-18 hours. Slower CMEs can take several days to arrive.

Northern Pintail

Context

Recently, dozens of Northern Pintail, a migratory duck, were found dead in **Pulicat Lake**. The suspected reason for the death is fertilizer or pesticide ingestion.


About Northern pintail

- The Northern pintail is a migratory duck species with wide geographic distribution.
- They breed in the Arctic region of Eurasia and North America.
- They migrate to India by November and stay in India till March, then they return to their breeding grounds.
- The Northern pintail can be found in a variety of habitats in India including wetlands, lakes and paddy fields.

 Some of the key sites for the Northern Pintails in India include Pulicat Lake (Andhra Pradesh and Tamil Nadu), Chilika Lake (Odisha), Keoladeo National Park (Rajasthan) and Dal Lake (Jammu and Kashmir).

National Board for Wildlife

Context

Recently, the National Board for Wildlife (NBWL) approved an elevated road project near Kaziranga National Park in Assam.

 NBWL also approved two elevated railway corridors skirting Deepor Beel, a major wetland and designated a Ramsar Site in Assam.

About National Board for Wildlife (NBWL)

- The National Board for Wildlife was established in the year 2003 under the Wildlife Protection Act, 1972.
- Composition of the NBWL- The NBWL is chaired by the Prime Minister. It has 47 members including the Prime Minister.
- The Minister of Environment Forest and Climate Change chairs the standing committee of NBWL.

Kaziranga National Park

- · Location- Golaghat and Nagaon districts of Assam.
- · Status-
- It was declared a National Park in 1974.
- It was declared a Tiger Reserve in 2007.
- It was declared a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 1985.
- It is recognized as an Important Bird Area by BirdLife International.
- The 'big four' species of the Kaziranga National Park —The greater one-horned rhino, Elephant, Royal Bengal tiger, and Asiatic water buffalo.
- National Highway 37 passes through it.
- · Diphlu River drains through it.
- Vegetation- Tropical moist deciduous forests and tropical semi-evergreen forests, tall grasses, open jungle, and short grasses.
- It reviews all wildlife-related matters and approves projects in and around national parks and sanctuaries.

NATIONAL

- Alteration of boundaries in national parks and wildlife sanctuaries can be done with approval of the NBWL only.
- The role of the National Board for Wildlife is advisory in nature.

Deepor Beel

- · Location- Kamrup district, Assam.
- It is a **riverine wetland**, situated in a former channel of the Brahmaputra River.
- It is the **only Ramsar Site in Assam**. It was designated as Ramsar site in November, 2002.

State of India's Environment Report 2024

Context

The State of India's Environment Report 2024, published by the Centre for Science and Environment (CSE), was released on February 28, 2024, at the Anil Agarwal Environmental Training Institute in Nimli, Rajasthan.

About Report

- It is compiled and released by Down To Earth magazine every year.
- According to data presented in the report, 109
 countries experienced losses as a result of extreme
 weather events in 2023, with the majority of these
 countries being in Africa, Europe, and West Asia.

States	Incidents

- Libya experienced the highest number of deaths, while Indonesia experienced the greatest number of affected individuals (nearly 19 million).
- India experienced its warmest August and September in 122 years in 2023.
- In India due to extreme weather conditions that lead to damage of 86,432 homes, 3,287 human lives, affected 2.21 million hectares of crop area, and killed 124,813 animals.
- It impacted all 36 states and the Union territories of India.

 Himachal Pradesh recorded the highest number of extreme weather events, with 149 days, followed by Madhya Pradesh with 141 days. Kerala and Uttar Pradesh were next with 119 days each.

Sea Slug named after President

Context

Recently, a new marine species of head-shield Sea Slug was named after President Droupadi Murmu by the Zoological survey of India(ZSI).

About Head-shield Sea Slug

- The newly discovered species belongs to Melanochlamys genus of Phylum Mollusca.
- The new species of head-shield sea slug is named as Melanochlamys draupadi.
- This species was discovered from Digha of West Bengal coast and Udaipur of Odisha coast.

Morphological features

- It is a small invertebrate with a maximum length of up to 7 mm.
- It is brownish-black in colour with a ruby-red spot.
- It has a short, blunt, and cylindrical body and a smooth dorsal surface.
- It has two dorsal equal or unequal shields, named the anterior cephalic and posterior shield.

Zoological Survey of India(ZSI)

- The Zoological Survey of India is a subordinate organization under the Ministry of Environment and Forests.
- · It was established in 1916.
- It is headquartered in Kolkata and has 16 Regional centres.
- The objective of the ZSI is to promote survey, exploration, research, and documentation on various aspects of animal taxonomy in the Indian subcontinent.
- ZSI acts as a designated repository for the National Zoological Collection as per section 39 of the National Biodiversity Act, 2002.
- · It publishes the Red Data Book on Indian Animals.

International Big Cat Alliance

Context

Recently, the **Prime minister Narendra Modi** has announced to establish the **headquarter of International Big Cat Alliance in India (IBCA).**

More about the News

 It will have the allocation of Rs 150 crore from the Centre.

International Big Cats Alliance (IBCA)

The Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi inaugurated the program 'Commemoration of 50 years of Project Tiger'at Mysuru and launched the International Big Cats Alliance (IBCA) is focused on the protection & conservation of seven major big cat species in the world. Like Tiger, Lion, Leopard, Snow Leopard, Puma, Jaguar, and Cheetah.



- It will serve as a common platform and a centralised repository of successful practices for conservation of seven big cats namely Tiger, Lion, Leopard, Snow leopard, Cheetah, Jaguar and Puma.
- Five of these tiger, lion, leopard, snow leopard and cheetah are found in India.
- The organization will be led by a Secretariat, a Standing Committee and a General assembly consisting of all members.
- It will be modelled on the line of the **International Solar Alliance.**
- The Union Cabinet, chaired by the prime minister, has approved a one-time budgetary support of Rs 150 crore for the IBCA for a five-year period, from 2023–24 to 2027–28.

International Big Cat Alliance (IBCA)

 It is a coalition of 96 nations that are home to big cats, as well as non-range nations that are interested in protecting big cats, scientific organizations, and conservation partners.

Illegal felling of trees in Jim Corbett National Park

Context

Recently, the Supreme Court condemned the illegal felling of over 6,000 trees to construct buildings at the Jim Corbett National Park in Uttarakhand.

Supreme Court Ruled

- The SC described it as a "classic case" of officials and politicians nexus to pollute the environment for purely profit-driven reasons.
- The Court also mandated that a specialized committee be established by the Ministry of Environment, Forests, and Climate Change to investigate and make recommendations regarding the permissibility of tiger safaris within the buffer areas of tiger reserves.
- The court authorized the Central Bureau of Investigation(CBI) to investigate the case and mandated that the agency submit its report within a three-month period.
- The Court also proposed a specialized committee consisting of National Tiger Conservation Authority (NTCA), Wildlife Institute of India, Central Empowered Committee and a Joint Secretary from the Ministry.
- The Court said that these errant individuals and officials would pay the restoration costs. The money would be used exclusively for forest restoration.
- The committee's guidelines would be applied on a pan-India basis.

National Park



An area of ecological, faunal, floral, geomorphological or zoological importance that needs to be protected to conserve wildlife can be declared as a national park.

A region may be designated as a National Park by the state government, regardless of whether it is inside a sanctuary or not.

No human activity is permitted inside the national park except for the ones permitted by the Chief Wildlife Warden of the state under the conditions given in CHAPTER IV, WPA 1972.

Jim Corbett National Park



It is located in Uttarakhand.

This national park was established as Hailey National Park in 1936.

Jim Corbett played an important role in its establishment, therefore this National Park was named on his name.

It is the oldest national park in India.

In 1973, this was the first area to be covered by Project Tiger.

Golden Langur in India

Context

The most recent study on primates in India estimated that there are 7,396 Golden langurs in India.

More about the news

- The detailed population estimation of the endangered primate was carried out in two phases by the Primate Research Centre NE India (PRCNE), Assam Forest Department, Bodoland Territorial Council, Salim Ali Centre for Ornithology and Natural History (SACON), and Conservation Himalayas.
- The entire distribution range of the Golden langur covers the Manas Biosphere Reserve and all fragmented forests in the western part of Assam e.g Raimona National Park — Chirang Reserve Forest, Manas National Park.

About the Golden Langur



- · It is an Old World monkey found in Assam.
- Adult males have a cream to golden coat with darker flanks while the females and juveniles are lighter.
- It lives in high trees and has a herbivorous diet of fruits, leaves, seeds, buds and flowers.
- IUCN status-Endangered



Geosynchronous Satellite Launch Vehicle

Context

Recently, ISRO has launched a new generation meteorological satellite INSAT-3DS.

INSAT-3DS



- The mission was launched on **February 17**, 2024.
- It is designed to conduct improved monitoring of the environment, oceans, atmosphere, and surface of the earth.
- In order to get its intended geostationary orbit, the satellite sent through the GSLV-F14 rocket.
- It is 16th mission of GSLV.

GSLV (Geosynchronous Satellite Launch Vehicle)

- It is a three stage 51.7 meter launch vehicle.
- It has a liftoff mass of 420 tonnes.
- The first stage comprises a solid propellant (\$139)
 motor having 139-ton propellant and four earthstorable propellant stages (L40) strapons which
 carry 40 tons of liquid propellant each.
- The second stage is an earth-storable propellant stage loaded with 40-ton propellant.
- The third stage is a cryogenic stage with a 15-ton propellant loading of liquid oxygen (LOX) and liquid hydrogen (LH2).

 GSLV can be used to launch a variety of spacecraft capable of performing communications, navigation, earth resource surveys, and any other proprietary mission.

Why GSLV is described as "naughty boy"

- GSLV has got the title "naughty boy" due to its inconsistent performance history.
- Before this, GSLV had made 15 flights, four of which were unsuccessful, which is a very high failure rate for any rocket.

Additional Information

- · PSLV has failed only twice in its 60 launches.
- The LVM3 rocket has flown seven times and never failed.

Bubonic Plague in Oregon (USA)


Context

Recently, health officials in Oregon, USA confirmed the first case of Bubonic plague in the state since the year 2005.

What is Bubonic plague?

- Bubonic Plague is an infectious and a zoonotic disease caused by a bacterium called Yersinia pestis.
- It derives it's name from the **swollen lymph nodes** (buboes), a symptom of the disease.
- It is also known as Black Death, due to the appearance of the dark patches on the skin of the infected individual.
- Zoonotic Disease- A disease or infection that can be transmitted naturally from vertebrate animals to humans or from humans to vertebrate animals. More than 60% of human pathogens are zoonotic in origin.
- **Symptoms of Bubonic plague:** It causes fever, headache, weakness and swollen lymph nodes.


Context

- The National Institute of High-Security Animal Disease in Bhopal confirmed that it was caused by the type A strain of the H5N1(Influenza Virus).
- These viruses naturally spread among wild aquatic birds worldwide and can infect domestic poultry and other bird and animal species.

About Bird Flu

- Bird flu refers to the disease caused by infection with avian (bird) influenza (flu) Type A viruses.
- Bird flu viruses do not normally infect humans.
 However, sporadic human infections with bird flu viruses have occurred.
- Some symptoms in humans: cough, diarrhea, respiratory difficulties, fever, headache, muscle aches, malaise etc.


Digital Health Platform

What is Digital Health

 Digital health refers to the use of technology, such as mobile devices, applications, and other digital tools, to improve health services.



- Digital health, or digital healthcare, is a broad, multidisciplinary concept that includes concepts from an intersection between technology and innovation in the healthcare system.
- Digital health also refers to the successful and sounding digital transformation in the healthcare field.
- Examples of Digital Health are Telemedicine, Mobile Health App, Wearable Device, EMR etc .

Benefits

- · It will reduce healthcare costs.
- Digital health platforms are accelerating remote patient support.

 Digital Health platform helps to detect diseases like cancer, tuberculosis at a very early stage with the advancement of AI in the medical field.


Laser Cooling of Positronium

Context

Recently, an international team of physicists from "the Anti-hydrogen Experiment: Gravity, interferometry, Spectroscopy" (AEgIS) has achieved a breakthrough by demonstrating the laser cooling of Positronium.

About Experiment

- The experiment was performed at the European Organization for Nuclear Research (also known as CERN) in Geneva.
- The experiment was conducted outside of a highly regulated laboratory, under accelerator beam hall.
- Researchers successfully cooled positronium atoms with a laser, initially from about 380 kelvin to about 170 kelvin.
- It used a 70-nanosecond pulsed alexandrite-based laser system to demonstrate the cooling in one dimension.



Positronium

- It is a short-lived hydrogen-like atom composed of an electron and a positron (rather than an electron and a proton).
- Due to its very short life, its half life is 142 nano-seconds.
- Its mass is twice the electron mass.

Anti-hydrogen Experiment: Gravity, Interferometry, Spectroscopy (AEgIS)

- It is a collaboration of physicists from a number of countries. Indian physicists are also part of this organization.
- The primary scientific goal of the Antihydrogen Experiment: Gravity, Interferometry, Spectroscopy (AEgIS) is the direct measurement of the Earth's gravitational acceleration, on antihydrogen.

Kala Azar

Context

India has achieved the target of Reporting less than one case per 10,000 population of Kala Azar across all blocks in 2023.

More about the news


 Data from the National Vector Borne Disease Control Programme showed that there were 595 cases and 4 deaths of Kala Azar reported nationwide last year compared to 891 cases and 3 deaths in 2022.

About Kala Azar

- Kala Azar is one of the most dangerous Neglected Tropical Diseases (NTDs). It is endemic in 76 countries with approximately 200 million people at risk of infection.
- It attacks the immune system, and is almost always fatal, if not treated.

What causes Kala Azar

 Kala azar is caused by bites from female Phlebotomine sandflies, the vector of the leishmania parasite.



- The sand flies feed on animals and humans for blood, which they need for developing their eggs.
- If blood containing leishmania parasites is drawn from an animal or human, the next person to receive a bite will then become infected and develop leishmaniasis.
- Months after this initial infection the disease can progress into a more severe form, called visceral leishmaniasis or kala azar.

Garbhini-GA2 AI Model

Context

Researchers have developed an India-specific artificial intelligence(AI) model to precisely determine the gestational age of a foetus in the second and third trimester of pregnancy.

About Garbhini-GA2

- GARBH-Ini is a clinical dataset which consists of a large number of features including anthropometric, socioeconomic, clinical, and ultrasonographic parameters.
- Researchers from the Translational Health Science and Technology Institute in Faridabad and the Indian Institute of Technology, Madras have designed it.
- It is a component of the DBT India initiative (GARBH-Ini) program, an interdisciplinary group for advanced research on birth outcomes.
- It reduces error by nearly three times and provides an accurate age estimate for the foetus.
- It is the first late-trimester GA estimation model to be developed using the Indian population. (Earlier models have used Western population.)
- In order to lower the rates of maternal and newborn mortality, the Indian data would help pregnant women to receive the proper care and know the exact day of birth.

India's own space station by 2035

Context

Recently, Prime Minister Narendra Modi announced that India will have its own space station by 2035.

About Space Station

- A space station is an artificial structure that is launched into earth orbit and is equipped with the power, supplies, environmental systems, pressurized enclosure, and other utilities required to sustain long-term human habitation.
- These include studying Earth's environment and resources, conducting military reconnaissance, keeping an eye on the Sun and other celestial objects, and conducting long-term studies.

International Space station (ISS)

- ISS is a collaborative project of the United States (NASA), Russia's (Roscosmos), Europe's (ESA), Japan's (JAXA), and Canada's (CSA) space agencies.
- The assembling and construction work of ISS was started in 1998 and was finally completed in 2011.
- The largest object ever created by humans to orbit the Earth is the International Space Station (ISS).
- The pressurized volume of the ISS is roughly 900 m3.
- ISS has a mass over 400,000 kg.
- The ISS solar arrays cover an area of 2,247 sq. meters and have an annual capacity of 735,000 kW-hours of electricity production.



- It orbits at an altitude between 370-460 km.
- Because of atmospheric friction, it is constantly falling towards Earth.
- It requires timely rocket firings to boost itself into orbit.
- ISS is able to fly over 90% of the inhabited Earth due to its orbital inclination of 51.6°.
- It travels around Earth at a speed of about 28,000 km/hr. This means that it orbits the Earth in about every 90 minutes.

India's Second Rocket Spaceport

Context

Recently, the Prime minister inaugurated the second rocket spaceport of the Indian Space Research Organization in a coastal village named Kulasekarapattinam in the Thookuri district of Tamil Nadu.

Objective

 After getting operational, the spaceport will be exclusively used for commercial, on-demand, small satellite launches.

Why does India need a new Spaceport

- To achieve the central government's vision to open the space sector for private players.
- To reduce the burden with high numbers of launches at Satish Dhawan Space Centre (SDSC), Sriharikota Range (SHAR).
- While SHAR will be used only for heavy launch vehicles, the Kulasekarapattinam Spaceport will be used for small satellite launch vehicles.

Why it is located in Tamil Nadu

- 1. Proximity to the Equator: A satellite launched from the sites near the equator towards the east direction will get an initial boost equal to the velocity of the Earth's surface. This is similar to an athlete circling round and round before throwing a discus or a shot put.
- 2. Rotation of the earth: Since the earth rotates from west to east, so to use the rotation as a boost and to not rather spend precious fuel against it, we need to launch eastwards.
- 3. Safety: In case of an accident, to avoid endangering human lives or damage properties most space agencies set their launch pads near large water bodies. Baikonur Cosmodrome in Kazakhstan is an exception, but it lies in the middle of an uninhabited desert.

Sela Tunnel

Context

Recently, PM Narendra Modi inaugurated the strategically significant "Sela Tunnel" in Arunachal Pradesh.

 The foundation stone of this tunnel was laid by the PM Narendra Modi in the 2019 itself.



More About the Sela Tunnel project

About	 It is the world's longest bi-lane tunnel. The tunnel is situated at a height of 13,000 feet. The tunnel is Situated 400 metres below the Sela Pass. The tunnel connects Tezpur in Assam to Tawang in Arunachal Pradesh near the Line of Actual Control (LAC) with China. The project consists of two tunnels and a link road. Tunnel 1 is a 980- metre-long single-tube tunnel, while Tunnel 2 is a 1,555-metre-long twin-tube tunnel. The link road between these tunnels spans 1,200 metres.
Constructed by	• The Border Road Organisation (BRO)
Total Project cost	• Rs. 825 crore
Safety under the Tunnel	 The tunnels are equipped with a ventilation system, robust lighting and fire-fighting capacity.
Capacity	• Daily 30000 cars and 2000 trucks can pass through the Tunnel.

Significance

Strategic significance

- The tunnel ensures rapid deployment of troops and heavy weaponry including artillery guns from Assam plains to Tawang in case of any dispute with China.
- The Sela pass, visible to Chinese soldiers from LAC (Line of Actual Control) poses a tactical disadvantage to India. This tunnel is passing underneath the Sela pass, thus mitigating the military vulnerability.

Transportation

• The Sela tunnel will reduce the distance between Tawang and kameng districts of Arunachal Pradesh by 12 Km, saving about 90- minutes for commuters.

Test flight of Agni 5

Context

Recently, India has tested the Agni-V missile equipped with MIRV technology.

Key Findings

- The DRDO has successfully tested a new Agni-V missile that can hit multiple targets and carry multiple warheads.
- This missile has MIRV(Multiple Independentlytargetable Re-entry Vehicles) technology.

MIRV vs Traditional missiles

- Traditional missiles are designed to carry a single weapon, or warhead, that is launched toward the target.
- MIRV technology has capability that allows multiple warheads to be loaded on a single missile delivery system and programmed to hit different targets at different locations (Same location too).


More about MIRV

- It has the capability to use nuclear warheads.
- The United States and later the Soviet Union were the first to use this technology, which had initially been developed in the 1960s and deployed in the 1970s.
- The number of warheads that a missile can carry depends on its design, weight, size, range and other parameters.

NATIONAL

Benefits of Agni-V missile equipped with MIRV

- These missiles can avoid defence systems to cause additional catastrophic damage.
- India's missile system has undergone a major upgrade with the development of MIRV capability, which also increases its nuclear options.



Agni Missile system

- It was developed in the 1990s.
- Agni missiles are the main land-based delivery systems for India's nuclear weapons.
- Agni-1 is the first of the five-missile Agni series launched in 1983 by DRDO (nuclear-capable missile)
- The first-generation Agni missiles were deployed in the armed forces in the mid-2000s.

- Agni-I to Agni-IV missiles can carry single payloads weighing 12 to 40 kilotons, and their ranges range from 700 to 3500 km.
- Agni-V, which has MIRV technology installed, has a range of 5,000 km and more.
- Agni-V missiles are upgraded variants of the Agni-1 and Agni-2 short-range missiles.

The Atmospheric Research Testbed

Context

Recently, the first phase of India's Atmospheric Research Testbet (ART) was inaugurated in Madhya Pradesh's Sehore district to identify the Monsoon Core zone (MCZ).

About Atmospheric Research Testbed (ART)

- ART is an open-field, focused observational, and analytical research programme.
- It will conduct ground-based research on weather components like Temperature, Wind speed, Air pressure, etc.
- The setup at ART will also be used for calibrating and validating various satellite-based observations
- 25 high-end meteorological instruments installed to detect the Monsoon Core Zone.

Why is the MCZ is important

- A large portion of Indian agriculture, as well as farming along the Monsoon Core Zone (MCZ), which spread from Gujarat to West Bengal in central India, is rain-fed.
- The southwest monsoon season accounts for 70 percent of the country's annual average rainfall (880mm)
- Majority of Indian kharif crops take place between July and August and the average rainfall is 280.4mm and 254.9mm respectively.
- During this season, low pressure developed in Bay of Bengal and this system moves through MCZ regions causing huge rainfall.
- Therefore identifying the Monsoon Core zone is very important.

Why Sehore District of Madhya pradesh has been Selected

 The region is directly in the path of major rainbearing synoptic systems.

- This will facilitate direct monitoring and tracking.
- The region is free from pollution and human activities.

Google DeepMind's New Al

Context

Recently, Google DeepMind revealed its latest AI gaming agent called SIMA or Scalable Instructable Multiworld Agent, which can follow natural language instructions to perform tasks across video game environments.

What are features

- SIMA is an AI tool that will play a key role during video gaming.
- It also moves us one step closer to AI that can work effectively with humans to complete tasks in realworld settings as well as in games.

What is SIMA

- SIMA is an Al Agent, which is different from other Al models such as OpenAl's ChatGPT or Google Gemini.
- SIMA can be called a generalist AI Agent that is capable of doing different kinds of tasks.
- It is like a virtual buddy who can understand and follow instructions in all sorts of virtual environments.
- SIMA can be called a generalist AI Agent that is capable of doing different kinds of tasks.

How does SIMA work

- First of all SIMA "understands" user's commands as it has been trained to process human language.
- One interesting feature of this AI tool is that it learns and adopts the human language parallely.
- SIMA does this through the interactions it has with the user.


Context

- It also showcases the extraordinary talent and craftsmanship of the tribal artisans, and also the tribal culture, lifestyle and glorious traditions.
- The festival also offered a glimpse into the artistic brilliance of tribal communities across the nation.



 The highlights of this year included the launching of the Venture Capital Fund for Scheduled Tribes aiming to nurture startup culture and economic innovation among tribal entrepreneurs.

Sammakka-Saralamma Jatara

Context

Recently, the Union Ministry of Tribal Affairs sanctioned Rs. 2.30 Crores for the Medaram Jatara festival, 2024 to promote its tribal culture and heritage.

About "Sammakka Saralamma Jatara"

- Sammakka Saralamma Jatara or Medaram Jatara is a festival of honoring the goddesses Sammakka and Saralamma by offering Bangarm (jaggery).
- It is held **every two years** at Medaram Village of Tadvai Mandal of Mulugu district, **Telangana**.
- Priests from the Koya tribe perform all Goddessrelated rituals in compliance with Koya traditions and customs.

Koya Tribe

- They live in Andhra Pradesh, Telangana, and the Papikonda hill range, along the Godavari River.
- In an effort to preserve Indian bison, they have recently shifted from making their traditional flute, Permakore, from bison horns to palm leaves.
- They are one of the few multilingual and multiracial tribal communities in India.
- The majority of Koya speak Koyi in addition to Gondi or Telugu.
- They build **Menhirs** in remembrance of the deceased.
- This festival was declared a State festival in 1998.
- Medaram is a remote place in the Eturnagaram Wildlife Sanctuary, the largest surviving forest belt in the Deccan.
- It is the world's biggest Tribal festival and the

second-largest fair of India after the Kumbh Mela; symbolizes 'Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat'


Makha Bucha festival

- It provides a stage for future technological advancements and strategic partnerships between both the countries which is critical for building a successful innovation ecosystem.


Interpol

Context

Recently, Interpol's Red Notice or arrest alerts are subjected to stricter oversight, making it more difficult than ever to abuse them.

Interpol (International Criminal Police Organization)

- INTERPOL was created in 1923 with 20 member countries.
- It is headquartered at Lyon, France.
- It comprises 196 member countries.
- India joined Interpol in 1949.
- It connects police around the world both technically and in person for bridging jurisdiction.



- It plays a crucial role as an information sharing network to enable national police forces to combat transnational crimes.
- I-24/7, a secure communications system of Interpol, links the 196 member nations to the General Secretariat and to one another.
- It enables the member countries to access Interpol databases and services from both central and remote locations.
- INTERPOL's international radio network was launched in 1935.
- Interpol implemented an automatic fingerprint identification system (AFIS) in 2000 in an effort to significantly decrease the amount of time required for fingerprint checks.

Types of Notices by Interpol

- **1. Red Notice**: To locate and capture individuals who are wanted for legal action or to fulfill a sentence.
- 2. Yellow Notice: To assist in identifying people who are unable to identify themselves or in finding missing people, minors.
- **3. Blue Notice**: To gather more data regarding an individual's identity, current location, or actions concerning a criminal investigation.
- **4. Black Notice**: To gather information of unidentified bodies.
- **5. Green Notice:** Provide warning about a person's criminal activities.
- **6. Orange Notice:** To issue a warning about something that poses a serious and immediate risk to public safety.

7. Purple Notice: To look for or offer information on criminals' tools, equipment, and techniques for hiding their identities.

Note: In January 2020, Interpol released a blue corner notice in an attempt to track down fugitive self-proclaimed godman **Nithyananda.**



Nordic-Baltic Eight (NB8)

- NB8 represents the governments of 8 countries, out of which 5 are Nordic nations, i.e, Denmark, Finland, Iceland, Norway, and Sweden and 3 are Baltic nations, i.e, Estonia, Latvia and Lithuania.





G33

Context

- Turkey's approval came after negotiations concerning actions against the Kurdistan Workers' Party (PKK) and an arms sales agreement, including a conditional relationship with the U.S. sale of F-16 jets to Turkey.




About NATO

NATO, the North Atlantic Treaty Organization, is an intergovernmental military alliance established in 1949. Its foundational purpose is to guarantee the freedom and security of its member countries through political and military means. NATO promotes democratic values and enables members to consult and cooperate on defence and security-related issues, addressing challenges that affect the stability of the Euro-Atlantic area.

- Founding and Members: NATO was formed with 12 founding members and has since grown to include additional countries, reaching 31 members with the inclusion of Finland.
- Article 5: A core principle of NATO is collective defence, enshrined in Article 5 of the North Atlantic Treaty. It states that an armed attack against one or more members is considered an attack against all and sets the foundation for collective defence actions.
- Article 10: It defines the parameters for membership. It opens the door for any European state that can uphold the Treaty's principles and contribute to the North Atlantic area's security.
- Decision-Making Process: NATO's principal political body, plays a central role in the decision-making process regarding new members. The council operates on a consensus basis, meaning that

any decision to invite a new member requires unanimous agreement among all existing members. This ensures that all allies are in accord on the strategic and security implications of expanding the Alliance.

About Cellular Jail



- The Cellular Jail symbolizes the Sufferings and pains of Indian Freedom Fighters in their quest for the nation's freedom.
- It is also known as 'Kala pani jail' due to its remoteness from the mainland of India and the sufferings inflicted on the prisoners of the jail by the jail authority.
- Its construction started in 1893 and was completed in 1906.
- Purpose: The Britishers established this jail to imprison Freedom fighters and suppress the Freedom struggle Movement.
- Design: There were individual cells in the jail to prohibit communication among prisoners. This design was implemented to counter the exchange of ideas among freedom fighters.
- Some famous Freedom fighters imprisoned in the cellular jail were-
 - Vinayak Damodar Savarkar
 - Batukeshwar Dutt
 - Yogendra Shukla and
 - V.O. Chidambaram Pillai.
- Cellular jail as National Memorial Government of India declared the Cellular jail as "National Memorial" on February 11, 1979.

Note: A prisoner of cellular jail named **Sher Ali Afridi** killed **Lord Mayo**, the then viceroy of India, during his visit to Port Blair in February, 1872.

India Remains World's Largest Arms Importer

Context

India has maintained its position as the world's top arms importer, according to a report released by the Stockholm International Peace Research Institute (SIPRI).

Findings of the Report

- India remains the world's top arms importer and its imports increased by 4.7 per cent between 2014-2018 and 2019-2023.
- Russia remained India's main arms supplier. India imported 36 percent of its total import from Russia.
- The period 2019-2023 was the first instance since 1960-64 when deliveries from Russia made up less than half of India's arms imports.
- Pakistan was the fifth largest arms importer in 2019-23 and China supplied 82 percent of its arms imports.
- China's arms imports reduced by 44 per cent, mainly as a result of indigenisation of the defence sector in China.

- Hostile drones may be used to deploy explosives, smuggle contraband or gather intelligence on sensitive assets, and the proliferation of low-cost UAVs has led to an increase in incidents.

What is counter drone technology

 Counter drone technology is used to deal with hostile UAVs, and may encompass a range of detection, identification, tracking and interception methods.




Advanced Medium Combat Aircraft

Context

Recently, the Cabinet Committee on Security (CCS) has cleared the project to design and develop India's fifth-generation(5G) fighter jet Advanced Medium Combat Aircraft (AMCA).

More in the news

- AMCA will get India among selected nations which have developed fifth-generation fighter jets.
- The project will be developed under Aeronautical Development Agency (ADA) under the DRDO.
- Manufacturing company will be Hindustan Aeronautics Limited.



Features of AMCA

- **1. FUEL & WEAPONS:** The aircraft has a large internal fuel tank with a capacity of 6.5 tonnes and an internal weapons bay for a range of weapons, including indigenous weapons, to be buried in its belly.
- **2. Engine Capacity:** AMCA Mk2 will be indigenously developed by the Defence Research and Development organization. The MCA Mk2 engine will be more powerful than the US-built GE414 engine. The engine strength of AMCA Mk2 is 110 kilonewtons (KN).
- **3. Stealth:** The twin-engine aircraft will be bigger than other fighter jet which the Indian Air Force presently have. However, with its bigger size, it has modern stealth technology to avoid detection by enemy radar.

Why AMCA is special

- The AMCA will be India's indigenously developed fifth-generation fighter aircraft.
- The aircraft will have a low electro-magnetic signature, which will make it difficult for enemy radar to detect it.
- Apart from these, AMCA will have advanced sensors and weapons to register the signature of enemy aircraft and take them out.

KIRTI Programme

Recently, the Union Sports minister launched the KIRTI Programme in Chandigarh.

- The Union Minister urged every child to register through the MyBharat portal and get the opportunities through KIRTI.

 This index is part of a report titled 'Breaking the Gridlock: Reimagining cooperation in a polarized world. Switzerland topped the index.



BIHAR DURING MODERN ERA

Bihar was an important Centre of trade since 17th Century for the trade of Saltpetre, Cotton Textiles, Indigo and Opium. All these made the Bihar, a Centre

of attraction for the European Countries which led to their arrival towards Indian Sub-continent and further in Bihar to establish their Factories and Fortifications.

Role of Bihar in Revolt of 1857

 The revolt of 1857 started on May 10, 1857 at Meerut, but in Bihar, it was started in Rohini village, Deoghar.

Major Events of Revolt in Bihar

- Rohini Village: The first incidence of revolt in Bihar is being traced from Rohini village of Deoghar District, where on 12th June, 1857 the soldiers revolted by killing two English officials. This resulted into the death sentence of all three soldiers involved in the killings.
- Patna Uprising: On July 3, 1857 Pir Ali (A book seller) along with his associates revolted. During this revolt the Deputy Opium agent of Patna, Dr. Lyell was killed. Pir Ali charged with Lyell's murder was convicted and hanged on July 7,1857. William Taylor was the Commissioner of Patna division at that time.
- Danapur Mutiny: On July 25, three regiments

stationed at Danapur rebelled. Most of the troops crossed **Son river** into **Shahabad** where they joined the Rebel troop of Kunwar Singh.

Kunwar Singh and Revolt of 1857

- Kunwar Singh was born in November 1777 to Raja Shahabzada Singh and Rani Pancharatan Devi in Jagdishpur of Shahabad District (present Bhojpur). He belonged to the Ujjainiya clan of Rajput.
- He was the chief organizer of the Revolt against the British in Bihar.
- At the age of 80, he bravely raised his voice in favour of the peasants and other persecuted people of Bihar.
- He died on 26 April, 1858.
- After the death of Kunwar Singh, His followers carried out the struggle in different part of Bihar under the leadership of his brother Amar Singh.
- The Forest area of Jagdishpur was the base of Amar Singh's military campaigns.

Spread of the Revolt in Other Areas

- Hazaribagh: Under the leadership of Madhav Singh, the companies of Infantry at Hazaribagh revolted against the Britishers. Soon they moved to Ranchi where they revolted under Jaimangal Singh.
- Singhbhum: Raja Arjun Singh of Porhat and his brother led a formidable rising of the Kols of Singhbhum. Initially they defeated the British troops, but later on the king was arrested with the

- help of Mewa Lal of Chaibasa.
- Palamu: The activities of Nilamber and Pitamber made Palamu a centre of serious popular agitation during the revolt of 1857.

Bihar Provincial Congress

During the initial year of Congress formation, many delegates from Bihar participated in the sessions of Congress. As a result, a Bihar Provincial Congress Committee was formed in 1908 under the Presidentship of Nawab Sarfaraz Hussain Khan Bahadur, with its headquarter at Patna.

- The First Session of Bihar Provincial Conference was held at Patna in 1908 under the Presidentship of Sir Ali Imam.
- 27th Session of Indian National Congress was held in 1912 at Bankipur in Patna under the Presidentship of R.N Mudholkar. Mazhar-ul-Haq was the Chairman of the reception committee and Sachidanand Sinha was the General Secretary.
- **37th** Session of Indian National Congress was held at **Gaya** under the Presidentship of **C.R Das**.

Home Rule Movement in Bihar

- The Home Rule Movement started by Anne Beasant also made an impact in Bihar. In a meeting at Bankipur on December 16, 1916, decision was taken to start this movement in Bihar.
- · President- Mazhar-ul-Haq
- · Vice-President- Sarfaraz Hussain Khan, Purnendu Narain Sinha.
- Secretaries- Chandrabansi Sahay, Baijnath Narain Sinha.
- Anne Beasant visited Patna twice, on April 18,1918 and July 25, 1918.

Champaran Satyagraha

Champaran is an area of historic importance, where Mahatma Gandhi tested his new weapon of Satyagraha which was based on truth and non-violence.

Issue in Champaran

- There were two systems of Indigo plantation in North Bihar initiated by European Indigo Planters.
 They were - Zerait, and Assamiwar.
- Under Zerait system, land was directly cultivated

by the landowners, although tenants were obliged to work on these lands or provide their oxen for a given sum of money.

- The most prevalent one was Assamiwar system under which, the factory chiefs had the indigo land cultivated by tenants.
- Tinkathiya system which was common in Champaran was the part of Assamiwar system.
 Under this system a tenant had to cultivate indigo on three Katha per Bigha (3/20th of the land) and was entitled to get price for it according to written agreement, that was not acceptable to the tenants.
- Raj Kumar Shukla, a leader of the Champaran managed to bring Gandhiji to Champaran by requesting him at Lucknow session of INC in 1916.
- Under the Lucknow session, a resolution was moved by Braj Kishor Prashad regarding the probe into agrarian trouble and the resolution was passed.

Gandhiji in Champaran

- Gandhiji reached Motihari on April 15, 1917.
- The Magistrate ordered him, not to enter the villages.

- A case was lodged against him on 18th April.
 Inspite of lodging of case, Gandhiji refused to leave Champaran without receiving the whole information.
- Watching the situation Government withdrew the case on 20th April.
- The Lieutenant Governor, Sir Edward Gait took the constructive measures to solve the problem by forming Champaran Enquiry Committee. Gandhiji was member of this Committee.
- Based on the recommendation of this Committee,
 Champaran Agrarian act was passed on May 1,
 1918.

Welfare Works Done by Gandhiji

- While probing the situation of Indigo Planters, Gandhiji became well acquainted with the poverty, illiteracy, ignorance and social fabric of Champaran.
- On November 8, 1917, Gandhiji along with Kasturba came to Champaran, where they started many welfare works like-
- Opening of the first school at Barharwa Lakhan Sen on Nov. 14, 1917.
- Opening of another school at Bhitiharwa on Nov. 20, 1917. etc.

Civil Disobedience Movement (CDM),1930	 CDM was started in 1930 under the leadership of Mahatma Gandhi. The impact of this revolt was seen in Bihar also. The salt Satyagraha in Bihar was started on April 15, 1930 in Saran and Champaran District. In Patna it was started on 16th of April. Nakhas Pind near Mangle Tank in Patna was chosen as the site for violation of salt law. In Munger Sri Krishna Sinha and Nand Kuma Sinha led the congress activity. The inmates of Chapra jail refused to use foreign clothes and went on Naked hartal till Swadeshi clothes were provided. Agitation for non-payment of Chowkidari Tax.
Individual Civil Disobedience, 1940	 The individual Satyagraha in Bihar started on Nov 28, 1940. Sri Krishna Sinha was the First Individual Satyagrahi followed by Anugrah Narain Sinha. Gauri Shankar Singh was Satyagrahi in Gaya. Shyam Narain Singh was the Satyagrahi at Silaw.

Quit India Movement, 1942	 To prevent the outbreak of the mass movement, the District Magistrate of Patna W.G Archer arrested Rajendra Prasad and took him to Bankipur Jail. The Advocate-General Baldev Sahay resigned from his office. On August 11, a band of students marched in order to hoist National flag on the building of Patna Secretariat. Under the order of District Magistrate 13-14 rounds were fired in which seven students were martyred and several injured.

Election in Bihar under Government of India Act 1935

- The election to legislature in Bihar took place between January 22 to 27, 1937.
- Out of total 152 seats, Congress contested election on 107 Seats and Secured 98 seats.
- Congress Government was formed in Bihar on July 20, 1937, with Shri Krishna Singh as Chief Minister, Ram Dayalu Singh as Speaker and Abdul Bari became the Deputy- Speaker.
- Baldev Sahay was appointed as Advocate-General.
- The Congress Ministry in Bihar gave its resignation on October 31, 1939 on the issue of involvement of Indian Soldiers in World War 2 without the consent of Indian Government.

Peasant Movements in Bihar

- 1. Munger Kisan Sabha: Kisan Sabha at Munger was organized in 1922 by Sri Krishna Sinha and Mohammad Zubair to discuss the grievances of Peasants as they were under Zamindars, but did not have authority over their land.
- 2. Bihar Provincial Kisan Sabha: It was formed in 1929 by Swami Sahajanand Saraswati to discuss Peasant's grievances against the Zamindari attacks on their occupancy Rights. In retaliation of this, Zamindars formed United Political Party to suppress the peasants.
- **3. Bihar Kisan Sabha:** It was formed in **1933,** under the Presidentship of Rajendra Prasad. The committee was formed to study the condition of Farmers in Bihar.
- 4. Pandit Yamuna Karjee, Rahul sankritayayan started publishing weekly Hindi Newspaper "Hunkar"

that became the mouthpiece of the peasant and agragarian movements in Bihar.

Role of Women in Creation of Modern Bihar

- 1. Prabhavati Devi: She was daughter of Braj Kishor Prasad and wife of Jai Prakash Narain. Influenced by the personality of her father and husband, she also took part in freedom struggle and social upliftment of women. She started Mahila Charka Samiti at Patna. She was sent to Bhagalpur jail during Quit India Movement.
- 2. Amala Mukherjee: She started agitation in Muzaffarpur against Veil system during 1921-22. It was again started in 1928 on the call of Gandhiji. In Darbhanga, Rama Nand Mitra agitated against the Veil System.
- 3. Vindhayavasini Devi: She was arrested during Salt Satyagraha and sent to Muzaffarpur jail. The government declared Kanya Swyam Sevika Dal illegal.


